Report of Supt. of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and to the Citizens of Owl's Head:

Please accept my sixth annual report as your superintendent of schools.

At the present time our three rural schools are doing excellent work. The teachers are trained and experienced persons of good character and ability. Our pupils are, for the greater part, diligent and are well governed. The methods employed have proven efficient.

Each year as our pupils enter the high school in Rockland they do satisfactory work, and in some cases win the highest honors. Last spring the valedictory in Rockland was awarded to Donald Merriam who formely attended the Timber Hill school, and Janet Nevin who received her elementary training at Ingrahams Hill won similar honors in a city of Virginia. This reflects credit upon our schools, as well as upon the fine intellectual quality of our boys and girls.

This year there is a small overdraft in the common schools account. The reason for this is that the amount of money received from the state was slightly smaller than had been expected. It is impossible to estimate accurately in February the amount of the state money which is awarded only after the results of the census are received and the yearly report of the school attendance is completed.

Balances exist in the Tuition Textbooks, supplies and repairs accounts. It is sometimes embarrassing to the town officials to have these balances representing as they do, financial obligations at the end of the year, when as matter of fact, other accounts have been overdrawn and there is no bank balance. Where this condition exists it would seem wise for the town to vote to raise a sum of money sufficient to pay the amount of these balances.

There are more Owls Head pupils in the Rockland High School this year than attended in 1926, 1927, so there should be more money appropriated for tuition. If the numbers continue to be as at present or approximately so an appropriation of \$525.00 will be needed.

Our textbooks account has a substantial balance, and although there should be some changes in the texts, a smaller appropriation will be sufficient.

There is a substantial balance in the repairs account. In this account, although it is not compulsory by law to carry along our balances as it is with other school accounts, it has been the custom to do so.

According to the law, toilets must be joined to the schoolhouses before September 1927. The toilet at Timber Hill has been so joined and a concrete vault built as the law provides. This was the only large item of expense this year.

In the coming year the school building at Ingraham's Hill must receive attention. The floor of the large coat room where wood has been stored settled under the weight last summer. This should be repaired and there should be some sort of a wood shed built for this school.

Wood must be housed and it is not convenient or sightly to have practically the entire space of the only room where the pupils can keep their wraps, occupied by fuel.

All of our schoolrooms are poorly lighted, the building at Ash Point especially so. Large windows on one side should replace the present inadequate system. As the left side of the pupils' desks is on the northern side, it might be wise to have the seats reversed so that the lighting could be on the sunny side. This would require care in curtaining the windows, but the building would be warmer. The stove could then be placed, as it should be, on the northern side of the schoolroom and jacketed.

I believe this would make the building more comfortable. This is now a cold, poorly lighted room depressing, alike to the teacher and the pupils.

All the school buildings should be properly lighted and heated in time. It can be done gradually and these are matters of vital importance to the children.

The fact that the Timber Hill schoolhouse is situated so far from the homes of the majority of the pupils continues to be a subject of complaint on the part of parents.

These citizens are entitled to consideration and as soon as the finances of the town can be so ordered as to make this possible, the present building should be moved to the village or a new building erected. A new building would be much more satisfactory and less expensive in the long run. This should not be forgotten. The citizens must be the judges as to when this will be possible, but the need remains.

If my consideration of the buildings seems to oc-

cupy undue space in this report it is because of the greater need in this branch of school affairs. We have good teachers and good books. Our greatest needs are buildings that will be comfortable and conducive to the welfare of the boys and girls.

In closing I wish to express thanks to the members of the committee, to the selectmen and treasurer for their courtesies and cooperation in school affairs.

Town Warrant

To Walter L. Snowman, a Constable of the Town of Owl's Head, in the County of Knox:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Owls Head in the County of Knox, qualified by law to vote in said town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the 12th day of March A. D., 1928 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles:—

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To act upon the reports of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, Road Commissioner, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Tax Collector, and Superintending School Committee.

Art. 4. To choose three Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To vote "yes" or "no" for a Road Commissioner and to choose a Road Commissioner for the ensuing year, if vote is "yes."

Art. 8. To choose a member of the Superintending School Committee for three years.

Art. 9. To choose a Fire Warden for the ensuing year.

Art. 10. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Common Schools.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for School Repairs.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for School Text Books.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for School Supplies.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for High School tuition at Rockland High School.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Current Town Expenses.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Snow Removal.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Construction and Maintenance of Roads and Bridges.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for sidewalks.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid,

as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916, or under the provisions of Section 21, Chapter 25 R. S. Amended by Chapter 258 P. L. 1917; and to finally determine upon what sections of said road improvements shall be made.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Mothers' Aid.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Support of Poor.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Street Lights.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the reduction of town debt.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for interest on town debt and temporary loans.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue notes for temporary loans for current expenses.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Officers salaries.

Art. 29. To see what method the town will vote to adopt for the Collection of taxes.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for advertising Maine through Maine Development Association.

Art. 31. To see what standard of wages and hours per day the town will adopt for town labor.

Art. 32. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for treating State Aid Highway.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to build a school house at Owls Head; and to see what sum of money for this purpose and how same shall be raised; also to appoint a building committee.

Art. 34. To choose a Constable.

Art. 35. To see if town will vote to raise some money to be spent on Ballyhack Road.

Art. 36. To see if town will vote to take over Town Hall.

Art. 37. To see if town will vote to abate 1927 taxes on Walter Martin's heirs estate.

Art. 38. To see if town will vote to abate taxes for years 1927-28 on Geo. St. Clair's property.

Art. 39. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

Art. 40. To see if town will raise some money for Creek Road.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of fifty dollars for the perpetual care of the grave in which the remains of Jacob Erick Hojgard are buried in the lot of J. Leroy McCon-

chie in the Ash Point Cemetery in said Town of Owls Head and the grave stone thereon.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to abate the taxes on Charles Wooster's estate.

Art. 43. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
