Town Warrant

To Walter L. Snowman, a constable of the Town of Owls Head, in the County of Knox:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Owls Head in the County of Knox, qualified by law to vote in said town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in said town on Monday, the Eighth day of March, A. D. 1926, at Ten O'clock in the Forenoon, to act upon the following articles:—

- 1. To choose a Moderator.
- 2. To choose a Town Clerk.
- 3. To hear and act upon the reports of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, Road Commissioner, Town Clerk, Treasurer and Tax Collector and Superintending School Committe.
- 4. To choose three Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor.
- 5. To choose a Treasurer.
- 6. To choose a Tax Collector.
- 7. To vote "Yes" or "No" for a Road Commissioner and to choose a Road Commissioner, if vote is "Yes."

- 8. To choose a member of the Superintending School Committee for three years.
- 9. To choose an Auditor and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to adopt the Budget System to cover the appropriations for the schools.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to build a suitable fence around the school lot at Ashpoint.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Common Schools.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for School Repairs.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Text Books.
- 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for School Supplies.
- 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for High School Tuition.
- 17. To see if the town will authorize the Superintending School Committee to contract with the City of Rockland School Board for High School accommodations.
- 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Town Expense.
- 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to

raise for Repairs and Construction of Roads and Bridges.

- 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Sidewalks.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to raise money for building State Aid Highway under Sect. 18 and Sect. 20 of State of Maine Highway Laws.
- 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for building State Aid Highway under Sect. 18 and Sect. 20 of State of Maine Highway Laws.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to install one street light at the top of the hill in front of the residence of P. S. Merriam; one at the corner of the main road and Crescent Beach road; and one at the corner of main road and Holiday Beach road.
- 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for all street lights at \$1.91 each per month.
- 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Mothers' Aid.
- 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the Poor.
- 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the reduction of the Town Debt of \$2000.00.
- 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for interest on Town debt and temporary loans.

- 29. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to issue notes for temporary loans for current expenses.
- 30. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to enforce the Slash Law.
- 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Town Officers' Salaries.
- 32. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the purpose of getting a full description of all real estate for tax valuation book according to law.
- 33. To see what method the town will vote to adopt for the collection of taxes.
- 34. To see if the town will vote to buy a tractor and snow plow or authorize the selectmen to contract for the use of tractor for snow removal.
- 35. To see what sum of money the town will raise and what method the town will adopt to pay for tractor if it is voted to purchase one.
- 36. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used by the Maine Development Association for advertising the natural resources advantages and attactions of the State of Maine.
- 37. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair Lucia Beach, Crescent Beach and

- Holiday Beach roads, or take any action regarding same.
- 38. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen or the road commissioner to spend not over \$35.00 for graveling road from Ocean Avenue to George Tarr's barn or take any action regarding same.
- 39. To see if the town will vote to abate all back taxes on Walter Martin's property.
- To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

Supt. of Schools Report

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Owls Head:—

The work of the schools of Owl's Head during the past year has been successful. The methods of instruction and the government of the schools are satisfactory.

The entire teaching force has been changed since the last town meeting. The teachers who served the town for the two previous years were persons of ability and did efficient work.

At the present time the teachers at Ingraham's Hill and Timber Hill are Normal School graduates and the Ash Point teacher has done considerable work at Farmington Normal School and has a life certificate. All have had previous experience. Few small towns in this part of Maine have a so highly trained teaching force.

Some of our tuition pupils in the Rockland High School have not been doing satisfactory work. In some cases this has been due to lack of effort. This cannot be permitted as the town is responsible only where the work and deportment are satisfactory. A pupil who in spite of honest effort finds the work difficult may expect leniency, and it is doubtless true that the long walk is a tax on ones energy, may not

permit the very best work, but the pupil should make a reasonable effort if the tuition is to be paid for by the town.

The textbooks and supplies accounts show balances and slightly smaller appropriations will be sufficient, while in the common schools and tuition accounts larger sums must be raised or the accounts will have to be overdrawn.

At the Ingraham's Hill school the toilet should be joined to the school house as the law requires and some painting should be done, therefore a larger sum is asked for repairs.

During the past summer the toilet at Ash Point was connected with the school building and a woodshed was built on with it. This was erected partly on land acquired this year from Mrs. Snowdeal.

The annex as it is when this is written, is not at all satisfactory to the committee or superintendent. It is clearly not up to the specifications of the state. In some parts the workmanship is not satisfactory. The contractor has acknowledged that the work is not complete but has made no move to complete it. Unless he finds time to make this right, other persons must be employed to finish the job before it will be acceptable to the state.

The committee and selectmen were told that the superintendent of schools had seen and approved the finished job, and they paid for it on this understanding. As a matter of fact the superintendent had not seen the work after it was supposed to have been finished. The plans as agreed upon were for a building that would have satisfied the state's re-

quirements in every particular and we can be satisfied with nothing less.

It is my duty to remind the people of the town that a situation still exists where the children of an entire village have to attend a school quite outside the village and at an inconvenient distance from the homes of most of the pupils. I do not know that there is anyone who claims that the situation at Owl's Head Village is satisfactory in this particular. To me there seems but one solution worthy of consideration and I believe the people will eventually agree with me in this. The parents at Owl's Head whose small children must walk a long way to school will continue to be dissatisfied until something is done. I hope the time will come soon when the citizens of the town will feel able to erect a school house of moderate cost at some suitable location in the village.

The school accounts this year have presented few difficulties except in the case of certain tuition bills still outstanding, that involve differences of opinion as to the extent of the town's obligation.

Some of our citizens have assisted the teachers in the work of the noon lunches. The Parent-Teachers Association at Owl's Head assisted the School League at Timber Hill in the purchase of a Victrola.

A Parent-Teachers Association has been formed at Ingraham's Hill, where there are also boys' and girls' clubs to teach certain kinds of manual work. The efforts of the unselfish persons who give their time to the children should be appreciated.

In conclusion I wish to thank the town officials and all citizens who have cooperated with the schools

in the great work of training the children for future usefullness and happiness.
