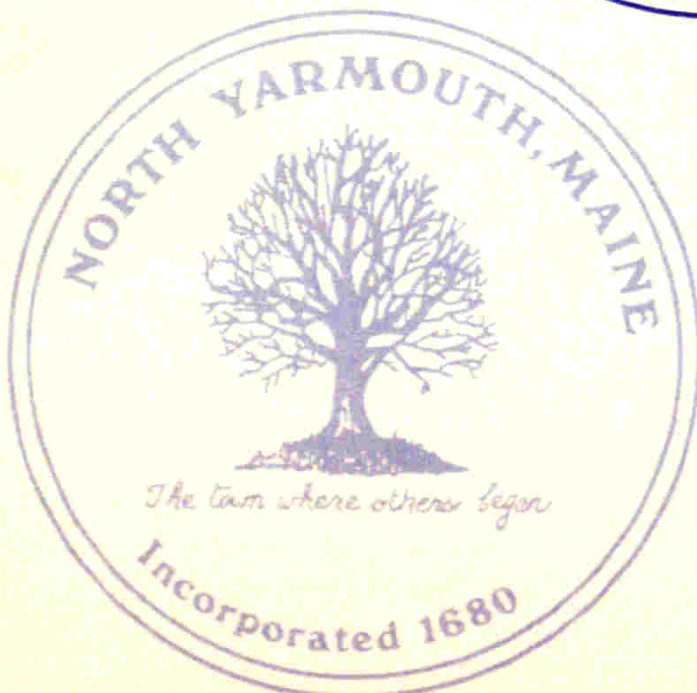

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

1981 has sent the town of North Yarmouth into a new year with the following major development and activities —

(1) A strong end to a snowy December wiped out the highway funds. However, these funds were carefully monitored by the Board and by the Road Commissioner, so that as snow approached, the overall effect on the budget was not disastrous. As we look into 1982 we see the loss of snow-road reimbursement from the State Aid Roads to the town.

(2) Once again, the funding for the town landfill fell short of the required amount, and we continue to see the town dump filling up. The Selectmen feel strongly that its relationship with Pownal concerning the future of our landfill must be thoroughly evaluated during 1982.

(3) Legal matters continue to take much of our time and consideration. The Town is currently involved in litigation concerning the so-called "Bruce Hill Road", an appeal concerning roadside ditching and a long standing case regarding a farm market. The Board has continued to try to handle these matters without counsel until we feel that we are at the limit of our capabilities and knowledge.

(4) We have had meetings with the Department of Transportation concerning the State-Aid road turn back and feel that we will be hit hard financially, especially concerning the possibility of any future rebuilding of the Mill Road and continued maintenance of the North Road and portions of Greely Road.

(5) The end of 1981, especially the last few weeks of December, were very serious and financially frustrating for the Selectmen and the Treasurer. The amount of unpaid taxes far exceeded our overlay and created a serious "Cash Crunch". The Board of Selectmen and the Treasurer strongly request that the interest rate on unpaid taxes be raised to 18%.

During 1981, members of the Board attended seminars concerned with the duties of newly elected officials, municipal law, and cash management. A member has also been serving on a special committee which is evaluating certain aspects of usage of S.A.D. 51 property.

In looking forward to 1982, we feel that we have presented a budget designed at holding the line on taxes. We urge all citizens to attend the

S.A.D. Budget hearings and urge our Directors to do the same as far as expenditures are concerned.

In closing, we would like to thank all committee members, volunteers and elected officials for their cooperation throughout the year.

We particularly want to give special appreciation to Gene Gagnon, who served the town for many years as a dedicated employee and always was the source of a kind word and a quick thought. Gene passed away in 1981 and is sadly missed.

We urge all citizens to participate in Town Meeting on March 12 and 13. We urge your "special" consideration on the Charter Referendum question. Most of all, we ask that you participate in this privilege of Democracy.

REPORT OF THE NORTH YARMOUTH CHARTER COMMISSION

Since last year's Town Meeting the Charter Commission has worked hard to develop a Charter that is simple, effective, and workable for our town. The proposed Charter does not change our current type of government in any way, but merely spells out how the Town is administered and managed. It was very clear from our public hearings that the people of North Yarmouth want our Town Meeting Government preserved and want full control of the financial affairs of the Town. The most significant change outlined by the Charter is the addition of an Administrative Assistant, for the Board of Selectmen, to administer the affairs of the Town. For the first time, the Town would have a full-time paid administrator to serve the needs of the Town and its citizenry. We urge everyone to carefully read the proposed charter and to become familiar with its provisions. We sincerely hope you find this charter to be appropriate, timely, and essential. We invite you to attend the Public Hearing to answer any questions you might have, and urge you to support its passage on Friday, March 12, 1982.

REPORT OF THE NORTH YARMOUTH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Much interesting work has been achieved this year. The Town records have been arranged, shelved and identified. The early Proprietor's Map, showing the original land lots on which all our modern deeds are based, has been professionally conserved for the future; this is our first large item in a continuing program of care. The plumbing has been installed so we hope to make some progress with in house conservation of papers.

The records of the Congregational Church, the Grange, and the Fire Department have been fumigated and deposited in the vault for safekeeping.

A memorial fund for Edmund Hall, treasurer from 1978-81, will enable us to purchase an instrument to monitor and record the atmospheric conditions in the vault, and a small plaque in the Work Room acknowledges this.

Our Town Historian, Nellie Leighton, has spent hundreds of hours meticulously correcting the published Vital Records. This has involved checking the Town Clerk's copies, the W.P.A. typed records, using the microfilm and the original handwritten books. It has been a most tiresome but worthwhile task, of great value to the townspeople and to genealogists.

The Town has been fortunate to have been chosen for an interesting study of Maine farm buildings, conducted by Professor Thomas Hubka of the University of Oregon, for his forthcoming book. Thirty-six houses and barns, on Route 115 from the Gray Line to Parsonage Lane and an early group on Mountfort Road, have been carefully recorded from cellar to attic. These constructive details (as well as photographs and the results of the census and deed research for these properties), will be given to the Society and will provide a unique body of knowledge for future reference.

The Society also worked closely with Professor Hubka in the "Architect in the schools" program in which Alan Hall's Yarmouth High School U.S. History course and others studied various aspects of three of North Yarmouth's old homes and the generations that have lived in them. (The William Buxton Tavern, the Levi Marston House and the Skillins Homestead.)

In conjunction with several other towns a program of oral history was undertaken. Workshops, lectures and interviews culminated in a fascinating presentation on the changing face of the land. Tape recording details of some of the Town's farming enterprises, particularly the poultry business, will continue in the future.

The Town House has had its floor sanded and looks most attractive. It has been used for a wedding and for a "Box Social" this year and we would be glad for any suggestions for activities that might be held there.

We have had another interesting series of evening programs and we welcome anyone at our meetings, which are held the fourth Monday of every month at the Memorial School.

REPORT OF THE YARMOUTH - NORTH YARMOUTH SHELLFISH CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

The Shellfish Conservation Committee works closely with the Department of Environmental Protection, the Department of Marine Resources and the State biologists to protect Yarmouth's coast line and tidal waters.

The Committee supports the Bayview Sisquisic Trail sewer extension. Rapid State approval of overboard discharge systems and the installation of septic systems in marginal soil has contributed to the direct fecal coliform pollution of the Cousins and Royal Rivers.

Yarmouth has been making progress in opening previously closed shellfish harvesting areas. Overboard discharge monitoring and the Bayview sewer extension will assist in this effort.

The Committee continues to support the two-inch minimum clam law and the practice of rotating prime shellfish areas to stimulate the natural growth of clams.

The Committee will continue to operate on a budget which is mainly supported by licensing fees levied upon the citizens of Yarmouth and North Yarmouth. The Committee estimated that over \$100,000 dollars worth of clams were harvested from Yarmouth tidal coastline areas this year.

This report is part of the report submitted to the Town of Yarmouth by Edgar A. Curtis, III, Chairman of the Yarmouth - North Yarmouth Shellfish Conservation Commission.

REPORT OF THE NORTH YARMOUTH PLANNING BOARD

During 1981, the Planning Board saw a decrease in activity related to subdivision development within the town. The principal activity related to the North Yarmouth Woods subdivision on Route 9. The North Yarmouth Woods - West subdivision, consisting of four lots, was approved. North Yarmouth Woods - East project was revised and resubmitted for approval as a condominium development.

At the March 1981 Town Meeting, several amendments to the town's subdivision and zoning ordinances were approved. These amendments addressed several administrative matters related to Planning Board approvals, added further definition regarding road-side stands, and limited the increase in housing units in the town in any single year to no more than five percent.

During 1981 the Planning Board received several requests for the development of back lots which lacked 200 feet of frontage on accepted town roads as required by our ordinance. To clarify the Board's position on that matter, and to simplify the handling of further requests, the Board adopted a formal policy regarding the approval of back lots.

The Planning Board implemented a more formal procedure for recording the minutes of the Board meetings and the actions taken by the Board. The minutes of Planning Board meetings are kept on file in the Town Office and will provide a much improved record of Planning Board activities.

David Hawkes resigned from the Planning Board during 1981 and was replaced by Ford Reiche. In 1982, the Planning Board will be meeting at 7:30 P.M. on the second Tuesday of each month. An additional workshop

meeting of the Planning Board may be scheduled on the fourth Tuesday of any month if it is necessary. The members of the Planning Board provide many hours of their time to town activities and I wish to thank them for their continued dedication in 1981.

The past year has seen some needed improvements in our Town Roads. A bad section on the Sweetser Road was improved, the bridge on the Milliken Road was rebuilt in June, and repaving was done on Gray Depot Road, Milliken Road from Route 231 to the railroad and half of the West Pownal Road.

The new construction we did on the Royal Road completes the new building there. We are planning on paving the remainder of this Road in 1982.

The Maine State Department of Transportation met with the Highway Department in the fall. Due to a cut back in State Funds, they have turned back Mill Road, North Road and our portion of Greely Road to town care. This means State Aid and Town Road Improvement projects are done. North Yarmouth will have to finish building Mill Road and all paving and

maintenance to North Road, Mill Road, etc. will be Town projects. A long term road improvement program needs to be started in place of the State's.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

The Town of North Yarmouth, Maine currently operates under a Town Meeting-Selectmen form of Government.

The accounting policies of the Town conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to state and local governmental units. The following is a summary of the more significant policies.

Basis of Presentation:

The accounts of the Town are organized on the basis of funds and account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for by providing a separate set of self-balancing accounts which comprise its assets, liabilities, fund equities, revenues and expenditures. The various funds, which are segregated for the purpose of carrying on specific activities or attaining certain objectives in accordance with special regulations, restrictions or limitations, are grouped by type in the financial statements.

Basis of Accounting:

Governmental fund revenues and expenditures are recognized on the modified accrual basis. Revenues are recognized in the accounting period in which they become available and measurable. In the general fund, real estate and personal property tax levies are recorded as revenue in amounts equal to total taxes levied. Estimated losses for uncollectible accounts and abatements are recorded in the overlay account as expenditures. Expenditures for governmental fund types are recognized in the accounting period in which the fund liability is incurred, if measurable, except for unmatured interest on generally long-term debt and accumulated sick and annual leave pay, which are recognized when paid.

All other funds included in these financial statements are maintained and reported on the accrual basis.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued):

Inventories of Supplies:

Inventories of supplies are considered to be expenditures at the time of purchase and are not included in the general fund balance sheet.

Fixed Assets:

Fixed assets are not capitalized in the accounting records when acquired. Funds used to acquire fixed assets are accounted for as expenditures in the year payments are made.

NOTE 2 - OVER-EXPENDITURES:

During the year, the Town overexpended certain budgeted accounts, which will be raised through taxation in 1982.

NOTE 3 - BUDGETS:

General Fund:

The Town is currently preparing budgets under a net budgeting concept which does not estimate total revenues of the Town.
