REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

To the Citizens of Castine:

During the past year the number of books in circulation was 10,262, an increase of 618 over last year. Of this number, 2,005 were non-fiction, an increase of 234. The students of the normal school and the pupils of the town schools use the library for reference work as well as for recretational reading.

The library trustees suggest that any person desiring a book reserved enter his or her name with the librarian on the waiting list, and the book will be put out in the order that the names appear on said list, this being the prevailing custom in most libraries.

Cash deposits were left by Mrs. Brinley, Mrs. Clausing, Miss Balch, Mrs. Faxon and Mrs. Latimer. A gift of \$5 was received from Mrs. Francis Parsons, and \$10 from the Castine Woman's Club.

Notice has been received of a bequest of \$500 for the Mary Hooke fund from the estate of Lucy P. Gay.

The trustees recommend that the following amounts be raised and appropriated: \$66 for maintenance, as there are necessary repairs, and 50 cents per taxable poll for increase.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TRUST FUNDS

In fulfilling the duties for which it was elected, your committee feels that its function is advisory, and consequently makes the following recommendations:

We feel that under the present uncertain business conditions, the town should not continue in the investment field, in so far as cemetery trust funds are concerned. We therefore recommend that the securities in the Robert Gay fund be sold immediately at the present market, and the proceeds deposited in savings accounts insured under Federal Deposit Insurance. The approximate principal of said fund is twenty-three hundred dollars, and the original fund was three thousand dollars, the approximate loss of seven hundred dollars being due to depreciation in the market value of securities. In-as-much as the town has voted in the past to accept trust funds, it would seem that it should make up the principal of this fund to its original figure, and we recommend that the sum of two hundred dollars be appropriated each year for said purpose.

SCHOOL REPORT

To the Citizens of Castine:

This is a combined report of the superintending school committee and the superintendent. Besides the financial data, the committee calls attention to several items in the general program.

As provided for in the repairs appropriation last March, the high school and grade school buildings have been painted, greatly helping the appearance. Mr. Kassay has continued his use of NYA funds in renovating the floors and walls of the high school building at a cost to the town of only the materials used.

The sub-primary program has been introduced as planned this year. In general, the sub-primary allows two years instead of one year for what has been considered "grade one" work—learning to read, learning to write, and some work in numbers.

The contract agreement with the normal school takes care of the financial part of the grade school program. However, it should be constantly borne in mind by the parents that the local committee and the superintendent act jointly with the normal school authorities in conducting the school. Parents have the same rights in this school as they do in any public school.

The employment of the same teachers at the high school for this year saved any interruption in the school work, and the program has gone along very smoothly. New text-books have been provided in several courses and new equipment has been installed in the laboratory. Thanks to contributions from outside sources and money from the State fund, a number of new volumes have been added to the school library. Chief among these is a set of encyclopedia, the World Book.

As evidenced in the 1938 report that they would be, the balances in all the school accounts are small. From the apparent needs of the schools, the committee has considered carefully its recommendations for the coming year. Until some general plan is adopted, it seems unwise to make extensive repairs on the high school building, so that this appropriation has been reduced from \$500 to \$200. The high school account has been brought up to the \$3,700 that has

been the amount usually raised. Other accounts are reduced to the actual amounts needed to cover expected expenditures. The total school appropriation asked for is slightly less than last year.

NURSING REPORT

Herein is submitted a brief report of services rendered the town of Castine by the Hancock County Health Service, February 1, 1938, to February 1, 1939.

The schools of Castine—the high, grammar, training school from the sub-primary to and including the sixth grades, and the Castine normal school—have been visited to check-up on the Seven-Point pupils, and to give individual inspection to pupils who were absent at the time of the 1937 inspection.

During April, 1938, all school rooms were visited and teachers interviewed relative to the Early Diagnosis Tuberculosis Campaign. Isotype charts on tuberculosis were given to the normal school to display to the students, and material in the form of pamphlets and posters was distributed to the class rooms, public places, drug stores, postoffice, stores, and to families who were interested in reading the phamplets. This proved to be a real educational program.

A tuberculin test clinic was held May 23 for all Castine school pupils whose parents had signed the consent slips. Miss Katherine Gay, clinic nurse of the Central Maine Sanatorium, Fairfield, assisted by the county nurse, gave the tuberculin Von Pirquet test to 148 normal, high, grammar and grade pupils, and returned in three days to read the test, On June 1, Miss Gay again returned to Castine with the State portable X-ray machine, installed it at the normal school building, and X-rayed the chests of all reactors and the contact cases, which were found free of tuberculosis germs, a few showing evidence of early childhood infection which had healed. Reports of the findings in each case were sent by the State, to the family physician, and to each patient X-rayed. The expense of the X-ray films was financed through the Maine Public Health Association, and those who preferred to assume the expense themselves.

Consulted Mr. Patterson, selectman, for advice and permission to take a young man from his work for an X-ray when the State had its portable machine at the normal building. This young man is a contact case, his father having died some years ago of T. B.

Conveyed a young man who has been a patient at one of the sanatoriums for several years, but now discharged, to and from his home in Castine to the Central Maine Sanatorium for a six-months' check-up by Dr. Cromwell, and to have an X-ray taken of the chest, which proved very satisfactory.

Conveyed a young student to and from Castine, to the State X-ray clinic in Bar Harbor, October 20, where an X-ray was taken of her chest. December 12 this patient was again taken to the chest clinic in Ellsworth, and there given a thorough physical examination by Dr. Cromwell of the Central Maine Sanatorium, who found condition satisfactory.

Accompanied a patient to and from the dentist's office for extraction of teeth.

The annual physical inspection has been given all pupils of the schools, consisting of the usual routine weighing and measuring, the Snellen's test for vision, the whisper test for hearing, inspection of the teeth, throat, head, scalp, for rashes and sores, postural defects, personal cleanliness, as well as for infectious diseases. Following are the defects found:

Number of pupils who have defective vision, 6; inflamed eyelids, 2; decayed teeth, 53; abnormal throats, 5; obstructed nose, 2; defective posture, 3; defective skin, 1; tongue tie, 1; biting fingernails, 5; 10 per cent or more underweight, 8; 20 per cent or more overweight, 8.

Of the 165 inspected, 80 were found with defects, and 85 eligible for the Seven-Point pin and certificate. Of the 53 having decayed teeth, 28 have decay of the temporary, and 28 of the permanent teeth, while 7 only needed prophylactic cleaning.

The Castine Branch of the Hancock County American Red Cross has sponsored and financed the corrections of dental defects when its funds have been available.

As a result of previous inspection, the follow-up visits to, and the sending home of the notification slips, the following defects have been corrected: Six vision, six tonsils and adenoids, one hearing; two pupils have attained their normal weight for age and health, and fifty dental corrections.

The services rendered the many towns of Hancock county, are financed, through the sale of Christmas Seals, and by the town appropriations. We express our sincere thanks and appreciation to all who have in any way assisted in the service.
