

Your attention is called to the fact that we have book balances totaling \$2,456.73. The treasurer has that amount in

cash. There is no money due us, and our only indebtedness is \$300 due library trustees.

The State took over construction of State-aid road, and reports total expenditures: Town, \$2,665; State, \$6,395.59. We recommend the sum of \$2,665 for State-aid road.

Third-class money was spent on Wadsworth road, and this year should be continued.

The legislature has passed bill transferring road from house of Duncan Dunbar to Morse Cove bridge, together with about seventy-five acres on the left side of the road, so that now the town owns all land in what we call the square, and all the surrounding road.

Boiler in Emerson hall cracked front section a year ago, and was repaired temporarily. This winter the back section cracked, and examination showing it practically worthless, we put in a new one at expense of \$375. The hall needs some new scenery and the Woman's Club will give \$150 toward this.

Since closing accounts, the town of Lincolnville has paid bill of Charles Thayer, amounting to \$4.60.

We recommend the sum of \$500 for the new hospital.

# REPORT OF TRUSTEES WITHERLE MEMORIAL LIBRARY.

To the Citzens of Castine:

During the past year, 5,555 books from our public library have been read by our people. Certainly this source of pleasure and instruction demonstrates the value of good books in our community at a financial cost of less than two per cent. In other words, of every dollar spent on town expenses, less than two cents goes to the support of the library.

Fines and the gifts of summer visitors have added \$36 to our special fund, which resource enables us to pay many bills without calling on the town treasury, as for instance, rebinding books. Books and current magazines have been given by various friends.

We recommend for increase for the coming year a sum equal to 35 cents on each poll. For maintenance we recommend the sum of \$475.

# REPORT OF

# SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the Superintending School Committee of Castine: Herewith is my report for the year 1926-27.

Elementary Schools.

These schools continue to do work that can in general be favorably compared with that accomplished by towns of our valuation and population. It is hoped to give some standard tests which will give a very definite check on how our schools compare with those of similar communities.

# High School.

It seems to be the general opinion of the town, as well as of the school officials, that the high school is

doing excellent work. We are fortunate in having such a principal and teaching force, and we hope that we shall be able to retain them. They are doing good work not only in the class room, but also in outside activities which are no less important but which are often not properly handled.

#### Accounts.

Our books show favorable balances for the past year, in spite of the fact that there has been no holdback of funds when a real need has shown itself. The generous and progressive attitude of the town toward its schools is appreciated, and results in an investment in future citizens which is well worth while.

## Repairs.

The alterations and heating equipment at the high school cost quite a sum of money. However, these features were absolutely necessary, and credit is due Mr. Morgrage and the school board for the efficiency which results from the arrangements as made.

#### Recommendations.

In presenting these figures, there has been a definite attempt to secure economy by cutting the costs as low as possible, and still not have that false economy by which we cut too far and as a result get poor returns for our money.

# REPORT OF HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL.

High school has been carried on this year with two definite aims in mind. First, we have tried to secure co-operation of teachers, pupils, parents and school authorities in all studies, school activities and school management. We have frankly sought suggestions and used the wisest given. This process of exchanging ideas has made for friendly relations among all of us. In the second place we have encouraged outside activities, feeling that pupils ought to get in the habit of using leisure as wisely as working time. Basketball, baseball, plays, socials, junior public speaking exhibitions, hikes, winter sports, singing, church activities, and others, have all been encouraged. Pupils have attended largely to writing school notes for the newspaper. The library is in active use at school, and pupils thoroughly appreciate a number of good magazines which the school board subscribes to for the school.

The standard of scholarship in high school is quite high. We think parents can help by keeping track of students' marks and by expecting them to do good work.

It has been a pleasure to work with Mr. Philbrook and the members of the school board. They have exercised wise control and given teachers and pupils every encouragement and help. Our supply necessities have been well taken care of. Castine is fortunate

in having Miss Dyer, Miss Cunningham and Miss Hatch as teachers in the high school. They have been ready and willing to do all the work for which they were hired and any extra work that would help the school. My personal thanks are due to all of these directly connected with the school, and to all the townspeople who have had any connection with the high school. They have all been anxious to help Castine maintain a good high school.
