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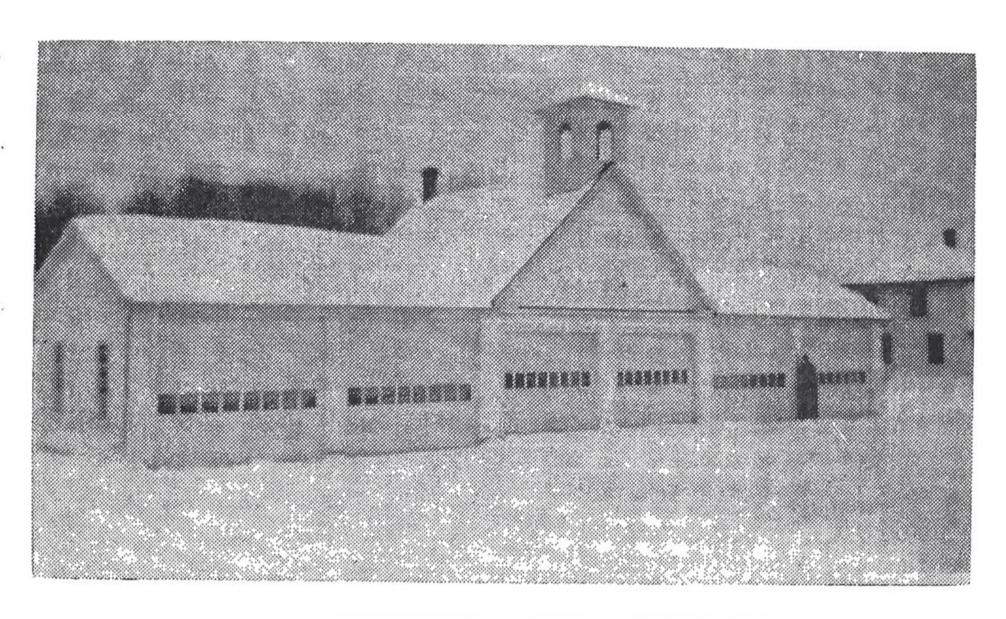

An examination was made of receipts and disbursements of the Treasurer and the Tax Collector, and such other officers necessary for a proper report.

CASH:

All receipts were deposited, and all disbursements made by check. The balance on hand Feb. 28, 1945 was reconciled with the bank statement (Schedule No. 1). The cash on hand February 28, 1945 was an in increase of \$7540.03 over the amount on hand February 28, 1944. TAXES:

The problem of getting teachers is still with us. If the problem would end with the present year, we would be very pleased. But, there is every indication that we will have difficulty in obtaining teachers for the next 3 or 4 years. The demand will exceed the supply until a sufficient number of high school students enter Normal School and become teachers. We were very fortunate in retaining some of our experienced tachers as well as selecting some very competent new ones.

One of the problems, that of the conveying of the pupils, appears to be solved. Our second bus, a 60 passenger Ford, was purchased and put in use February 25. These two vehicles not only make it possible to convey elementary pupils to school but to convey the high school students as well. This is a very commendable gesture.

A few of our active school supporters assumed the duty of soliciting funds and contributing their work to give some added conveniences to our high school. As a result of their effort a fine basketball score-board, a 50 gallon electric hot-water heater, and one shower for each of the girls and boys dressing rooms were made available. This is something that we have wanted for a long time. The students

faculty more than appreciate the contribution and the superintending school committee express their most sincere thanks for the cooperation of all the citizens that have helped to make these items available. We cannot stop there. At the earliest possible time a complete water-heating and shower system should be installed.

Ever since I came to Mapleton as superintendent of schools, I have heard comments on the necessity of more classroom space. In reading the old Annual Reports we can readily catch this trend of thought. For example, in the report of 1940, your superintendent of schools, Mr. Webber, suggested an adequate building for the first six grades. Since we have consolidated there is a greater demand for more room now than ever before. Hence, this is one of the pressing problems the voters of Mapleton should decide upon in the very near future. Several plans have been discussed to alleviate the situation and it would appear that we should settle on one of these plans very soon. We must either re-open one or two of our rural schools, the New Mill and the Packard, or build additional rooms. stance, our first and second-grade room is so crowded that we do not have seating space to keep them in school all day. This is a serious situation and a real handicap to the children. It is imperative that the situation be changed. I recommend for consideration one of several plans, as follows:

- (1) Close the high school and let the pupils attend a high school of their own choosing and use the present building for a grade building.
- (2) Build a building for the first six grades. This would require about a six-room building.
- (3) Unite with Chapman and Castle Hill and construct a grade building for the first six grades.

Should the voters of the Town of Mapleton decide not to build during the summer of 1946, it would appear to be wise to make an appropriation toward a new building. Some action should be taken.
