SCHOOL REPORT

REPORT OF SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

We, the undersigned, members of the superintending school committee, have carefully discussed with Superintendent Philbrook the needs for the coming year, and we endorse herewith the recommendations he makes for appropriations in the various accounts. The committee believes that where economies can be made, that is the policy to adopt, but it will be obvious that it is not wise to ask for amounts insufficient to carry on the schools in efficient fashion.

We feel that the teachers in the various schools have done good work during the year, and that our schools are in good condition. Buildings and equipment are in excellent condition. Not only have the teachers in both high and common schools carried on their regular work with zeal and earnestness, but they have done much valuable work outside school hours, in carrying on or helping to carry on various activities that are helpful and interesting to students and parents. Perfection in schools, as in anything else, will probably never be attained anywhere, but we believe that our schools compare most favorably, not only with schools in towns of similar size, but with the schools of much larger and richer communities.

The committee hopes that citizens and friends will visit the schools as much as possible, and familiarize themselves with the work that is being done. Suggestions and constructive criticism will always be gladly received. It is the desire of all connected with the schools to make them as good as possible.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT.

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Castine:

Herewith is my report for 1931-32:

Common Schools

These schools have been maintained as in the past, the State assuming all expense for the first six grades, except for \$325 paid as tuition. In the grammar school and Emerson school, the town and State each pay half the teachers' salaries, and the town furnishes all other items. In general, the children of the town have enjoyed good school advantages.

High School

Another year of operation with the three-teacher plan indicates that it can be worked successfully. The idea has been to secure teachers who combine thorough professional training with as much experience as possible, and that will be the basis for the coming year.

Naturally the high school age—that of transition from childhood to young manhood and womanhood—presents many problems, but it is a rare thing to find a high school teacher who is not willing and eager to do his best to instruct the pupils. If pupils come to school with the idea of conforming to the regulations of the school, and of applying themselves to their work, they can make satisfactory progress.

Accounts

While the town raises a considerable sum for schools, the school tax rate is .01058, while the State average is .01297, thus indicating that the amounts raised, in proportion to the valuation of the town, are reasonable.

HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

With three teachers we have not been able to supervise as many desirable activities as we would like. Actual school work, of course, receives first efforts, and what time is left is given to other school activities. I wish we could do more for music and school socials than we have done; perhaps parents can help us in the latter.

Our graduates in advanced schools have made good records. Parents of pupils who intend to go away should know that to have success in an advanced school pupils must do much better than barely pass in high school. We feel that high school is for every boy and girl so long as they work. Advanced schools are for the superior mentally, and if they do not show that extra ability in high school, they seldom do in advanced schools.

We are making progress in the direction teachers, committee, parents and pupils all desire, of developing business-like boys and girls both in and out of school. We want attention to business, neatness, orderliness and good care of our school building.

Two aids parents can give to pupils for their success are: First, encouragement to regard education as important, and, second, to see that pupils are in school regularly and on time.

I recommend that salaries be kept at the present level in order to attract and hold high class teachers. The salaries are probably not so high as other professional and business people of the town receive. If any cut is necessary, perhaps the principal should be cut first, as his salary is higher comparatively than the other teachers.

Great credit is due the school committee and Mr. Philbrook for their supervision and helpful suggestions; to Mr. Goodwin and Miss Conant for their continuous efforts, and to our pupils and parents for fine cooperation.
