## REPORT OF HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

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*To the Superintendent of Schools, the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of Islesboro:*

I, herewith, present my report of the High School for the year ending March 1944.

The fall term opened September 13, 1942, with an enrollment of thirty-five pupils. There were twenty-four girls and eleven boys.

There are nearly fifty of the former students of this school in the Armed Forces of the United States. They are scattered all over the world.

The school is now engaged in the preparation of a play to be given at a future date.

Parts have been assigned for the Junior Class Speaking Contest. That will come in the near future, as we hope to go to Castine to compete with other high schools in the Union, about March 20.

We have played a few games of basketball and have been fairly successful. One not only forms lasting friendships but gets training in sportsmanship—a requisite in every person's life.

The High School still meets the requirements set by the State Department of Education as a "Class A" High School. There is a certificate on display at the high school building to that effect.

The scholastic standing of the school is on a par with other high schools, and the students, as a whole are a grand group to

work with. There are only one or two instances of non-cooperation, and that has developed, not from inability, but laxity in methods of home preparation.

There are numerous students who are attending higher institutions, who are making grand progress and such instances give the former high school the standard from which that school gets its rating.

The registration has dropped slightly, but that is to be expected in this war period.

I should like to thank the School Board, Mr. Fowlie, the parents, Miss Moore, Miss Smith, Mr. Nichols for the kind cooperation which has made this year so pleasant and memorable and any other who has helped to make this a successful season.

**REPORT OF ISLESBORO FREE LIBRARY**

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*To the Chairman of the Selectmen,  
Islesboro, Maine.*

February 12, 1944.

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**REPORT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE—1943**

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The work of another year has been finished. In some ways it has been a hard year: The restrictions on driving, caused by limited supplies of gas and tires; the changes in population, due to civilians working in war industries, and many of the boys being inducted into military service, have made organizing and planning difficult.

We are fortunate, that as yet, there has been no serious epidemics of communicable diseases, though we hear rumors of flu spreading. Should a 'flu' epidemic start, could we be certain of controlling it? Are we prepared to take care of the sick in their own homes? Remember there is no chance of hospitalization.

Do you know how many of your citizens and children have been protected against smallpox, typhoid fever, diphtheria and whooping cough? Immunizing agents which make it unnecessary to be ill with any of the above diseases, may be administered with very little discomfort and time, and procured at very reasonable cost.

Are you acquainted with the plans for Health Education in the schools? Are your children benefited by a hot dish to supplement their lunch brought from home? Have you heeded the teacher's report on hearing and visual defects and sought medical advice? Early attention may save serious trouble later on.

The health program in your town is yours. Your cooperation is vitally needed to make it successful. There is need for committee organization to help plan for Child Health Conferences and Immunization Clinics. Your town officers and public health nurse will appreciate any assistance you believe you have time and ability to give.

This war your boys are helping to fight can be won only by the closest cooperation among the officers and men with their allies, backed up by those on the home front, producing arms, ammunition, planes, ships, food, and clothing. The health of everyone must be maintained.

It is also a fact that any Health or Welfare Program in your town can only be successful to the extent that the parents, officers and children cooperate with each other and any of the agencies which stand ready to help.

The nurse has made four visits to your town this year. One nursing visit was made to an infant and six nursing visits were made to the preschool children.

A Child Health Conference was held in the town with four children attending.

Three nursing visits were made to school children in an effort to have physical defects corrected and to find solutions to other health problems, which had been presented by the teachers.

As in the past all crippled children have been followed up and closely supervised by visits to the homes and through the supervision offered by the clinics.

During this emergency, with the shortage of doctors and the limited amount of transportation available, it is more important than ever before that each community be aware of its own health problems and to work toward the solution of these problems. This can be accomplished only by the united effort of interested community leaders, organized as a community health committee whose purpose should be to learn the needs of the community, to interpret these needs to the citizens, to know the services offered by the public health nurse, to interpret these services to the community, and to stand behind the Health Program.

Let us all cooperate for better health in 1944 for every citizen in the community.

- Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To receive the report of the several town officers and act upon the same.
- Art. 4. To see what percent the town will vote to pay its Tax Collector for collecting taxes and the length of time from the date of comitment, taxes shall be paid to the Town Treasurer.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to employ a Doctor for the ensuing year.
  - (a) To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay for the salary of a Doctor.
  - (b) To see whom the town will vote for the Selectmen to employ.
- Art. 6. To choose Selectmen, Assessors and one Overseer of the Poor. One member of the School Committee and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

- Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the total sum of thirty seven thousand three hundred and twenty-five dollars and fifteen cents. (\$37,325.15)

- Art. 9. To see what wages the Town will vote to pay for men, trucks and horses on the highways for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen in behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for nonpayment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they may deem advisable and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 11. To see what action the Town will vote to take regarding the expenses incurred in operating the Ferry Boat "Gov. Brann", for the fiscal year 1944 and 1945.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Road Commissioner to gravel the road leading to Maurice Bowden's house.

The Selectmen give notice they will be in session at the Town Hall at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting for the purpose of revising the list of voters in the Town of Islesboro.
