AUDITOR'S REPORT

Houlton, Maine

July 28, 1942

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Mapleton, Maine:

In accordance with your request, we have completed an examination of the accounts of your Town Officials, for the municipal year ended February 28, 1942.

Our report, herewith submitted, was prepared from your town records and, to the best of our knowledge and belief, properly reflects the result of the year's administration and the true financial condition of your municipality as of the above date.

COMMENTS**CASH:**

All receipts are promptly deposited and a reconciliation of Receipts with Deposits made and retained in every

instance. All expenditures are made by check from properly authorized warrants. The cash balance was reconciled with the bank balance.

TAX LIENS:

All collections on Tax Liens are properly recorded. The proper entries are made transferring the Liens to Real Estate, when the liens expire. The 1940 Liens are listed in the Annual Report.

TRUST FUNDS

The only trust is a Cemetery Trust of \$100 which was verified by the pass book. The interest was drawn and expended for the care of the lot specified in the trust.

TAXES:

The 1941 assessment was added and found to agree with the amount charged to the Collector. Abatements were checked. Excise Tax Receipts were added and the sum agreed with the Treasurer's receipts. The Dog Licenses were added and the sum agreed with the receipt from the Treasurer.

A little less than a year ago, the major school topic in the town appeared to be the disposition that would be made of the local school union upon the retirement of Mr. Webber. Since the State Department of Education had for some time planned to consolidate the local union with the Perham—Wade—Washburn Union, it was somewhat embarrassing for your present superintendent to be at the center of a very justifiable difference of opinion. If there has been any great amount of inconvenience on the part of the town's people because your superintendent lives out of town, apologies are offered. However, after the first flush of embarrassment, your superintendent feels that he is very fortunate to be the first to act for the combined union. Every courtesy that one could expect has been offered by the good citizens of Mapleton. It has been a pleasure indeed to serve you.

It is with hesitation, that after having worked with you for only a little more than half a year, that I make any recommendations. There are a few however, that I will present for your consideration.

The town is fortunate in having a very adequate gymnasium and a fine auditorium for its high school pupils and for town functions. On the other hand, it is unfortunate that these rooms cannot be used to a greater advantage, especially the auditorium. It is heated, lighted, and serviced by the janitor, yet it is used a very small percentage of the time. It is really questionable if the town can afford to keep a room of this size idle. This is especially true when good class-rooms for consolidation purposes, are urgently needed. After a competent survey has been made and it is found feasible, it is recommended that the gymnasium be converted into a combination gymnasium and auditorium, and the present auditorium be converted into class rooms. If this change were made it would be possible to close the Old Mill, New Mill, Park, and Creasy Ridge Schools and bring all of these pupils to the space thus made available. There should be no additional cost of conveyance, cost of fuel, janitor and cleaning for these four named schools would be saved, and it would be possible to get along with one and one-half less teaching positions with the present enrollment. This deserves immediate consideration and if approved would be acted upon this coming summer.

In regard to teaching results, we have been very fortunate. The experienced teachers, fully realizing the extra demands that are made during a period of emergency, have taken their work seriously and are making a genuine contribution toward the scholastic life of the pupils. The cadet teaching plan has worked out very well. We owe these young cadets our most sincere thanks, and our appreciation is extended to Mr. Weiden and his assistants for making these teachers available. Without the aid of these girls it seems quite likely that some of the schools would not have opened. Just what will be the situation another year is impossible to predict. Therefore, if the present en-

rollment continues, it is recommended that the Dennett School be closed and the pupils be conveyed to the Packard School. While this would save the town a little money, the main object would be to relieve the teacher shortage since cadet teachers may not be available another year.

In connection with the number of teachers available, it might be stated that not only are the numbers being depleted because of the fact that fewer students are going to normal school but also to the fact that teachers are going into war work as well as going to other states to teach. According to the Maine Teachers' Association Research Bulletin No. 3, figures supplied by the 119 superintendents in Maine, out of the 6,134 teachers under contract last June 1, 673 (27.2%) left their respective districts by last December. And out of the 1,673 who left their unions, 1,148 (18.7%) left the teaching profession to go into some other field, or to go to some other state to teach. Considering the fact that this is about 2 out of every 11 lost to the profession it assumes very nearly a crippling effect. This is more deeply felt when it is remembered that the only way to remedy the situation is to call upon retired teachers or close the schools in question. This union has been no exception when it is noted that there were 34 changes out of 53 teaching positions over the same period. A terrific worry and tiring pace must be maintained to keep abreast, nor is the end in sight. The future portends more difficulties rather than fewer when it is realized that practically all reserve teachers have been called into active teaching duty. Even while this is being written, we are in the midst of changing principals in our high school. In normal times a task that would be the center of much conjecture. The former principal has gone back to his native state Massachusetts. Mr. Kolouch was completing his fifteenth year as principal of Mapleton High School. His deep interest in building up the school, preparing the students for

higher education, and in scholastic life in general will be a decided loss to the community. His natural teaching ability and his efficiency as an organizer and administrator placed him among the best small-high-school principals in the state. It is with regret that Maine has to lose the services of such men to other states.

BUDGET

(As recommended by the Budget Committee)

In observing the increased request for schools over last year's appropriation, several factors should be noted: (1) The amount received for tuition will decrease; (2) The proximity of Mapleton to Presque Isle causes the teachers to compete with high salaried workers from the air-port in regard to board and room; (3) The state's contribution will probably remain the same, thus throwing all of the burden of raising additional funds on the town.

- Art. 34 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Mapleton Fire Co. for the ensuing year.

- Art. 35 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to issue, execute and negotiate Town of Mapleton notes for a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00, payable during the year within which the same are made out of the money raised during the current year.
- Art. 36 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to sell and dispose of any Real Estate acquired for Non-payment of Taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable and to issue Quit-Claim Deeds for said property.
