#### REPORT OF EMERSON HALL COMMITTEE

To the Citizens of Castine:

We wish to express our thanks and appreciation to the various organizations using Emerson Hall for their cooperation and support.

Owing to the necessity of heating the building continually during the basketball season, it has been necessary to employ a janitor who could devote more time to the care of the fires and general condition of the building.

We wish to say we are much pleased with the laudable services of the janitor and would recommend his services be continued.

Repairs have been made to various parts of the building, chiefly the floor of the assembly hall and walls of the lobby.

The attention of the committee has been called by relatives of the donor of Emerson Hall, to the fact the exterior of the building bears no designating title. Although this is not a necessary detail, under the original proposal it could be done with small expense.

Although the amount of rental has been smaller than the previous year, we are only asking for the same appropriation this year as last, to be used for the running expenses and necessary repairs of interior, to prevent deterioration of building.

We feel that there are very necessary repairs needed on the outside of the building; that is, painting, repairs to chimney and windows. As this would require a larger sum than can be made by the general appropriation, we are asking that an additional appropriation of \$250 be made that this work may be begun before the building becomes in a more serious condition.

#### REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

### To the Citizens of Castine:

During the year the number of books in circulation was 9,644, slightly less than last year. Of these books, 1,777 were non-fiction.

Books were presented to the library by the Misses Slade, Mr. and Mrs. Tucker, Mr. Drayton, Mrs. Clergue, Mr. Merle Connor, Dr. Hatch, Mr. Silas Hatch, Judge Arthur W. Patterson, Mrs. William H. Hooper, Mr. Alfred Loomis, Miss Bean, Mrs. Harry Butler Miss Beatrice Spurling, Mr. Fred Williams, Mrs. William White, Mrs. Jackson, Miss Drake, and the Reading Club, thirty-six books being received as gifts. Many of these books were given, as will be noted, by members of the summer colony, our summer residents always having taken a deep interest in the library, and using its facilities to a great extent during the season.

Purchased by the trustees during the year, 215 books. The gift of ten dollars from the Castine Woman's Club to the Mary Hooke Fund, for the purchase of children's books, is most gratefully acknowledged.

Magazines were presented by Mrs. Jackson, Mr. Fred Williams, Miss Trumbull, Mrs. William Hooke and Miss Freda Hatch.

Cash deposits were left by Mrs. Latimer, Mrs. Balch, Mrs. Michelson and Mrs. Clausing. The trustees acknowledge all

gifts, either of books, magazines or money, with profound appreciation.

Six funds for the purchase of books have been established up to the present time either through legacies or gifts, said funds being the Charles J. Abbott Fund, Mary W. Hooke Fund, Annie Gay Page Fund, Caroline Perkins Fund, Mary Weld Fund, and G. A. Wheeler Fund, and the trustees, from the income from these trusts, are enabled to purchase books of a type which otherwise could probably not be obtained. If any person interested in the library should desire in the future to establish a fund, either for the purchase of books, or to be used toward expenses of maintenance, any money so given would enable the trustees to improve the library and its facilities in many ways.

The trustees recommend that the usual amounts be raised and appropriated, i. e., \$550 for maintenance, and 50 cents per taxable poll for increase.

### SCHOOL REPORT

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE

The superintending school committee has met with the superintendent, and has approved his detailed report, as outlined in the following pages. Due to a favorable combination of circumstances, there is a balance in the school funds at the close of the fiscal period. As suggested in the superintendent's report, it is proposed to utilize this balance next year for repairs by adjusting the two appropriations, as school laws prevent direct transfer of such balances.

The committee is endeavoring to maintain salary schedules at a level that will enable us to secure adequate teachers and at the same time not overburden the taxpayers of the community. The recommendations in the superintendent's report have been approved by the committee.

As was stated last year, the management of the elementary schools is not given over entirely to the normal school under the terms of the contract. By this agreement the committee and superintendent act jointly with the normal school authorities in the control of the grade schools. This arrangement has continued to work satisfactorily, as there has been good cooperation between the various controlling authorities.

It is proposed as a measure to improve the training which the pupils receive in school, to add a sub-primary grade to the system next year. This proposal meets the approval of the committee and superintendent, as by it two distinct advantages would be gained; first, five-year-old children would not be obliged to attempt full first-grade work which is intended for six-year-old mentalities; and, secondly, pupils now attempting high school work at an average age that is rather low, would have another year of maturity.

It is the intention of the committee to paint the buildings this year, in whole or in part, as the appropriation may allow. The grammar building will probably have heavy screens placed over the windows to prevent breakage likely to occur in vacant buildings. The main room in the high school will need a new ceiling, preferably steel, as soon as funds can be made available.

The committee wishes to thank all who have taken a constructive interest in the welfare of the schools, and to assure parents and citizens that in formulating decisions relative to school matters, the question that is kept ever uppermost is "What is the best thing to do for our boys and girls in our public schools?"

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

### Common Schools

As we stated last year, the new contract arrangement with the State was working satisfactorily, and it has continued to do so during the current year. There has been good cooperation between the normal school officials, the school committee, teachers and patrons of the school, with the intention of keeping ever uppermost the welfare of the boys and girls in the schools of Castine. The changes of teachers this year should have a beneficial effect in bringing new methods and fresh view-points into the various rooms. The new conveyance system with the bus has continued to work satisfactorily, and it is no small addition to the school services rendered the citizens of the town.

### High School

Although some changes in the teaching staff were necessary this year, it was possible to secure well-trained, experienced teachers to fill the vacancies. There was very little of the confusion and period of adjustment that sometimes follow, and the work of the school has gone forward on a very satisfactory basis. Visitors to the school should find a situation that is orderly and conducive to effective study with consequent educational achievements.

Again Mr. Kassay is to be commended on his use of the N. Y. A. funds in continuing to improve the appearance of the building, and at the same time to make it possible for many pupils to earn while attending school. The remodeling of the cloak-rooms to make available a Little Theatre stage has been a very successful project. The development of the social life of the school by entertaining the basketball teams, and by having socials after the games, has been of considerable value.

### Accounts

It is proposed this year to reduce the high school appropriation by approximately the amount represented by the favorable balance, and at the same time increase the repairs account, to make possible the painting of the two school buildings. In this way there would be little increase in the total school appropriations, and at the same time this feature of repairs which has become urgent, could be taken care of. It will be necessary to increase the insurance account as is always the case every third year, to pay the premiums on the three-year-term policies.

## NURSE'S REPORT

To the Selectmen of the Town of Castine, Maine:

I hereby submit a brief report of services rendered the town of Castine by the Hancock County Health Service, February 1, 1937, to February 1, 1938.

During April, 1937, all school rooms were visited and the teachers interviewed regarding the Early Diagnosis Tuberculosis Campaign, and posters and pamphlets left with the teachers and in the stores and public places.

Two young children conveyed to the hospital for X-rays of the chest, at the advice of Dr. Babcock, and later returned to their home. Supplied these school children with cod liver oil, which seems to be a benefit to them. A second family also supplied.

During March and April, class room inspections were given, and individual inspection given to those who were absent at the time of the annual inspection in 1937, and check-up of the Seven-Point pupils eligible for the certificate and pins.

In November the annual physical inspection was given to all the pupils of the Castine high, grammar and grade schools, and this year the normal students were included for the first time. The work in the schools has continued much as in the previous year, the routine weighing and measuring, the Snellen's test for vision, the whisper test for hearing, inspection of teeth, throat, head, scalp, for rashes, sores and infectious diseases, and the result of this is as follows:

Pupils who have infected eyelids, 4; defective vision, 6; defective hearing, 1; decayed teeth, 75; abnormal throats, 20; obstruction nose, 8; irregular teeth, 5; defective skin, 1; 10 per cent. or more underweight, 14; 20 per cent. or more overweight, 12; inflamed gums, 1; defective posture, 3; unclean scalps, 2.

Of the 170 pupils inspected, 108 were found with some defect, 62 eligible to qualify as Seven-Point pupils. Of the 75 having decayed teeth, 36 had decay of the temporary, and 47 the permanent teeth, while 9 need prophylactic cleaning of the teeth, or the removal of tartar. It is an old, old story to

every teacher, that a poor student may become one of the best students in the class room when his teeth are repaired. Neglected decayed teeth ruins the health, poor health makes poor students.

As a result of previous inspections, notification slips were sent to the homes, health talks given in the class rooms, school follow-up visits in the homes in the interest of defect corrections. There have been several corrections—5 tonsils and adenoids removed by operation, 6 vision, 3 posture, and 34 dental.

The audiometer, a machine for measuring the hearing, was used in the normal school, 46 taking the test. Five retests were given, two found with hearing loss of 18 per cent. in right ear, the others, 9 per cent. hearing loss in the right ear.

There are many kinds of visits and activities in public health service, necessary, but time-consuming—visits to school children, to tuberculosis, to contact cases, to the chronic, and the shut-ins, to dentists, doctors, hospitals, clinics, to selectmen, seal sale chairmen, and visits of investigation.

The ways and means of financing the service rendered the many towns of Hancock county is through the sale of Christmas seals and by the town appropriation. We wish to express our sincere thanks and appreciation to all the splendid people who have contributed to the work, without which we could not "carry on."
