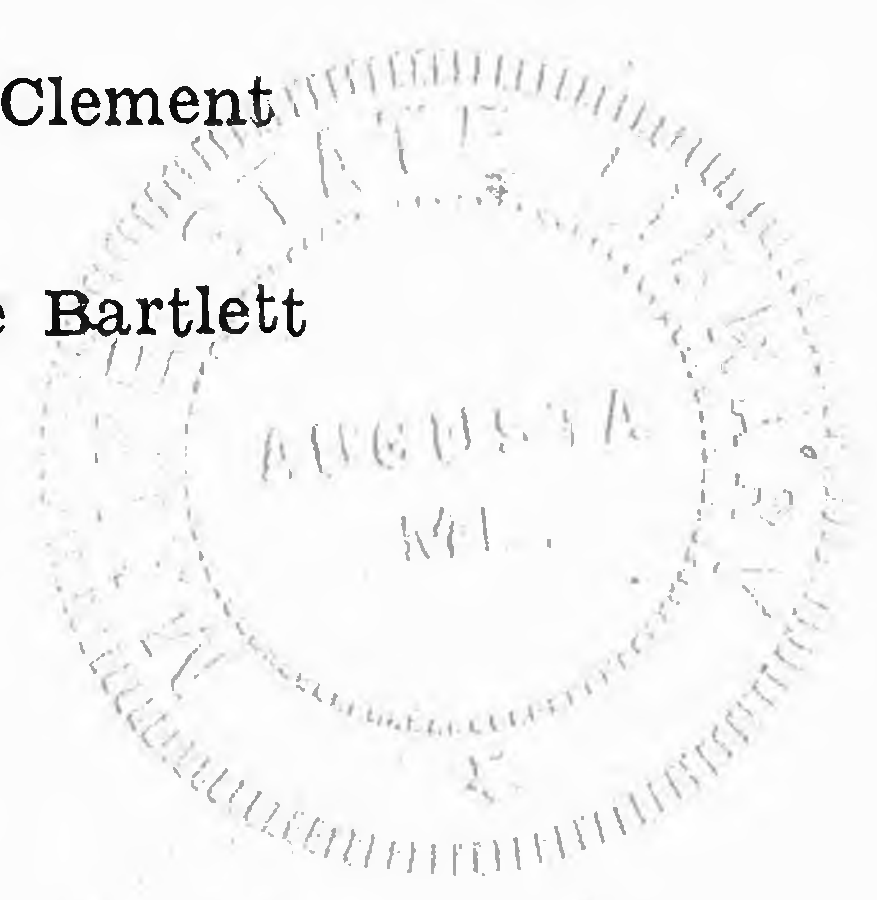

Books close each year February 20. Town meeting the third Monday in March. Taxes are assessed the first day of April. To avoid errors, you should appear before the assessors on that day, with lists of property. Whenever property on which you pay taxes, listed as "heirs," has been settled, please notify the assessors at once.

While we are showing a valuation within salable value, a low rate, no debts, and no present reason to acquire any, yet the present economic conditions are such that at our next annual meeting we should materially reduce our total appropriation. We are asking all departments to recommend much lower amounts for all purposes, as our next assessment will show lower valuation, and the only way to make a low tax rate is to cut the appropriations.

We do believe that road construction, at least to some extent, should be continued from the end of last year's work, because not only does this section need rebuilding, but it is the only prospect in sight for taking care of the unemployment situation.

Please examine all trees and bushes on your property for brown tail moth nests, which should be **CUT AND BURNED** at once.

Town meeting opens at nine o'clock in the forenoon of March 20. Please bring your town report as it will help to a better understanding of the proceedings.

REPORT OF LIBRARY COMMITTEE

To the Citizens of Castine:

The trustees of Witherlee Memorial Library herewith submit their annual report. During the year, 9,927 books were taken from the library, an increase of 2,716 over the number taken the preceding year. The largest number taken in any one month was 1,010 in January, and the largest number taken in any one day was 197.

Cash was given by the following summer guests: Miss Virginia Stoddard, Mrs. Francis Small, William Witherle Lawrence. Books were given by Mrs. Merle Connor, Mrs. Nash, Miss Nremer, Miss Baldwin, Mrs. Clarke, Miss Mary Bates, Derwood McIntyre. Magazines were contributed by Mrs. Jackson, Mrs. Latimer and Mrs. Hooke.

The trustees recommend for library increase, fifty cents per taxable poll, and \$550 for maintenance.

The trustees extend sincere thanks to those who have contributed to the library in the several ways mentioned. We also desire to call attention to the fact that the library has been used more in the last year than ever before. Nearly every family in town takes books from our shelves. While exact figures are not available, we believe our per capita circulation to be greater in Castine than in most towns and cities of the State.

SCHOOL REPORT

REPORT OF SCHOOL COMMITTEE

To the Citizens of Castine:

Your superintending school committee and superintendent have taken, we feel, great care in facing a situation which has arisen that is not easy or pleasant in attempting a solution. We ask for earnest and wholesome cooperation on the part of all fellow citizens.

We are confronted with the general move for greater economy which is making its way into nearly all civic affairs. We do not seek to escape it, nor do we wish to be caught in an over-indulgence to the end that our school system, which is the most treasured possession a community holds, shall be seriously impaired. However, we recognize our obligations to the taxpayers, who must necessarily be the burden bearers, and we firmly believe in their protection.

We would like, first, to call attention to the fact that, because of what seems to us a highly favorable arrangement with our State normal school, the total amount which we have to raise for town schools is thereby considerably less than the average town of our size, so that our total school budget is comparatively small. But in view of the urgent demands made upon us by those who are calling for greater economy, we find it necessary to recommend reductions this year that we do not find wholly in keeping with our best judgment. However, we have carefully gone over every item of the budget, and in both salaries and general expenses have recommended drastic reductions, which mean substantially a 20 per cent. cut, which your school committee feels is the maximum reduction at this time without seriously impairing the efficiency of our schools. This we do not believe the citizens of Castine would approve. In consequence of it all, it must not be overlooked that the school department, in turn, will have considerably less to expend in the community.

We sincerely believe that our schools and teachers make a favorable comparison, if not a little superior, to other communities of this size, and we are only eager that their efficiency may not be seriously reduced.

It ought to be considerable gratification and pride to the citizens of Castine to know that, of a class of sixty-eight students from several high schools throughout the State, at the close of the first semester of the Eastern State normal school, the four students achieving the highest rank in scholarship were all graduates of Castine high school. Also, that the principal of the high school has received the grades of graduates now in college, and who grade well toward the head of the list. This should all be of value to our citizens that is without price.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Castine:

Herewith is my report for 1932-33.

Common Schools

The elementary schools, under the present arrangement, provide schooling that is economical for the town, and that offers a richer curriculum than is usually the case in smaller towns. Much is said today about the 3R's, meaning the so-called fundamentals of reading, writing, and arithmetic. However, for the development of a well-balanced personality and for future use and enjoyment, educators agree that such subjects as physical education, music, art, etc., are very valuable, and when they can be offered without too much expense and

without curtailing instruction in the fundamentals, are a great addition to a school program.

High School

Some question has arisen as to the appropriation for the high school. Seven years ago the appropriation was raised \$1,000, with the idea of hiring another teacher and thus improving the efficiency of the school. As it was at that time, it was possible to obtain only inexperienced teachers for the fourth position, so it was felt, after several years, that the fourth teacher should be dropped and part of that salary given to the other teachers, with the idea of securing and holding better-trained and more fully-experienced teachers. About that time tuition receipts had reached nearly \$800, but with the loss of the Brooksville pupils, it has dropped to where not more than \$240 can be safely figured on. Salaries were reduced 4 per cent. the present year, but the full saving will not be made until the last of this year. At the same time, State funds this year were over \$100 less, offsetting the salary saving for this period.

These figures represent a decrease of \$1,100 from last year. It would be more if a possible further loss of \$200 in State funds did not have to be figured, and if teachers did not have to be paid from February until June—nearly half a year—on the old salary schedule. Next year, on the above basis, a further reduction of some \$700 would be possible.
