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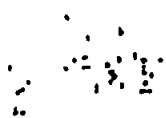

Superintending School Committee.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Newcastle:

Gentlemen:

The approach of the season for the annual town meeting necessitates a survey of the conditions, needs, and progress of our school system. The year has been marked by improvement in nearly every school. In general costs have not decreased; but your school committee has economized on expense whenever possible consistent with good service. In this regard the question is not "How little money will it cost;" but rather, "What service will it give?"

TEACHERS

Fortunately many of our former teachers returned in their respective schools: Miss Julia E. Barker to the Grammar school; Leona Giles to the primary school; Edna Waltz to South Newcastle; and Delia Hale to Damariscotta Mills. Miss Lurie Glidden is continuing the work of Miss Winifred Wood who resigned as teacher of the Edison school to accept a fine position in one of the larger cities. Mrs. Ida Bartlett accepted the position made vacant by the resignation of Marion Kennedy; at Sheepscot Elinor Mahan replaces Helen Reed who resigned. Our teachers have been loyal and faithful to their trust. To them—

their sympathy, skill and understanding—we are indebted for our progress. It is not too much to say “The contribution which they make to human welfare is beyond estimation.”

REPAIRS AND SANITATION

In keeping with the usual custom repairs have been made with a view to protect the school building from weathering and improve the housing conditions. The following are the most important undertakings: Painting walls of the Grammar school building; painting at Sheepscot; the building of a sanitary toilet at South Newcastle. It is mandatory according to Chapter 33, sec. 2 of the School Law that every school building be supplied with sanitary toilet before Sept. 1, 1927. These have been provided for all school buildings except those at Pond Road and Damariscotta Mills. This brings us face-to-face with the advisability of eventually closing the Mills School and conveying where necessary, to the village school. It seems probable that while no great saving in instruction cost will be thus effected such action would relieve the town of an immediate expense of nearly \$500 which would be required if a sanitary toilet is built at Damariscotta Mills. In connection with consolidation there is much to be said pro and con aside from general advantages that would arrive it seems an unnecessary burden to ask the tax payers to provide for such a large expenditure as the repairs at the Mills school will necessitate if that school is continued. It will be necessary to build such a toilet at Pond Road and other general repairs are also much needed at this building.

SECONDARY EDUCATION

It is encouraging to learn that the progress of our schools has begun to reflect in the improved standing

of the pupils from Newcastle at Lincoln Academy. During recent years there has been not only fewer failures among those pupils coming from our schools but also a marked improvement in the preparation in case of a large proportion of those entering. The results of a state-wide survey made by the Educational Department of Augusta shows that Lincoln Academy occupies a high position in comparison with the other secondary schools of the state. The graduates from Lincoln Academy enrolled in our state colleges and at the University of Maine have demonstrated the excellence of their training by the high standard that they have maintained in their courses.

TEXT BOOKS AND SUPPLIES

A special appropriation was allowed for supplies for the first time this year. Under this heading we purchase a limited amounts paper, maps, busy-work and miscellaneous needs. The regular supplies such as chalk, erasers, oil, janitor supplies, rent for water and light are also included in this appropriation. With the text book allowance we purchased enough new books to fill the most urgent calls from teachers for replacement of old and worn-out books. Probably there is no department of school work where greater improvement is being made than in the preparation of new school texts. Our supply is still short of our requirements although the books are in better shape than in former years. After the demand for the books used as basic texts is supplied we hope to furnish the necessary supplementary books for reading, history, and geography; and in addition to this some of the reference books that are most urgently needed.

Almost without exception citizens and town officials have encouraged and assisted us in our undertaking to bring about such improvements as are possible with

the funds available. To the members of the School Committee I am greatly indebted for guidance and support. We are unusually fortunate in having among us a large number of citizens who take a great interest in the welfare of our schools even though they have no pupils of their own. Such a broad view, in my opinion, represents the ideal for the promotion of public spirit and community advancement.

TOWN WARRANT

To A. B. Gilpatrick, a Constable of the Town of Newcastle: Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Newcastle qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble in Oliver's Hall, in said town on the 21st day of March, A. D. 1927 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

ART. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2 To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

ART. 3 To act on report of the Auditor.

ART. 4 To choose Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of Poor and Fish Committee for ensuing year.

ART. 5 To choose a Treasurer for ensuing year.

ART. 6 To choose one member of School Committee to act for three years.

ART. 7 To see what method the town will adopt for the collection of taxes and fix compensation for same.

ART. 8 To choose a collector of taxes for ensuing year.

ART. 9 To choose an Auditor for ensuing year.

ART. 10 To choose two members of the Cemetery Association trustees,, one for two and one for three years.

ART. 11 To see if the town will vote to elect one, or three Road Commissioners, or leave to Selectmen to appoint.

ART. 12 To see if the town will vote the sum of \$500 for a Sinking Fund for ensuing year.

ART. 13 To see what sum of money the town will vote and appropriate for Highways for the ensuing year.

ART. 14 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars to apply on Academy street as recommended by Committee on Appropriations.

ART. 15 To see if the town will raise and appropriate one hundred and fifty dollars for repairs of Main street from Genthner's Corner toward Railroad, as recommended by Committee.

ART. 16 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine hundred dollars for Concrete Sidewalks as recommended by Committee on Appropriations.

ART. 17 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars for Plank Sidewalks repairs.

ART. 18 To see if the town will vote to raise and

appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars for repair of Bridges.

ART. 19 To see if the town will vote Yes or No on raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 130 Public laws of 1913 and amendments.

ART. 20 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred thirty-three dollars for State Aid Highways under provisions of Section 130 of Public Laws of 1913 and amendments.

ART. 21 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to grade and gravel the road leading from the State Highway to So. Newcastle Station, as petitioned for by B. L. Merry and seven others, voters of town.

ART. 22 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars to be expended for repair of West Hamlet and Kavanagh roads as petitioned for by A. B. Smith and eight others, voters of town.

ART. 23 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred dollars for Snow Bills, as recommended by Committee.

ART. 24 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty-eight hundred dollars for Common Schools for ensuing year.

ART. 25 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four thousand dollars for Secondary Schools for ensuing year.

ART. 26 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars for repairs on School Houses for ensuing year.

ART. 27 To see if the town will vote to continue schools in Sheepsct Village, So. Newcastle and Damariscotta Mills. These schools not having the necessary average attendance required by law.

ART. 28 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars for School Text Books and Supplies for ensuing year.

ART. 29 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars for Sanitary Closet for ensuing year.

ART. 30 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars for Support of Poor for ensuing year.

ART. 31 To see if the town will vote the sum of four hundred dollars for interest on town notes for ensuing year.

ART. 32 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars for Free Library for ensuing year.

ART. 33 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars for Taniscot Engine Co. for ensuing year.

ART. 34 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for repair and

shingling Engine House as recommended by Committee.

ART. 35 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars for Street Lights for ensuing year.

ART. 36 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of thirty-five dollars for R. Wells Post Am. Legion.

ART. 37 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for Town Officers and expenses for ensuing year.

ART. 38 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars for Incidental expenses for ensuing year.

ART. 39 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars for State Aid Patrol for ensuing year.

ART. 40 To see if the town will vote to keep Sidewalks clear of snow and raise a sum of money to meet expense for ensuing year.

ART. 41 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for further fire protection.

ART. 42 To see if the town will vote a sum of money to erect an iron fence in front of School House in District No. 6 to protect children from highway traffic, petition by J. B. Shattuck and seventeen others, voters of town.

ART. 43 To see if the town will vote to raise and

appropriate a sum of money to make new valuation of taxable property in town.

ART. 44 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars, to apply on Sheepscot Road, continuation of 1926 work, petition of F. I. Carney and others.

ART. 45 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to be used on Ridge Road jointly with State Special Resolve of five hundred dollars, extension of 1926 work.

ART. 46 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars for use of Maine Development Ass'n.

ART. 47 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to buy gravel pit of C. Wesley Erskine, located near highway at No. Newcastle.

ART. 48 To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to pay a sum of money, not exceeding fifty dollars from Incidental Account for expense of Concerts by Twin Village Concert Band.

ART. 49 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow sums of money as are necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

ART. 50 To choose all other necessary town officers.
