BETHEL SCHOOL REPORT

1927—1928.

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Bethel:

The schools and the community met with a great loss in the passing of Mrs. Maud Thurston Glover. She was a woman of high ideals who gave her services readily.

The school at North Bethel has been closed since the opening of the school year and the scholars, four in number, have been conveyed to the village schools. It has saved the town ten dollars a week and given the chlidren better opportunities. I understand that all concerned are much pleased with the arrangement.

The last school in the village having two grades has been divided so that now each room has only one grade, thus greatly increasing the possibilities for good work.

The interiors of the buildings at South and West should be resurfaced. The heating plant at East Bethel has given some trouble. I think stoves or a new furnace should be installed. In doing this the future needs of a new building should be considered. Provisions for running water have been made at West Bethel. A lavatory and a drinking fountain will be installed in the near future.

Northwest Bethel requires consideration. I think the state is ready to give the town a regular school bus for this route, if conveyance should be decided upon instead of rebuilding. Conveyance would save the town fifteen dollars a week and give the children better advantage, if the right kind of conveyance can be furnished. A bus would get the children to school quickly and in perfect comfort. The plan should be tried for one year. This would give the town some relief in taxation which is heavy on account of the number of unusual burdens at this time.

The work of the schools is being done efficiently and harmoniously. I wish to thank all who have cooperated in this important activity of the community.
