A recent survey by U.C. Berkeley found that 95% of all graduate students feel overwhelmed, and over 67% have felt seriously depressed at some point in their careers. In this talk, Jorge Cham recounts his experiences bringing humor into the lives of stressed out academics, examines the source of their anxieties and explores the guilt, the myth, and the power of procrastination.

The Graduate Student Government is bringing Jorge Cham, the artist behind PHD Comics, to speak during this year's Graduate Research Exposition (Expo). PHD Comics are widely read by graduate students across all disciplines and we all can relate to them. We will be using this speaker to help draw students and faculty to the Expo and the Expo Gala event (which will directly follow Cham's presentation).

The event was promoted through the Graduate Student Senate with large posters, e-mail, our web-site and the UMaine calendar.


