SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Newcastle:

During the last school term which closed in December 1928 the teachers of our seven elementary schools had enrolled a total of 139 pupils. The distribution of the pupils was as follows:

\*Undoubtedly the average attendance of the Beech Hill school at South Newcastle will fall below eight for the school year ending June, 1929. The town should make a special vote to continue this school as recommended by the Superintending School Committee.

As the number of pupils who would have attended the River Road school at the beginning of the fall term was greatly reduced as compared to the previous year, the school committee decided that it would be much

more satisfactory to convey these children to the village school. As indicated in the foregoing tabulation we had a total of 43 enrolled in the grammar school which was more than the room was built to accommodate. Although the necessary additional seats were installed the overcrowded condition is not altogether favorable from the standpoint of health and educational requirements.

While our village school is crowded at the present time, it would seem that a few of these pupils come from families that do not expect to remain here permanently. We are pleased to know that the educational facilities at Lincoln Academy and of our own elementary schools are sufficiently attractive as to draw families from other towns to come here for educational privileges. However, it is true that this very situation occasions considerable extra expense to the town for secondary school tuition and some decrease in effectiveness of our elementary school system that results from this influx of these somewhat transitory pupils.

### PREVENTATIVE HEALTH MEASURES

It is a pleasure to record that we have had very helpful cooperation from parents and teachers in preventing the spread of contagious diseases by the exclusion from school of pupils who have been exposed or whose condition indicates suspicious symptoms. According to the state law relating to health measures it is the duty of teachers to exclude from school any pupil who shows signs of a common cold, cough, or other indications when an infectious disease is prevalent or present in the community.

The health conditions of the year have been unusual because of the large number of infectious diseases that have been reported. We have had influenza, scarlet

fever, and smallpox. As a result of this condition the greatest care has been necessary to protect the boys and girls of the schools. In this most important undertaking we have been fortunate in having the support and guidance of the District Health Physician, Dr. J. W. Loughlin.

The enrollment of tuition pupils from Newcastle at Lincoln Academy increased from forty-six for the previous year to fifty-six for the fall term of the present school year. The increase in cost for secondary school tuition for the school year will be approximately \$750.00 or a total cost of \$4,200.00. Considering the excellent service that is being given at Lincoln Academy, I believe that you will agree that this expenditure is a good investment. We are fortunate to have good

secondary school service available and such a large proportion of pupils who are eager to take advantage of the secondary school privilege that is provided.

### CONCLUSION

In closing, I wish to acknowledge the helpful cooperation on the part of the Municipal Officers, Teachers, and Parents of Newcastle. To the Members of the Superintending School Committee, especially I am indebted for guidance and assistance. The support of the Citizens has greatly encouraged us in the undertaking to make possible a better educational opportunity for your children.

## WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

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To F. M. DECKER, a Constable of the Town of Newcastle, County of Lincoln and State of Maine:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Newcastle, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble in Oliver's Hall, in said town on the 18th day of March A. D. 1929 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

ART. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2 To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

ART. 3 To act on the report of the Auditor.

ART. 4 To choose Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, and Fish Committee for the ensuing year.

ART. 5 To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

ART. 6 To choose one member of Cemetery Trustees for three years.

ART. 7 To choose one member of School Committee for three years.

ART. 8 To see what method the Town will adopt for the collection of taxes and fix compensation for same.

ART. 9 To choose a Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year.

ART. 10 To choose an Auditor for the ensuing year.

ART. 11 To see if the town will vote to elect one or three Road Commissioners or leave with the Selectmen to appoint.

ART. 12 To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$4,000 00 for general highway repairs.

ART. 13 To see if the town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$500 00 for concrete sidewalks in village location left with Selectmen.

ART. 14 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 00 for repair of plank sidewalks.

ART. 15 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 00 for snow bills for ensuing year.

ART. 16 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 00 for Bridge repairs for the ensuing year.

ART. 17 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 00 for State Aid Highway Patrol.

ART. 18 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 00 for Common Schools, Text Books and Supplies as asked for by the S. S. Committee as recommended by Budget Committee.

ART. 19 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500 00 for Secondary Schools as recommended by committee on appropriations.

ART. 20 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 00 for Schoolhouse repairs as recommended by committee.

ART. 21 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 00 for maintenance of Poor and Insane as recommended by committee.

ART. 22 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600 00 for interest on notes and loans for ensuing year.

ART. 23 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 00 for Free Library.

ART. 24 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 00 for maintenance of Newcastle Fire Company, approved by committee.

ART. 25 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 00 for additional suction hose for Pumper approved by committee.

ART. 26 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 00 for Street Lights for ensuing year.

ART. 27 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 00 for clearing the State Aid and Third Aid Highways of bushes and rubbish.

ART. 28 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 00 for tarring Main Street.

ART. 29 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35 00 for Richard R. Wells Post, American Legion.

ART. 30 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 00 for Town Officers the ensuing year.

ART. 31 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 00 for incidental expenses for the ensuing year.

ART. 32 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 00 for discount on taxes.

ART. 33 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 00 to help in controlling White Pine Blister Rust.

ART. 34 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 00 to match State Department of Health Funds for support of County Public health nursing, to continue work with mothers and children.

ART. 35 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,665 00 or such sum as may be necessary to entitle the town to State Aid under the 5 to 1 Act under Ch. 25 Sec. 21 of Revised Statutes.

ART. 36 To see if the town will vote 'yes' or 'no' on raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid under provisions of section 130 P. L. of 1913 and amendments.

ART. 37 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$533 00 for State Aid Highway under the provision of section 130 P. L. of 1913 and amendments entitling town to State Aid.

ART. 38 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 00 for Sinking Fund for ensuing year.

ART. 39 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 00 to be expended on the road leading from the Trunk Line to South Newcastle Station as petitioned for by Alton J. Smith and fourteen other voters of town.

ART. 40 To see if the town will vote to build the remaining part of the River Road in 1929, and to let contract for same.

ART. 41 To see what sum of money the town will appropriate to cover cost of Art. 40 and see what method will be used for raising this money on petition of N. J. Francis and ten other voters of the town.

ART. 42 To see if the town will vote to accept Fish Screen as put in at foot of Damariscotta-Pond by the State, to prevent salmon from going out.

ART. 43 To see if the town will vote to pay \$7 00 per day for man and a pair of horses working on

highways in town, on petition of J. S. Conover and sixteen other taxpayers and voters of the town.

ART. 44 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 00 to apply on Ridge Road in addition to \$500 00, special resolve of the Legislature.

ART. 45 To see if the town will vote to authorize Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

ART. 46 To see if the town will vote to continue school in District No. 7, South Newcastle, as recommended by S. S. Committee.

ART. 47 To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to secure by lease, purchase or condemnation, one or more suitable locations for reservoirs for the storage of water for fire protection, and construct such reservoirs.

ART. 48 To see if the town will raise the sum of one thousand dollars for the purposes of securing sites for reservoirs and constructing the same on petition of Geo. W. Singer and thirteen other voters of town.

ART. 49 To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

ART. 50 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
