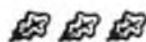

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MAPLETON:—

While there is not much that is new to record of the schools during the year that has passed, yet in many respects it has been a profitable one.

Owing to the severe cold weather as well as the long dis-

tance which some of the children have to travel, the attendance at the winter term has not been as regular as it otherwise would have been.

By special efforts of some of the teachers aided by their pupils, a good deal has been done in the way of furnishing some of the schoolhouses.

A very comfortable and attractive building on Hughes Road, adds much to the appearance as well as value, of school property. None of the buildings are insured.

General repairs are needed at the Packard and Mill schoolhouses; also some slight repairs at Griffin Ridge. New blackboards are needed at Creasy Ridge.

In all of the districts more attention should be given to the out-buildings. Several of them should be replaced by new ones.

More money must be raised for text books. While the account has been slightly overdrawn this year, more money should have been spent, as the new geographies and grammars are not in all the schools yet.

While fully realizing the care and responsibility connected therewith, I have enjoyed the work and wish to acknowledge my appreciation of kindness and courtesy shown me by Chairman of School Board, parents and teachers, during the year.
