School Department

To the Superintending School Committee and to the Citizens of Owl's Head:—

This, my twelfth annual report is hereby presented.

There have been no changes in the teaching force or in the salary schedule during the past year. Under the direction of these teachers the schools have been reasonably successful.

Sound methods of instruction have been employed, and the pupils as a group have worked well with the teachers.

The two larger schools are crowded, especially the Ingraham's Hill School. The fact that a considerable degree of success has been achieved for the past few years is due directly to the efforts of the teachers who have given of their time and efforts more generously than could have been reasonably expected.

Various plans of building and consolidations have been presented to the voters in the past but these have failed to meet the approval of the citizens.

The parents who send their children to the Timber Hill School continue to feel that some action should be taken to furnish a new school or move the old schoolhouse to a spot nearer to the Village. In late Autumn the State Commissioners of Education asked the Superintendent of Schools to furnish at once projects for needed work on the schoolhouses and grounds. The purpose of this was to provide a program for work by the Civil Works Administration.

In the very short time allowed a list of needed repairs was sent and for the main part the items were approved. The fact that a lot of materials would be needed for which no funds were accessible and which could not be expected from the state to a town of the good financial standing of Owls Head was one of the reasons that influenced the town officials to choose the road project. Another important factor was the greater ease and speed with which a road project could be undertaken. Among of good water the real needs is that for the At Timber Hill this is acute. Decent schools. wells should be dug where there is no water systems. At the school named there is no good water within reasonable distance. The Ingrahams Hill School could be furnished with good water from the water pipes at a fair cost. If a good well cannot be provided at either of the other schools because of ledge, some other site should be provided Water is a necessity and the childfor the school. ren should have a good and constant supply.

The underpinnings at Ash Point and Timber Hill must be attended to and the roof at the last named school leaks, and should be shingled. Some work should be done on each of the school toilets if these are to be kept up to legal requirements. Had there been a fund of \$500.00 for materials for

repairs the town could have received much more from the Civil Works Administration than has been received on the road project.

The sum of \$500.00 for repairs should be raised this year if the present buildings are to be maintained for any considerable time. This is not urged for to some citizens the insides of an efficient central school and conveyance of pupils still persists.

Our schools are now provided with modern text books and the needs of another year will be no greater than those of last year.

The expenditures for supplies will be larger. Prices have advanced and more seat work is needed where there are many pupils and grades in each of the schools.

More money will be needed for High School Tuition because of the increased number of pupils and the smaller balance in the tuition account.

I thank the town officials for their kindness and assistance and the citizens for their generous support.

To those who have assisted with gifts, we express our gratitude and commend them as examples to those who are interested in our schools and wish to assist even in a small way.

To Richard Dyer, a Constable in the Town of Owl's Head, in the County of Knox.

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Owl's Head, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall, in said town, on the FIFTH day of MARCH 1934 at TEN O'CLOCK IN THE FORENOON, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear and act upon the report of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of Poor, Road Com-

missioner, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Tax Collector and Superintending School Committee.

Art. 4. To choose three Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of Poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To choose a Constable for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To vote yes or no for a Road Commissioner and to choose a Road Commissioner if vote is yes.

Art. 9. To choose a member of Superintending School Committee for three years.

Art. 10. To choose an Auditor and all other necessary Town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see what method the Town will vote to adopt for the collection of taxes.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Common Schools.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for School Repairs.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for School Text Books.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for School Supplies.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for High School Tuition.

Art. 17. 'To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Current Expense.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care and construction of Sidewalks.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for care and Construction of Town Roads and Bridges.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$500.00) FIVE HUN-DRED DOLLARS to be used on Shell Street on strip from main road by V. B. Perry's, on turn near the Sunrise Cottage and on the hill near the Fred Ellis cottage.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of FIFTEEN HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$1500.00) to complete the surfacing of the unfinished portion of third class highway, extending southeasterly from Hare's Corner to the property of Alvin Hurd, a distance of one and threetenths (1 3-10ths) miles, and apply tarvia to same. work to begin May 15th, 1934.

Art. 22. To see what scale of wages the Town will vote to adopt for all town labor including teams and trucks.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote yes or no on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Sect. 20, Chap. 28, R. S. 1930.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chap. 175, P. L. 1933.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum not less than one hundred thirty-three dollars, (133.00) for the maintenance of the improved section of third class, or to be used in connection with third class appropriation made by the State for the improvement of third class road.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the care of the poor.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Mother's Aid.

Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue notes for Temporary Loans.

Art. 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for interest on Temporary Loans.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lights and Town Hall Lights.

Art. 31. 'To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Officer's Salaries.

'Art. 32. 'To see if the sum of fifty (50) dollars or more will be raised for school nursing in the town of Owl's Head under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare. As the amount increases, the length of service will be greater.

Art. 33. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of calcium Chloride to be used on third class road and wherever else it is needed.

Art. 34. To see what action the Town will vote to take on "Item Nine" from the will of Isabel R. Lattie which is as follows. "I give three hundred dollars to the Selectmen of Owl's Head in Knox County in Maine, the income of the same to be applied in the keeping in repair my family burial lot in Ash Point Cemetery, and if this cemetery should

be in control of authorities other than the Selectmen, then I give this sum to those in authority having control of such cemetery for the purpose stated."

Art. 35. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.
