Dear Mr. Welch:

I wish to report to the Selectmen of North Kennebunkport the progress we made on white pine blister rust control this year in your Town. In all 4,136 acres were covered to protect 2,678 acres of growing white pine of all ages. We found and destroyed on this area 27,871 wild currant and gooseberry bushes and 16 cultivated bushes of the same species. Many of the areas were so heavily infected that they should be checked in five years.. The cost of the work this year totaled \$816.00 which your town originally paid and then received reimbursement of \$408.00. This reimbursement came in two checks, from the State.

There remains 3,225 acres in North Kennebunkport which seriously needs similar control work. I hope your Board will plan on it in the future. Without exception the residents of your Town were very cooperative and we sincerely appreciate the help that we received from them and from your Board.

Report of the Public Health Nurse

The happiness and prosperity of the people in a community depends largely on .the degree of health that they enjoy.

Public health nursing is an organized service to the individual, family and community. Let us review some of the accomplishments of this service to determine future needs:

Child Health Conferences were held monthly from May through October with a total attendance of 48; physical examinations were given to 39 infants and pro-school children: immunization against diptheria, whooping cough and tetanus and smallpox vaccination are offered at these conferences. Following are some of the statistics on immunization for the year:

I would like to remind the parents that inoculations given in infancy do .not protect the child for years unless booster inoculations are given to maintain their immunity. We have been fortunate as there have been no serious epidemics of these diseases—Maine has had only one case of smallpox reported in 24 years. This good record was obtained because of these protective measures, but it is possible for smallpox to be brought to the United States from another country.

Tetanus may also occur if immunity is not maintained. There was a case of a 12 year old boy whose immunity had not been kept up by booster shots. He was hospitalized, given tetanus antitoxin and fortunately recovered. The family had the worry and burden of an acute illness and the boy had a painful and frightening experience-other children might be less fortunate.

MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICE

These visits are based on individual needs and less visits are required if the child is under medical supervision.

SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICE

Physical examinations were offered to all 4th grade pupils' who had not been examined by their family physician. Out of 21 pupils

enrolled in the 4th grade this year, only 12 took advantage of this service. I would like to believe that the others were seen by their family physician, but I doubt if this' is so. The value of these examinations is questionable unless plans are made for correction of defects. Parents have the primary responsibility for the health of their children. The function of the nurse is to interpret the results of the medical examination and assist in securing correction of defects by giving information on community resources, if the parents are unable to have their own physician.

Morbidity service, or bedside nursing care is concerned primarily with actual care of sick persons. Because of the many demands on the public health nurse it is usually impossible to make daily bedside visits' to the sick. The purpose of this service is to give instruction to the family in the proper nursing care of the patient who is ill at home. Even if daily visits could be made, unless there was some one in the home to give care between the visits the patient could be very neglected. During the past year a total of 40 visits were made to demonstrate care.

I would like to bring to your attention the need for a more complete and revised list of blood donors. Blood typing was done in the early part of 1948 but the same list seems inadequate at this time. If any of you have had the experience of trying to get blood donors for a member of your family during a serious illness, you will certainly recognize this need. Suggestions have been made to have a "walking blood bank" where a large majority of individuals would be typed and a list made and kept up to date. This list would be available to physicians and local hospitals. This would require careful planning and co-operative efforts of everyone if it is to be of value. It could be very useful in case of a major disaster.

CRIPPLED CHILDREN'S SERVICES

These services are available to cardiac cases and children with handicaps. I would like to thank the members of the Health Council for their support and volunteer help in different phases of the program. I would also like to thank the members of the teaching staff, the selectmen, health officer and everyone who ed make the service a success. With your continued support, I hope to be able to expand the program in 1955.

The school year 1954-1955 marked the beginning of a substantial educational advance in the schools of North Kennebunkport. This was brought about by limiting the North Chapel, Durrell and Burnham Schools to two grades to a room. The result has been greatly improved instruction and better progress for all grades.

The same teachers, with one exception, returned to their positions in September 1954. All teachers are certified by the State. The salary schedule has been improved and should be increased still further another year. Books and supplies have been adequate

and the present year beginning in September 1954 has been the most satisfactory of any during the last decade.

Considerable painting and repairing was done on all school buildings last summer. An oil burner was installed in the Irving School. Our chief problem in the schools continues to be the lack of a good water supply and modern plumbing.

The various projects which have been proposed for the building of a new school have been rejected one by one. The State has now closed application, for further building Authority aid. The only State assistance now available is through the establishment of a School District, which hardly seems feasible, considering the fact that the Town has already rejected the plan. The School District Law is only permissive legislation, it provides no money. The State has recently voted to allow towns to borrow up to 7 1/2% of their State valuation. This would allow the town of North Kennebunkport to go into debt of 7 1/2% of \$451,000.00 or \$29,825. It appears that some money may become available through federal grants. This legislation has been proposed and may become a reality.

If we are to remain in the present buildings indefinitely, the following is recommended: (1) Locate good water supplies adjacent to each building or at least adjacent to the North Chapel. Durrell and Burnham buildings. (2) Install double windows on every building, the result of which will be more comfort for the pupils and a decided saving in oil consumption.

I wish to congratulate the Parents' Club on their interest and effort on behalf of the school. As the Club now has membership from all schools it can be a vital factor in promoting better schools for the Town.

We plan to conduct a standard testing program again this year in order to determine individual pupil progress and general school standards as measured against schools in other towns. The results will aid us in judging and interpreting the work of the School.

As was suggested last year, I think the possibility of transporting grades 7 and 8 to a surrounding town, and closing the Irving School and Iron Bridge Schools, is a plan which should be explored. We could then concentrate on placing North Chapel, Durrell and Burnham Schools in good physical condition.

I wish to express my appreciation to the School Committee for their interest and cooperation.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of North Kennebunkport, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall, in said Town on the seventh day of March, 1955 at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To see' if the Town will vote to dispense with the check list at this meeting.
- Art. 3. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

- Art. 4 To see if the Town will vote to carry forward the balance or overdraft on each account.
