





To A. A. Eldridge, Constable of the town of Howland in the County of Penobscot,

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Howland, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Forester's Hall in said town, on Monday, the eighth day of March, A. D. 1909, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, viz.

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner for three years, and to choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
  - Art. 3. To elect a tax collector.
- Art. 4. To fix the commission for the collection of taxes, and to specify the amount for which commission is to be paid.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of schools, poor and repairs of roads and bridges, and defray all other town charges, for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provisions of chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine, for the year 1907 relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to State aid for highways for the year 1909.
- Art. 7. To see if the town will raise, appropriate and set apart for the permanent improvement of the main highways within the town, such sum of money as is contemplated and directed by section 5 of chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907, being the sum of \$45.50.

- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise one hundred dollars to be used on winter roads.
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of five per cent on all taxes assessed in 1909, which are paid on or before Oct. 1, 1909.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise a sufficient sum of money to purchase double windows for the school building on the northeast and west sides.
- Art. 11. To see what action the town will take in regard to the east pier in Piscataquis River bridge.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will authorize the town treasurer to hire, to repair the East pier in Piscataquis River bridge.
- Art. 13. To elect a bridge committee and fix the pay of the same.
- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand, six hundred and thirty dollars (\$1630.00), to pay the first note on school building, and interest to Dec. 8, 1908.
- Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred thirty-five dollars (\$135) to pay the insurance on new school building for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to use the northeast room in school building as a place for town meetings; also the room termed "Teacher's room" in the same building, as a town office.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to run the line between Howland and Edinburg, providing, however, that the town of Edinburg pays one-half the bill.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to appropriate twenty-five dollars (\$25) for the care of cemetery.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will allow W. H. Smart and A. H. Boober to plant a part of town common to garden, said grant of right to cease, after one year, at the option of the town, or the then selectmen.

Art. 20. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session at Forester's Hall, on Monday the eighth day of March, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

## Annual Report of the Selectmen

OF THE TOWN OF HOWLAND FOR THE MUNICIPAL YEAR 1908-9.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Howland:

In compliance with the laws of Maine we herewith submit our report as Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor for the municipal year 1908-09.

The appropriations made at the last annual meeting amounted to \$5485.50 to which the State and county tax should be added. State tax \$829.10, county tax \$372.35, making a total assessed of \$6686.95. The amount raised was \$6759.83, which gives an "overlay" of \$72.88, a statement to this effect will appear at another point in this report.

You will kindly consult the several accounts, and ascertain the amount of the expenditures in each department; also take particular notice of the gain made during the past year.

The town has expended a large sum of money on the Piscataquis Bridge. It would be impossible to make much of any showing in the financial statements, save one; going to the debt limit.

What we wish to call your attention to is the amount of gain on the usual yearly business, which has been as we figure it \$195.66. See summary of accounts.

We have no comments to make on anything during the year except the incidental account.

This account has always been too small. It takes \$500.00 or \$550.00 to pay the collector and discounts, leaving \$400.00 or so to pay all the other town officers, and defray all other charges coming under this department.

We find no fault, but simply offer this in explanation.

## Road Commissioner's Report

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF HOWLAND:

In reporting this department, I will begin with the North Howland road.

On this road I caused quite a piece to be turnpiked, and performed much labor between the village and the north line of the town.

This road was in good condition the entire season.

On the Edinburg road we turnpiked from the Bailey place to the bridge, building a good piece of road.

The Meadow Brook road came in for its share of attention as is usually the case. Thanks to the "log-drag" as it was our only salvation on this road during the early spring.

And I want to say now, while it is fresh in my mind, that on a soft road when the frost is coming out of the ground, or after a rain the drag is the best thing that we have today to use on our highways.

The Mattamiscontis road was in the best condition for years due partly to the dry summer, a certain proportion to King log-drag, and the remainder to good old sweat, muscle and brains (if it takes any). This road always offers quite a proposition to the Commissioner.

The Maxfield road was in first class condition during the summer and fall months, and received its part of the money.

The State road including the concrete culvert was pronounced the best in the County by the inspector.

The several accounts you will find at another place in the report of the Municipal officers. In closing I strongly urge the use of the King log-drag.

The teachers on our force this year have labored hard and untiringly to maintain the highest possible standard of excellence and the results of their conscientious work have been, for the most part, highly satisfactory.

The same care has been exercised this year as last by our teachers and pupils in keeping the school property in prime condition. In very few instances has any disposition to mar the beauty of the building or injure the books been shown.

Each term the teachers and pupils have observed what we call a "Parents' Day." The object of this is to interest all of the parents in the education of their children, one of the vital questions in life. It is gratifying to see so many of the mothers present on these days but we are not satisfied yet. We wish all parents would respond to this invitation.

The only way by which we may know of the real condition of our schools is by personal observation and I wish to urge the parents and citizens of our town to visit the schools, not only on "Parents' Day," but as often as the opportunity comes. How often, during my teaching days, have I seen a pupil's face light up with undisguised pleasure when, upon answering a knock at my door, some mother would come in for a morning or afternoon with her little ones! I am sure it can't cost such a great effort and it means so much to the child and to the teacher. We cannot place too much importance upon our schools. They, together with the home and the church, are the educators of our children and our heartiest support should be given to them.

Again this year, I wish to call the attention of our citizens to the question of "Union Superintendence" which is being adopted all over the State. Full particulars regarding this plan may be obtained by applying to Hon. Payson Smith, our State superintendent. Passadumkeag has this change in mind and I hope by another year definite steps may be taken by our town toward adopting this better method of school supervision.

Since our teachers must, by their every day intercourse with the children, come in closer touch with them and their needs than the superintendent, I have asked our principal to report the condition of our schools at the present time and also to suggest any helps for the coming year. I take pleasure in giving you his report.

I thank the members of the school board and the citizens of Howland for their support.

#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT.

To the Superintending School Committee and to the citizens of the town of Howland:

I have the honor to submit my first annual report of the work that is being accomplished in your schools.

The past year has been a period of prosperity and progress in the schools of Howland, and their condition, so far as educational promise is concerned, was never more encouraging than it is at the present time. We have had an enrollment of one hundred pupils, which is, I believe, the largest number that has ever been enrolled. The pupils, in nearly every case, are showing much enthusiam in their work, and would, I believe, show more if their parents would take a little more interest. Children, especially, like to be encouraged in their work by their parents as well as by their teachers, and if they do not receive this encouragement they soon lose interest and their studies suffer as a consequence.

We need to keep constantly in mind that the age is widening out before us; new thoughts and ideas are rapidly developing;

what sufficed for yesterday will not be accepted to-morrow; every science is making new and vital discoveries in bewildering succession and the education that was adequate for our fathers and mothers will not bring the boys and girls of this generation up to the plane on which, before they reach the prime of life, they will be forced to stand. Encourage your boys and girls to get an education; don't be jealous if they do happen to tell you a few things you do not know; the progress of the race is maintained in this way. Give them a warm room in which to study, and a good lamp by which they may see to work, and some day you may have cause to be proud of your boy or girl.

Plans are being made to have a reading-room and library in the school building, not only for the benefit of the school but for the citizens of the fown as well. The town is in need of this and will derive much profit as well as pleasure from it.

We are planning, also, to organize a club to be known as the Howland Reading Club, which will be literary in its character, taking up a systematic study of the lives of American and English authors and their different works. After completing this course, we shall study English and Ancient History and the lives of historical people. This club will be opened for membership to the pupils of the senior class and to the citizens and young people of the town,

Much good and personal benefit may be derived from this and we earnestly hope that the club may have a large membership. That the work may be kept interesting, the club will give suppers and entertainments from time to time. I wish that the spare room in the school building could be used for this purpose. It could be fitted with lights and necessary furniture and made an ideal place for entertainments. I am sure it would be to the advantage of the town to thus utilize this room. The boys and girls need practice in speaking, singing and entertainment work and if they are taught this when young, it will not come so hard for them when they are men and women.

Mere book knowledge is not all of a child's education; the social side of their nature needs to be cultivated and developed. There isn't a suitable place in town where the young people can meet for a social evening. No wonder that they are on the

streets and in the stores, where, as a rule, they do not learn anything to their betterment. If you want your children to be something more than "street children" you will have to provide a place that will give them the pleasure and entertainment that every normal boy and girl requires in order to grow. "All work and no play makes Jack a dull boy" just as much now as when you were young.

The youth of Howland have the best place in the State, for a town of its size, in which to study and it is my opinion that they would do better work if they had a place where they could meet socially once in a while.

Boys and girls are very plastic and are capable of being moulded into something worth while if proper attention be given to all sides of their education. I wish you would give the matter your attention and act accordingly. Don't simply "think" but "act." That is what counts.

I would suggest, too, that the town raise enough money to cement about three hundred square feet directly in front of the steps of the school building. It is very sandy there and during the spring and fall terms it is tracked in by the pupils to nearly all parts of the building where it acts like sand paper on the floors. They are beginning to show the effect of this "scrubbing" already, and in the course of a few years the nice hardwood floors will be ruined.

By having the cement walk, where the pupils line up to march in, the sand will be largely, if not wholly, eliminated from the building since it will be naturally stamped from the children's feet to the walk, and from there it can be easily swept aside.

Hearty thanks are due from me to the Superintendent and to the school committee from whom I have received nothing but uniform courtesy, cordial support, and harmonious co-operation.
