



## Report of Superintendent.

During the year school has been in session twenty-four weeks at each school. There has been three terms of eight weeks each except in the Lovely and Packard schools where different arrangements were made because of scarlet fever among the scholars. Number of different teachers employed during the year, thirteen. Blanche Rowe, teacher in the Park school, and Dilla Prebble, in the Hughes school, were retained for the year. Gertie Porter resigned her position in the Packard school and the last eight weeks were taught by Mrs. Carrie Lovely. The majority of the teachers are painstaking and are not only interested in their work but do all they can for their own improvement by attending summer school, teacher's convention and reading school papers.

The pupils generally seem to be doing well, the exceptions are those who do not attend school regularly. The schools would be improved if visited generally by parents. Especial improvement has been made the past year in reading and writing and the work done in other branches has been more thorough than in years before.

The schools are generally in good order. When last visited by the Superintendent there was improvement noted in this line.
