**REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF  
WITHERLE MEMORIAL LIBRARY.**

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To the Citizens of Castine:

The trustees of the Witherle Memorial Library herewith submit their annual report. During the year, 5183 books were taken from the library. Books were



donated as follows: Mrs. John Mueller, 1; Miss Bremer, 4; Miss Hunt, 3; Mrs. Merrill, 1; Miss Mary Louise French, 6; Arthur W. Patterson, 2.

Deposits left by summer visitors amounted to \$10 and fines amounted to \$13.50. Magazines were donated by Miss Trumbull, Miss Wadsworth, Mr. W. G. Stevens, Mrs. William Hooke, Mrs. T. E. Hale, Miss Eustis and Miss Gay. A gift of \$25 was received from Miss Anna Trumbull.

The accounts show the money expended for maintenance of library, purchase of books, etc., and give a detailed statement of the library's invested funds.

The trustees recommend for library increase the sum of fifty cents per taxable poll, and for the maintenance, the amount of \$500, these being the same amounts as raised last year.

It is also advisable to buy two globes for the outside lights, the old globes having been broken, and it seems wise to repaint the wall on the south end of the reading room, same having become discolored. There apparently is a crack in the masonry, through which rain is driven at times, accounting for this discoloration, and this defect should be remedied. As the maintenance fund is only sufficient for the actual running expenses of the library, it will be necessary to make a special appropriation for the repairs if the property is to be kept up, and the trustees recommend that a sum be raised and expended for these purposes, and will present specifications of the cost at the town meeting.

To reach these new lots, two new roads will have to be built this spring, in addition to the usual repairs in cemetery and common, so our committee feels justified in asking for at least \$400 for the coming year's expenses, to properly look out for the town's public grounds.

SCHOOL REPORT.

*Common Schools.*

It is easy enough to argue about the relative speed of different cars, but the best way to prove anything is to put them on the track and let them race it out. It is just the same way with a school system. To prove where it stands, it should be measured by a test which has been given to hundreds of other schools. The records they have made have been averaged, and a figure established for what each grade should score in each subject. The Castine schools have been tested on such a basis, and have shown that they are well up to



standard. Almost without exception, a pupil who has normal ability shows that he can score right up to the country-wide mark. In fact, the average educational ages of the children as compared with their ages in years and months, show that the pupils are ahead of the average in that respect.

### *High School.*

There is no one factor that so lowers the efficiency of a school as a constant turn-over in the teaching staff. In this respect, we have been fortunate by having retained Mr. Small, Miss Dyer and Miss Howell. Together with Mr. Simmons, they have formed a strong and well-balanced faculty. Both in the classroom and in community affairs, they have shown themselves to be very distinct assets in the life of the town.

The school has shown some increase in registration, and offers courses that should enable a pupil to secure adequate training for his future occupation, whether he be destined for further school life or for immediate work in the affairs of the world. With the undoubted advantages offered by the elementary schools, and with such a progressive high school, it certainly seems that Castine's educational facilities are of a high calibre. The citizens of the town are to be congratulated on their liberal attitude toward school affairs, which has always manifested itself, and which is apparently securing such good returns.

### *Accounts.*

The accounts are in general in good shape this year. The overdraft is balanced by the balances in other accounts, so that if all the tuition money which is now due were paid in, there would be no overdraft on the school money as a whole. The wiring of the North Castine school, which was not foreseen last March, and the cutting down of the repairs appropriation last

year, in order to help keep down the tax rate, made necessary this year's overdraft.

### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT.

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It is increasingly apparent that whatever success we have in school is because all who are connected with it work hard and unselfishly to make it so. Miss Dyer, Miss Howell and Mr. Simmons have worked hard this year, both on classroom work and outside activities. Mr. Philbrook and the school committee have each given us good cooperation. We are proud of the spirit and attitude of our pupils. The townsfolk, too, have done their best to encourage and help us all. The result has been a school that has been a pleasure to work in.

It is our aim in outside activities to provide a chance for boys and girls to have a part in every activity that a normal boy or girl would feel inclined to take part in. We know they are bound to be active, and we want to encourage them to do the normal things they want to do, so that they will not be active in a troublesome way, in school or out.

At present we have for school activities, baseball, basketball, some playground sports and tennis; we publish a school paper, have a school orchestra, plays, a public speaking contest, school and class parties and picnics, a students' association to encourage and help carry on school activities. The interest in all these activities has been especially satisfactory this year. Sometimes schools are all for athletics and some-



times all interest is in other ways. This year interest has been well balanced between all activities.

Absence is one of the most important causes for failure. We have had a lot of it on account of sickness this winter, so I want to urge that every pupil be at school and on time unless sick.

We are glad to welcome fourteen pupils from Brooksville this year. Other pupils, too, have come to Castine, so that we now have the largest school in several years.

Our building is getting pretty full. It needs to be re-decorated. The desks were refinished last summer and are in good condition. The commercial room was divided and is now well adapted to commercial work.

Scholarship for the year has been good and our graduates are doing well in other schools. We want all scholars to make their studies their most important work and do it well just as men and women do their work.
