TO THE CITIZENS OF MAPLETON:—

At the annual meeting of the School Board a vote was taken to have three terms of school in each district. The spring and fall terms each eight weeks, winter term to continue until money was expended. We have had three eight week terms in each school.

The whole number of scholars drawing State money is three hundred and seventeen. Of this number two hundred five have been registered in different schools during the year.

The care of the school buildings, repairs, etc., have been in the hands of the School Board

It seems to your Superintendent that the greatest need in our schools is a course of study. We suggest a course of study be prescribed by the Board of Education and the work of grading our schools begin with the new school year.

In regard to our text books. It was found the first of spring terms

that about one-third of our text books were not numbered or marked as property of this town. During the year we have labeled and numbered five hundred books and numbered one hundred and two without the labels. We recommend the Frye's Complete Geog. be replaced by Frye's Grammar school Geog. and the Mary F. Hyde Two-Book Course in English be adopted as our basal grammar. Better care must be taken of the text books and more stringent rules enforced. Teachers must feel the responsibility of their protection.

A School Improvement League has been organized in the Lovely school and is doing a good work. The Creasy Ridge school has bought two volumes of the Students Cyclopeda for reference books, and school libraries have been purchased by the Packard and Park schools.

Another school house is needed at the Mill. The Mill school must be divided in order to get the best results.

Would not this be a favorable time to lengthen the school year a little? If \$300 more could be raised we could then have thirty weeks.

We have seven students in the Presque Isle High School, and one in the Ricker Classical Institute.

I wish to express my appreciation of the kindness shown me by parents and School Board.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor and contingent town expenses for the ensuing year.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to buy text books.

12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairing school houses and for school apparatus and appliances for the year ensuing.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town officers for the ensuing year.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay incidentals for the ensuing year.

16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to build Boone road, so called.

17. To see if the town will accept road, as laid out by Selectmen and record deposited with Town clerk, beginning at stake at mouth of Chapman road so called running south 19 1-2 degrees, east 36 rds. thence south 24 degrees east 54 rds to spruce stake on road now travelled by Andrew Condon. If accepted how much money will town vote to raise for same.

18. To see if the town will vote to discontinue road running from Creasy Ridge beginning at bend of road near Geo. Scott's running south to stage road.

19. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to build a school house near the four corners in Mill District and choose a building committee.

20. To see if town will vote to move the old schoolhouse in Mill District to a central point to accommodate the lower half of District 7; and how much money will town vote to raise to move same.

21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for permanent road.

22. To see if Town will vote to raise thirty dollars to pay F. B. Chandler for snowplow.
