REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Newcastle:

The annual report of the condition and progress of your schools for the fiscal year is herewith submitted.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STATISTICS

The best of plans must fail unless they are directed by teachers who have enthusiastic faith in their ultimate success. The efficiency of the public school system rests chiefly on the teachers. It has been said that teachers should count that day lost on which they do not gain some insight into their pupils' mental processes. It is a pleasure to speak of the splendid professional attitude that has been so general among our teachers, during the last year.

SCHOOL CONSOLIDATION

Pursuant to Chapter 19, Sec. 2, Revised Statutes, the school committee closed the South Newcastle school at the end of the school year ending June, 1934. This

school was suspended because it failed to maintain an average attendance of at least eight pupils for the last school year. At the present time eight pupils are conveyed from this school district to the Edison school. As indicated in the foregoing tabulation, thirty-three pupils enrolled at the Edison school during the fall term. This consolidation makes a total of three schools that have been suspended during recent years—including the schools formerly maintained in the Damariscotta Mills, and River Road district.

SCHOOL EQUALIZATION FUND

The annual allotment of the State Fund has been greatly reduced for all towns in recent years. This reduction has materially added to the burden of the towns for the maintenance of the schools. Since October, 1933, the Public School Finance Commission has been working on a new equalization plan to be presented to the 87th Legislature for consideration. Whether or not citizens fully approve of the report and findings of this Commission, all have been given the opportunity to study the problem. In connection with this question, Commissioner B. E. Packard has quoted Dr. Luther Gulick in part as follows:

“This entire system of aid for public and quasi public educational institutions is obviously a hodge podge with no consistent underlying idea. The basic purpose of state aid is to guarantee to every child in the state a standard public school education without placing a disproportionate tax burden upon the poor as against the rich communities. After this comes the natural desire to encourage the improvement of schools in all sections of the state. . . . The cure of this condition is a matter of major importance of the state of Maine.”

EXPENDITURES FOR SCHOOLS

The recommendation for common schools made by your School Committee for the coming town meeting is \$3,500.00 as compared to the appropriation of \$6,000.00 for common schools in 1932. This is a reduction of over 40%. In the meantime the enrolment in the elementary schools and the requirements for conveyance for school pupils who live in remote sections have increased to a marked extent.

The question has been raised as to the per capita cost of the schools for elementary school pupils. Newcastle now offers elementary school privileges to approximately 190 pupils; employs seven teachers and five part time janitors; conveys a total of forty-five pupils on six different routes; and furnishes water, fuel, books, and supplies at an annual cost of approximately \$35.00 per capita. At the present time the enrolment is the largest that it has been for years.

INSURANCE AND REPAIRS

These accounts include expenses for the repairs of buildings, grounds, purchase of equipment, insurance on school buildings, and conveyance vehicles. Repairs, care and custody of school buildings and insurance are functions that devolve upon the Superintending School Committee.

GREETING:

ART. 8 To choose a Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year.

ART 9 To choose one member of the School Committee for three years.

ART. 10 To chose one member of Cemetery Trustees for three years.

ART. 11 To see if the Town will vote to elect one or three Road Commissioners or leave with the Selectmen to act or appoint.

ART. 12 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for Common Schools, to include Text Books and Supplies, as recommended by Committee.

ART. 13 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for Secondary Schools as recommended by Committee.

ART. 14 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 00 for School Repairs for the ensuing year as recommended by the Committee.

ART. 15 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for Insurance for the ensuing year, as recommended by Committee.

ART. 16 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for repair of Common Roads for the ensuing year; and fix the price of labor.

ART. 17 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for repair of Bridges, for the ensuing year.

ART. 18 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for snow removal for the ensuing year.

ART. 19 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$585.00 for Patrol Service for the ensuing year, on State and State Aid Highways.

ART. 20 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$518.00 for maintenance on Third Class Highways, this being the amount asked for by the State Highway Commission.

ART. 21 To see if the Town will vote Yes or No on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid, as provided in Section 20, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 22 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$533.00 in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highways and Bridges under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 23 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for cutting bushes and weeds on State and State Aid Highways under provisions of Section 44 and 46, Chapter 28, R. S. 1930 as amended by Section 4 and 5 of Chapter 175 of Public Laws 1933.

ART. 24 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for repair of Sidewalks for ensuing year.

ART. 25 To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Support of Poor for ensuing year, \$2,000.00 being recommended by Committee.

ART. 26 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$894.00 for Street Lights for ensuing year.

ART. 27 To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Tarring Streets for ensuing year.

ART. 28 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Newcastle Fire Company for ensuing year.

ART. 29 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for Mothers' Aid Department of Public Welfare.

ART. 30 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Free Library in Damariscotta.

ART. 31 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 for Library at Damariscotta Mills.

ART. 32 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$58.00 for School Nursing under the auspices of the Bureau of Health and Welfare.

ART. 33 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for Discount on Taxes for ensuing year.

ART. 34 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 for Town Officers for ensuing year.

ART. 35 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for Incidental Expenses for ensuing year.

ART. 36 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for interest on Town Notes for ensuing year.

ART. 37 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Sinking Fund for ensuing year.

ART. 38 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Special Resolve Road in anticipation of money received from the State for Road Construction.

ART. 39 To see what sum if any, the Town would recommend to take from the Joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying Bituminous surface treatment to State Aid roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, P. L. 1931.

ART. 40 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of Taxes.

ART. 41 To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to refuse to issue or renew licenses to any person, persons or organization to sell Beer, Rum,

Gin, Whiskey or any other beverage which contains alcohol as per petition of C. A. Bates and seventeen other voters of this Town.

ART. 42 To see if the Town will vote to purchase an outfit for Snow Removal for the Town, as the present method of letting the work out is too expensive and otherwise unsatisfactory.

ART. 43 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the old Town House lot on the Sheepscot Road, as there are interested parties who would like to purchase it.

ART. 44 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the benefit of Twin Village Band, as per Elmer F. Waning, Manager.

ART. 45 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to build an approach from Glidden Street to the river for fire protection.

ART. 46 To see if the Town will instruct the Selectmen to direct an action of debt to be commenced in the name of the Inhabitants of the Town, against all delinquent tax payers, pursuant to the provisions of the Revised Statutes of Maine, Chapter 14, Section 64.

ART. 47 To see if the Town will instruct the Overseers of the Poor to set to work all idle persons, having a settlement in the Town, over twenty-one years of age and able bodied, who may receive aid from the Town, pursuant to Revised Statutes of Maine, Chapter 33, Section 20, and for that purpose to secure a wood lot either by purchase or lease.

ART. 48 To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for the purpose of the foregoing article.

ART. 49 To see if the Town will instruct the Selectmen to make it a part of all contracts with persons laboring upon the highways, or upon the school payroll, to deduct not more than thirty-five percent, from the amount of any Town order or check given them for such service, to be credited on their delinquent or current taxes.

ART. 50 To see if the Town will instruct the Selectmen to make diligent inquiry into the financial standing of all persons applying for aid from the Town, and, if found of sufficient ability to pay, to bring an action to recover any aid so supplied.

ART. 51 To see if the Town will vote to issue bonds not in excess of \$20,000.00 maturing serially commencing one year from date thereof, and bearing a rate of interest not exceeding 4%, for the purpose of funding existing indebtedness of the Town, and authorize the Selectmen to execute and sell such bonds.

ART. 52 To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 to be expended by the Board of Trade for advancing the interests of the Town of Newcastle, in advertising for publicity.

ART. 53 To see if the Town will vote to give the State one half of the Excise Tax in exchange for the use of the Carlton Bridge.

ART. 54 To see what action the Town will take relative to taking over the Fish House at the Fish Stream from Arthur E. Nickerson, including Spouts,

Tools, Horses, Lumber, etc., the award being \$800.00 appraised by the Arbitrators, this article was tabled at our last annual meeting, and was to be reported at our annual meeting in 1935.

ART. 55 To see if the Town will vote to elect a budget committee, consisting of nine citizens, at the annual town meeting of 1935: three to be elected for a term of three years, three to be elected for a term of two years, and three to be elected for a term of one year, and, at each succeeding annual town meeting thereafter to fill any unexpired terms in said committee, and to elect successors to those who terms expire for a period of three years.

ART. 56 To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Treasurer to sell all Tax Deeds where the right of redemption has expired, and to execute a Deed of Release in behalf of the Town.

ART. 57 To elect all other necessary Town Officers.

ART. 58 To transact any othr business that may legally come before said meeting.
