REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and citizens of the Town of Bethel:

I herewith submit my fourth annual report of the schools and school property of this town.

Schools opened for the fall term with the following changes in the teaching staff: Miss Maxine Clough, Grade II; Miss Edna Page, Grade V; Miss Hermoine Hutchins, Grade VI; Miss Iva Bartlett, West Bethel Primary; Miss Beulah Burris, Northwest Bethel; Miss Eva Ladd, Middle Intervale; and Miss Frances Bean transferred to the South Bethel school. Miss Electa Chapin was granted a leave of absence of one year to attend Normal School.

All of the teachers have had experience and are well qualified for the positions which they occupy in the school system. They have shown a fine spirit of co-operation in doing their part to maintain a high standard of work in our school. Four attended summer school during the past summer. The reports from our students in the various secondary schools show that they are doing a good grade of work, which indicates that our boys and girls are being well prepared for High School.

The attendance during the fall term was very good, but since the opening of the winter term there has been more illness among both teachers and pupils than for several years. Except in a few cases, parents have co-operated very

finely this year in doing their part to see that their children attend school regularly.

The town did not make any appropriation for a school nurse at the March meeting, therefore the school physician has had to do his own work and the work of the nurse as far forth as possible. With more than 350 pupils in school a nurse is needed to check up the physical condition of the children at least once a year and to do follow-up work.

The textbooks are in fairly good condition, but new Arithmetics, Histories and reading material are needed. Only with the greatest economy is it possible to keep the schools supplied with textbooks on the appropriation which we have from year to year.

The schoolhouse at East Bethel has been placed in good condition by being painted both inside and outside. Only A few minor repairs have been made on the other schoolhouses. The roof of the Grammar School building will have to be repaired the coming summer as it has commenced to leak; also it will be necessary to provide a new toilet system for the South Bethel schoolhouse.

Through the generosity of the Auxiliary of George A. Mundt Post 81, a flag has been presented to the Primary School by Mrs. Grace Coburn, President. On account of present conditions it was decided not to maintain a public playground for the children at the Primary building the past summer.

The salaries of teachers were reduced 10% during the past year. With further reductions planned for another year, the decrease will average around 20% for each teacher. The town of Bethel will then be paying its teachers a lower average salary than most of the towns in the county. The salaries of our teachers are already low, as the women teachers receive only an average of \$18.14 per week for the school year of 36 weeks, or an average of \$12.56 for the 52 weeks. This makes the average salary per week lower than that of the girl who works in an office or factory. A great many people do not take into consideration the cost of special education required of the teacher, attendance at summer schools, and a working year of only 36 weeks with living expenses for 52 weeks.

It was necessary on account of the appropriation to reduce the amount paid for conveyance $12\frac{1}{2}\%$. When the fall

term opened we found that two other routes had to be added, so that the most of the amount which would have been saved had to be used to pay for the increased transportation. With the appropriation asked for by the Superintending School Committee it will be necessary to further reduce the cost of transportation by paying each driver a less amount, also eliminating one or more routes.

The decrease in the State School fund for another year will be around 20% or about \$900. This means less money to spend for common school purposes. With the spending of the balance in the Common School account of \$585.07, the overdraft this year of \$140.22, and the recommendation of the Superintending School Committee for an appropriation of \$500 less than a year ago, we will have approximately \$2125.29 less with which to maintain schools for the coming year. To keep from a deficit in this department it will be necessary to spend 10% less for common schools than we are paying at the present time, making a reduction of 20% in our educational department in the last two years.

It will be necessary to increase the appropriation for High School tuition \$1000 to meet the increased enrollment another year, as we shall have at least 120 students registered in secondary schools.

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To Carl L. Brown, a Citizen of the Town of Bethel in Oxford County.

GREETINGS:—In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Bethel, qualified to vote in Town affairs, to meet in Odeon Hall in said Town of Bethel on Monday, the 6th day of March, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

- Art. 3. To hear and act on reports of the several town officers.
 - Art. 4. To choose Selectmen for ensuing year.
 - Art. 5. To choose Assessors for ensuing year.
 - Art. 6. To choose Overseers of Poor for ensuing year.
 - Art. 7. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art. 8. To choose one member of School Committee for three years.
- Art. 9. To choose a method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 10. To choose a Tax Collector for 1933.
- Art. 11. To choose a Road Commissioner for ensuing year.
- Art. 12. To establish the price the Road Commissioner shall receive for his services.
 - Art. 13. To choose an Auditor for ensuing year.
 - Art. 14. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

- Art. 15. To see what action the Town will take in regard to financing the temporary loans of 1932.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for support of common schools for year 1933.

- Art. 29. To see if the Town will vote and raise the sum of \$1068.38 to entitle the Town to 3rd Class Highway funds as provided in Sections 43 to 47 inclusive of Chapter 28, Revised Statutes 1930.
- Art. 30. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote and raise in accordance with the provisions of Sections 26 to 32 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930, for the construction of a State-aid Highway extending from the Rumford town line in a general southerly direction through the towns of Bethel, Greenwood, Norway, and Otisfield, over State-aid Designation No. 2 in the Town of Bethel and State-aid No. 1 in the Town of Norway.
- Art. 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for State Aid Highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionments.

- Art. 37. To see what sum the Town will vote and raise to procure from the Bethel Library Association the free use of the books during the coming year for all the inhabitants of the Town under such restrictions and regulations as shall insure the safety and good use of the books.
- Art. 38. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road leading from the estate of Robert Kirk on Chandler Hill to the main road leading from Bean's Corner to Middle Intervale, near estate of G. K. Hastings.
- Art. 39. To see if the Town will authorize its Treasurer to obtain money by loan to pay the debts of the town, and to take up outstanding notes against the town or to renew the

same with new notes, and to execute and deliver the notes of the Town therefor signed by its Treasurer and counter-signed by the municipal officers of the Town.

- Art. 40. To see if the Town, for the purpose of procuring a temporary loan to, and for the use of, the Town of Bethel to pay indebtedness of said Town due and to become due during the present municipal year, the same to be paid out of money raised by taxation during the present municipal year, will authorize and direct its Treasurer to borrow from time to time a sum of money, or sums of money, not exceeding \$50,000 and to execute and deliver the note or notes of the Town therefor signed by its Treasurer and countersigned by the municipal officers of the Town.
