To the Inhabitants of the Town of Mapleton:

In accordance with Chapter 80, Section 116, Revised Statutes, and at your request, this office, represented by Robert S. Shean, has made an examination of the accounts and records of the Town Officials for the year ended March 1, 1947, and for the revenue received and disbursements made for the fiscal year then ended.

We have used accounting procedure, and have examined or tested accounting records of the town, and other supporting evidence, by methods and to the extent we deemed appropriate.

In our opinion, the accompanying Balance Sheet and related statements of Disbursements and Unappropriated Surplus fairly present the financial position of the Town of Mapleton at March 1, 1947.

## COMMENTS

## TREASURER

The records of the Town Treasurer were examined and found to be in proper order. All receipts were deposit-

ed and all disbursements made by checks from warrants authorized by the Selectmen. The balance of cash on hand, March 1, 1947, was reconciled with the bank statement and found in accord with Selectmen's Ledger.

Records were maintained for Withholding Tax deductions and the monies so withheld had been forwarded to the Collector of Internal Revenue as required by law.

#### **CLERK**

The record of the dog licenses issued showed collections in the amount of \$198.20, and this amount had been forwarded to the State Treasurer. Dog licenses were issued for 92 male, 14 female and 41 spayed female dogs.

Resident and Non-Resident fishing and hunting licenses were accounted for to the State Department, with the acknowledgement from that department being on file.

#### TAX COLLECTOR

The 1946 tax commitment was found to be in agreement with the Assessor's records. The total commitment was accounted for by cash paid the Treasurer, abatements, or unpaid taxes as reflected by the records of the Collector.

A small adjustment was made to the Reserve account. Excise taxes were verified by examination of the Collector's records, which disclosed a discrepancy in the amount turned over to the Treasurer. The Tax Collector has been advised of this amount. The total amount of Excise

Taxes collected were: 1946 - \$894.70 and 1947 - \$916.50.

Considerable time was spent to identify original tax receipts with amounts turned over to Treasurer. A system was suggested to the Tax Collector in the last audit report, which is being followed currently, even though it was not used the past current year.

#### SELECTMEN:

The double entry system of bookkeeping is used and was found to be in balance, as to receipts and disbursements. Adjustments have been made to bring the ledger in agreement with the audit report.

It was noted that complete payrolls had not been submitted by the Town Manager and Road Commissioner, consequently apportionments to be received from the State were not eligible for payment.

A change in Town Manager has been made and currently the records are being maintained on a more complete basis.

#### GENERAL:

No verification of assets or liabilities was made as a part of this audit as a list of unpaid taxes has been printed in the annual Town Report.

#### REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

The State Bureau of Health offers Public Health Nursing to your community, and helps point the way to better health and social conditions. The nurse serving in your area endeavors to promote health, prevent disease and deformity, and to teach members of the family how to give nursing care. This is accomplished through home and school visits, clinics, child health conferences, and community organization.

Home visits are made to maternity, non-communicable and communicable disease cases; also, for the purpose of health supervision to the infant, preschool child, school child, and adult. During the year the following visits were made: 11 maternity, 58 health supervision, 2 communicable, and 20 non-communicable.

The nurse prepares for and assists at child health conferences, pediatric and crippled children's clinics, and arranges for immunization clinics. With the aid of an organized child health conference committee, 2 child health conferences were held. 10 preschool children were examined by the attending physician. 3 received the combination diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus toxide, and 2 the

smallpox vaccine. For whooping cough alone 2 were immunized.

The pediatric and crippled children's clinics are held every two months at the Northern Maine Sanatorium for the benefit of the children in the surrounding towns. Eleven visits were made in their behalf

259 children received the audiometer test for defective hearing: 12 interviews were held with physicians, town officials, and welfare workers in regard to case finding, investigations and discussions of health problems in the town and families.

In order to offer the best possible nursing service to a community, it is necessary to have an organized community health group. It is through this group many health problems are made known, acted upon, and corrected.

Consult your nurse in developing such an organization so that your community will have a greater and better nursing service.

It is a pleasure to submit to the citizens of Mapleton my sixth Annual Report.

Since I assumed duties as superintendent for Mapleton every year has been a trying one to run a good school. In addition to the numerous small items that occur from day to day three major problems that have plagued us have been conveyance, shortage of teachers, and the need for more school room space. The conveyance problem has been met very adequately and would continue to function efficiently provided we use our buses only on regular school routes. However, transporting whole grades from one building to another has elements of inconvenience. Regardless of this added burden, the conveying of the fourth grade to the State Road School was the only solution to the large third and fourth grade problem in Mapleton. During the next school year not only will this third and fourth grade prob-

lem be with us but also the 5th and 6th grade problem will present itself for a solution. There is an Article in the Warrant asking the voters to consider the possibility of opening the Packard School for the 1948-49 school year. If this school is opened two paths will be open to solving the fith and sixth grade problem. First, the pupils from State Road could all be conveyed to the Packard School making this a regular eight-grade school. Secondly, one of the grades, preferably the sixth, could be conveyed from Mapleton to the Packard School such as the fourth grade is now conveyed to the Lovely School. Since the fifth and sixth grade will have approximately 58 - 60 pupils it would appear that it would be necessary to use one of these plans. After weighing the various factors the final solution can be made by the School Committee.

We have been fortunate in being able to engage a fairly competent faculty for the present school year. The strain of hiring teachers has eased slightly, yet the situation is by no means normal. There is still a paucity of teachers for the elementary schools as well as special teachers for the secondary field. One authority states "that elementary teachers are going to be scarcer in New York and Connecticut next fall. That means that Maine will be hunted early, vigorously, and long".

At a special town meeting called to consider the possibility of Mapleton entering the Castle Hill - Chapman - Mapleton Community School District the proposition was voted down. Since there were so few voters at that special meeting, the town not being adequately represented, it would appear that the decision was a wise one. The decision at another town meeting wherein a greater number of voters would be present would give an opportunity to register the real wishes of the people of Mapleton. If this proposition is not acceptable it is too bad that someone does not come forth with an adequate and acceptable program.

Several people in town have suggested and asked that I recommend an appropriation of \$20,000 this year in addition to the regular school fund toward a new building. The idea being that now while money is fairly plentiful it would be easier to pay a heavy tax one or two years than to spread it out over a long period of time. As much as I believe in this though I do not feel that it is my duty to urge it too strongly. It is a problem for the voters in the town of Mapleton to settle. Regardless of what is done now one thing seems certain, it does not appear that the parents of Mapleton would long tolerate the school arrangement that now exists. All indications point to the fact that some day in the near future a new grade building will be constructed. Thus, it would appear to be a wise move to prepare financially for that day.

As a matter of record we started to construct our Agriculture Work Shop during the summer of 1947. This project is coming along very well and, when completed, will serve our needs very adequately and be one of the best shops of its kind in the state. Since this building has a good classroom it will somewhat ease the classroom problem in the main building.

The committee from the Parent-Teachers' Association is still carrying on the Hot-Lunch Program. Miss Stephenson is handling the financial arrangements. This program is going along very well and the various members of the committee and Miss Stephenson deserve much credit.

- Art. 35 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Maintenance and improvement of the Castle Hill Cemetery.

  Budget Committee recommends \$300.00
- Art. 36 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much, for the Presque Isle General Hospital.

  Budget Committee recommends \$700.00
- Art. 37 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much, to assist with the development of the Castle Hill picnic ground on the Haystack Road.

  Budget Committee recommends \$50.00
- Art. 38 To see if the Town will vote to eliminate the itemizing of certain accounts, and if so, which accounts in printing the annual Town Report.

- Art. 39 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much, to reimburse the Town of Caribou for assisting Mapleton World War veterans.
- Art. 40 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much, to reconstruct the sidewalk between the Mapleton High School building and the intersection of Highway K-10 and the Hughes Road, or take any action thereto.
- Art. 41 To see if the Town will vote to open the Packard School making it available for the fall term of 1948.
- Art. 42 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much, for the improvement of the River Road.

- Art. 44 To see if the Town will vote to adopt a standard ordinance for chimney construction in the Town of Mapleton as recommended by the National Board of Fire Underwriters.

- Art. 45 To see if the Town will vote to adopt a standard ordinance for Fire Prevention and protection in connection with hazardous materials and processes.
- Art. 46 To see if the Town will vote to approve of an ord-inance regulating disposal trucks entering the Town of Mapleton.
- Art. 47 To see if the Town will vote to transfer \$100.00, the fifty-fifty road money, to the general Highway account.
- Art. 48 To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Simpson-Road so-called.
- Art. 49 To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Beckwith Road so-called leading from the Mapleton Town Line to the back lots.
