WARRANT

Penobscot ss.

To Harold E. Boynton, Constable of the Town of Howland, in
said county, GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Howland, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in said Town on Monday, the 10th. day of March, A. D. 1930, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To choose a Fire Inspector, and fix his compensation.

Art. 4. To choose a Collector of Taxes.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to pay the Collector of taxes or vote any other form of compensation.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will allow a discount of five per cent on all taxes assessed in the year 1930, on real and personal estates which are paid on or before July 1st. of that year; and see if the Town will vote to have all taxes assessed in the year 1930 collected and paid into the Town Treasury, by February 15, 1931.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1000.00 or any other sum for the Support of Poor.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$14,000.00 or any other sum of for the Support of Schools. (Common and High).

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,200.00 or any other sum for School Repairs.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$700.00 or any other sum for Physical Education in the Schools.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$550.00 or any other sum for Thomas Free Library.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Conveyance of School Pupils.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 or any other sum for the Fire Department.

Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 or any other sum for Highways and Bridges.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 or any other sum for Winter Roads.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$113.00. for the Maintenance of Improved sections of Third Class Road.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 or any other sum for Street Lighting.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$700.00. or any other sum for Insurance.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Care of Cemetery and purchase of additional land.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 or any other sum for Health Nurse.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00. or any other sum for Memorial Day.

Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$7,600.00. for Retiring Town Bonds, Notes and Interest on same.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$5,000.00. or any other sum for Incidentals.

Art. 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$4,500.00. or any other sum for Discount, Commission, Abatement and Interest on Temporary Loans.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$828.00. for Maintenance of State-aid Road.

Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money Necessary to entitle the Town to State-aid, as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$390.00. for the Improvement of the section of State-aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highways Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and bridges, under the provisions of Section 18 of Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916, or under the provisions of Section 21, Chapter 25, R. S., amended by Chapter 258, P. L., 1917.

Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer and Selectmen to hire money for Town purposes, if necessary, in anticipation of the collection of taxes the ensuing municipal year.

Art. 29. To see what nights the Town will vote to allow the free use of the Town Hall to the American Legion.

Art. 30. To see what nights the Town will vote to allow the free use of the Town Hall, excepting holidays, to each of the three church organizations, the Schools, and both Locals, and to see if the Town will vote to allow the free use of the Town Hall for Basket Ball practice of the High School Team.

Art. 31. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act.

Art. 32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to deduct from the wages of any person working for the Town the amount of his total tax for the ensuing year.

Art. 33. To see if the Town will vote to assess water rates against the owners of buildings instead of against tenants as is now being done.

Art. 34. To see if the Town will vote to use any income from Water Rates not used from Repairs, for the purpose of completing the pipe line across Piscataquis River Bridge.

Art. 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00. or any other sum for purchase and installation of a water chlorinating system.

Art. 36. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00. provided in the will of the late Eva Thompson for the perpetual care of her lot in the Cemetery.

Art. 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00. or any other sum for repair and painting of Town Hall.

Art. 38. By petition: To see what action the Town will take to reimburse Mrs. Belle Fogg (a soldiers widow) for taxes assessed and paid as follows:

Art. 39. By petition: To see what sum of money the Town will raise to extend water line on so-called Maxfield Road.

Art. 40. By petition: To see how much money the Town will raise to extend Sewer and Water on so-called Seboeis Road.

Art. 41. By petition: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the erection of a Band Stand and to procure a suitable site for same.

Art. 42. To Revise the Jury List.

Art. 43. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at Town Hall on Monday, the 10th. day of March, at nine o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the voting list.

Thomas Free Library

To Citizens of Town of Howland:

The tenth annual report of the library for the year 1929-30 is hereby submitted.

During the year 401 new books were added to the library, 204 were for the fiction department, 188 for the childrens department and 9 reference books. 95 wornout volumes have been discarded, leaving 3,359 books on the shelves at the present time.

The library has been opened its regular number of hours each week throughout the year except legal holidays. The circulation for this period of time is 11,765 volumes, with an average of 980 volumes loaned per month.

Registration shows that there are 566 patrons, 150 of this number are juvenile borrowers.

We are subscribers to the American, W. H. Companion, Mc-Calls, Pictorial, Geographical, Goodhousekeeping, Hygeia, and Child Life magazines. These are loaned for one week.

We have made extensive additions to our books shelving space, purchased three chairs and a step stool for the children's department.

\$550.00. was appropriated for the purchasing of books, supplies and the librarian's salary, \$50.00. State Stipend, \$585.94 was expended, leaving \$14.06 unexpended.

\$20.41, has been collected from over-due books, \$72.19. on hand, \$10.00. gift, making \$102.60. Fund money, \$22.17 of this amount was used for books and supplies, leaving balance of \$80.43. on hand.

H. G. McKay gave \$10.00 to buy books and Mrs. A. L. Bickford donated 10 popular fiction books.

Report of Superintending School Committee

To the Citizens of Howland:—

We herewith submit our annual report of the schools of the town for the municipal year ending March 1, 1930. This report will contain a short summary of all expenditures made for school purposes, a schedule of salaries paid, and an estimate of the amount of money necessary for the maintenance of the schools for the next fiscal year.

The work of supervision in the grades has been much the same as it was last year. Education is now on a scientific basis and we have in standardized tests an extremely accurate instrument of the measurement of school progress. While it is true that the soul of man cannot be measured with a yard-stick it is equally true that his worth-while accomplishments in life can be so measured and assessed at their real value. It is the crowning glory of educative progress that during the past fifteen years education has been reduced to the basis of an exact science. While no doubt cases of educational malpractice still exist such cases form the exception rather than the rule at the present time.

Nov. 13 Series B of the Stanford Achievement Tests by Kelley, Ruch, and Terman were given all pupils beginning with the fourth grade and continuing on through the fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth grades. A pleasurable feature of the work this year was the fact that no opposition greeted the appearance of these tests. In very fact the value of such tests is so self-evident that the teachers called for them before the time seemed proper to give them.

It is extremely interesting to compare the scores obtained from, we will say, the fifth grade of this year with the scores obtained from this same grade last year. The difference in

scores will show at a glance the progress made by this grade during a year of school work. It is also interesting to compare the work of the fourth grade of this year with the work of the fourth grade of last year. If this comparison shows considerable variation it is the duty of the teachers and of the supervision to determine the cause. We find that a combination of several factors produce this variation. Among these factors individual differences among children; unequal opportunities for schooling; and home conditions are probably the main contributing causes.

Forty-one children in the fourth grade took these tests; sixteen in the new building and twenty-five in the old building. The sixteen in the new building scored heavily above the standard median for their age and grade; the twenty-five in the old building scored a somewhat erratic score. They were above the standard median in Arithmetic, History and Language and somewhat below in Reading. The fifth grade, as last year, scored well above the standard median. The seventh grade was exactly up to standard, the sixth and eighth nearly so. Last year the seventh grade scored low but during the winter and spring term it was brought up to where it should be.

It is important to know that the State Department of Education calls work of this nature "real constructive work." But to take practical advantage of the information gained from school testing we should be able to promote to higher grades pupils who score heavily above the standard set for the grades in which they are now enrolled. In one case we were able to do this. Eight pupils of the sixth grade were promoted to the seventh. This necessitated no transfer to another room. Six pupils of the fourth grade in the new building should have been promoted to the fifth grade, but this could not be done as the fifth grade is already over loaded. Some of the fifth grade pupils should have been promoted to the sixth grade, but for the same reason it was impossible to do this. Expansion of our grade system is the proper solution of our difficulty here.

The town of Howland has a rapidly growing high school.

The in-coming classes are so large that it is necessary to divide them into two divisions in subjects that are required of all students. It is the concensus of opinion of the teachers that next year the high school will have to take over the fifth grade room and a new assistant teacher assigned to that room. The work in the Commercial room is heavy now; yet two new subjects, Commercial Geography and Economics, should be added to round out the course. It is proposed to give these two subjects to the new teacher.

The work in the science room needs attention. The instructor is now teaching two classes in European history and one class in American history. To do this he combines the Juniors and Seniors in Physics and Chemistry teaching these two subjects alternate years. When the classes are small it is possible to do this; but the time is close at hand when this combination will be impossible. In departmental teaching, such as we have in our high school, it is good practice to give to each teacher subjects that are closely allied in content. As the teaching schedule is now made up our science teacher may be teaching the time-space relations of Einstein one period and the campaigns of Frederick The Great the next Period. It is proposed to give the new assistant the two classes in European history. If these two classes are taken from the science teacher he can teach Junior and Senior science separately. This will require less laboratory apparatus and he can supervise the work of the students more closely. One other class, either from the English room or the Modern Language room, will complete the schedule of the proposed new assistant.

The state strongly advises that the high school day be divided into seven teaching periods; five of these periods to be class teaching periods, and two to be supervised study periods. We are not able to follow the state's request in this matter owing to the fact that in the Commercial room there are eight different classes and the other teachers have to make their schedules conform to the necessities of the Commercial room.

The town of Howland is facing a school situation that is exactly the same as any fast growing town is called upon to face. It is not an impossible situation; it will yield to treatment. In discussing ways and means to relieve this congestion one thing only should be taken into consideration,—the welfare of the students who are now crowding our school rooms.

REPAIRS ACCOUNT

There seems to be no special reason for a large expenditure in this account next year. If we are compelled by circumstances to add new rooms to the new school building any expenditure for this purpose would come under the head of another account.

Report of Principal of High School

To Elmer C. Vining, Superintendent of Schools:

I hereby submit my fourth annual report as principal of Howland High School.

Our registration this year is one hundred thirty-nine. This enrollment makes the school the largest in its history. In order that you may see the proportion of boys and girls in our high school, I am presenting the data in tabular form below:

The Commercial Course introduced in the fall of 1928 is being carried on very efficiently. The syllabus for commercial studies is set up to recognize two fairly distinct kinds of work in business. The clerical and secretarial are the commonly emphasized courses. They offer bookkeeping, shorthand, typewriting and arithmetic. The graduate who has taken this work will be qualified to enter the ordinary business office and do the work generally demanded. It may consist of bookkeeping, general office work or secretarial duties.

The commercial department added to its equipment this year four new typewriters. It can be made more efficient by the addition of a complete filing cabinet and an adding machine, for in business today the knowledge of both of these are needed in an up-to-date office.

Our large enrollment this year has increased the teachers' teaching periods so that they are carrying more than is recommended by the State Department. However, this seemed to be the best plan as no allowance was made in the budget last year for a new teacher. At the present time it seems we must have another room and another teacher for next year. The best room for high school use would be what is now used by Grade III, as it is a large room and could be used for the commercial department.

This year we have added to our library a dozen more volumes, which are a great help in reference work.

We are at the present time in need of an electric clock system. This system would do much to improve the running of our program. It would compel us to begin and end on time, make our periods even, allow the teacher to take her attention entirely away from the clock, and make the mechanical part of carrying on our day's work efficient and businesslike.

Physical Education is carried on through all the grades and High School. The system used here is based upon the old Swedish system of gymnastics. Its primary aim being health through exercises and the establishment of correct health habits. This system includes a regular "days order" which consists of marching, running or skipping, exercises for each large muscle group, and some recreation in the form of a game or folk dance. The marching and running aids muscular co-ordination and good posture, which is the real basis for normal growth and development. The exercises given are for the purpose of improving muscular tonicity and to develop rhythmic co-ordination under perfect control of the will, and not for the purpose of developing great bulk of muscle. All exercises must have some direct benefit to some part or parts of the body. That is, those exercises which look well when performed or because of their simplicity should not be given unless they have some direct benefit upon the body. Only such performance which will bring about the desired benefit should be insisted upon. Games and play as a definite part in the program are important in as much as games

improve the fundamental skills and teach cooperation under one leader. In the upper grades the exercises and games are directed by student leaders, hence the development of future citizens leaders.

This year the use of the "Modern Health Crusade" has been introduced into the grades. This is a definite method of teaching Health Habits to children through play. The "rules of the games" are health chores—the boy or girl having to score 54 points out of a possible 77 per week in order to score at all for the week. If the pupil can score every week for twelve weeks, he or she receives a pin in recognition of effort for improvement. In the lower grades the children improved especially in the substituting of milk for tea and coffee and brushing their teeth. We feel that the dental clinic which was held for the grades last year did a great deal of good, since it aroused the interest of the parents. There has been a very definite improvement in the dental care of the teeth as well as the home care in all of the grade rooms. Much more can be accomplished in this line of health through the cooperation of the parents, teachers and doctors. However, we feel at least a real beginning has been accomplished.

Mrs. Forrest Smart of Sebois has been teaching music one period a week as last year. The cost of this instruction is met by the students who take this course and the proceeds of the operetta "Gypsy Rover" to be given next term. We are fortunate this year to have Miss Annie Folsom, teacher of Grade II, who is able to teach music in the lower grades. She has very efficiently carried on the instruction of music in Grades I and II.
