SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Newcastle:

The annual report of the condition and progress of our schools is herewith submitted for your consideration. While in taking stock, so to speak, we find many needs pressing for attention, yet we can feel an assurance that our schools are making progress towards a higher standard.

SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

With the opening of the fall term (1932) the teaching force and enrollment was as follows:

For a number of years our elementary school enrollment has shown a gradual but constant increase. We find that the number of elementary pupils increased from 138 for the school year 1929-30 to 178 for the present year. In the meantime, the number of secondary pupils increased from 46 for the school year 1930-31 to 53 for the school year 1932-33. The town is now furnishing elementary and secondary school privileges to 231 school pupils as compared to 184 pupils three years ago. We can expect another big increase in the number of tuition pupils at Lincoln Academy next year. Only eight pupils are expected to complete the work at the Academy, while nineteen of our eighth grade pupils may be promoted. It would seem that our secondary school tuition expense may be increased at least \$600.00.

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING SERVICE

"The State School Nurse has inspected the school children. Of the 131 children inspected 110 had defects. Twelve were underweight; seven had defective vision, five had defective hearing; 107 needed dental care; five had nasal defects; three had enlarged glands; 28 at time of inspection had abnormal conditions of throat; three had skin conditions; two had pediculosis; making a total of 172 defects, some children having two or more defects.

Forty corrections had been reported by January 1, as follows: One child had gained in weight; seven had had defects of vision corrected; twenty had teeth repaired; five children had operations for tonsils and adenoids; two more had throats treated. Home visits were made to explain to parents the nature of defects found and to urge corrections. Arrangements were made for financing corrective work which could not otherwise have been possible. Time still remains for further work which will be done before the close of the school year. The success of this school work depends largely upon the cooperation of parents in securing medical advice and treatment for conditions found at time of inspection. Last year you appropriated \$116.00. This year we are asking for \$58.00." (The foregoing is a report of the State Director, Division of Public Health Nursing.)

STATE SCHOOL FUND

For the present fiscal year our State School Fund was \$2693.12. This is more than is usually received from this source. However, since a considerable part of our school budget is made up from this fund, we should not overlook the fact that, in the future, this State allowance will be reduced. In this connection the Commissioner of Education has stated: "The apportionment of the State School Fund in December 1933, as compared with December 1932, will entail a shrinkage of approximately 18-20%. You may safely reckon that your State School Fund apportionment will be reduced this amount. In order to be in the same position as to school funds for the next fiscal year that you were for the past fiscal year, it will be necessary to add this amount to appropriations

at the annual March meetings. Probably in many instances this will be difficult to accomplish, but in the preparation of your budget you will need to take into careful consideration this reduction in the State School Fund."

EDUCATIONAL STANDARDS

Undoubtedly under these trying conditions, not expansion, but rather curtailment of school budgets, when possible without weakening the educational system, is in order. Commissioner Packard of the State Department of Education has stated this policy in his recent report. "It is our duty in every way possible to economically and wisely administer our school systems, but it is unthinkable that our citizens would permit lowered standards of educational opportunity for their children. Public education is the cornerstone upon which our democracy is established. No type of self-government can exceed in excellence the general character and intelligence of its citizens. Education plays here an essential part in furnishing a type of citizenship which will guarantee a high standard of democratic government.

To teachers, municipal officers, and citizens, I also wish to express my appreciation for their very helpful cooperation. In closing, I wish to urge all parents and citizens to visit our schools.
