REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and
Citizens of the Town of Newcastle:

In accordance with the requirements the annual report of the schools is herewith submitted for your consideration. The following tabulation indicates the school enrollment for the fall term, 1935.

As the tabulation shows, there was but one change in the teaching personnel during the fiscal year. Over a period of years our school enrollment has consequently increased. In 1929 - 30 only 138 pupils enrolled in the elementary schools as compared with 185 enrolled this year. The number of secondary school tuition pupils have increased from 46 in 1930 to 53. Elementary and secondary school privileges are being furnished to 240 pupils at the present time. A further increase of secondary school tuition pupils is anticipated next year. There are 19 pupils in grade 8 who may enter

Lincoln Academy, while only eleven seniors are expected to complete the work at that institution.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT

The State Department of Health, through the district physician, Dr. J. W. Loughlin and the local health officer, Mr. Arthur Stetson, has rendered effective service in the control of infectious and contagious diseases. This Department is active locally and throughout the state in making it possible to offer corrective treatment to children who are physically handicapped.

STATE EQUALIZATION REFUND

Up-to-date sets of reference books are now available to the pupils in all of the schools. Purchases have been made from the state refund of \$224.00 that was granted to Newcastle for library books in the elementary schools. This year another grant of \$168.00 has been made to Newcastle by the state for the purpose of lengthening the school year and maintenance of teacher's salaries. These allotments of special aid from the state are refunded for special purposes and must be expended according to recommendation of the Commissioner of Education.

REPAIRS ON SCHOOL BUILDINGS

Through the interest and activity of your Superintending School Committee and Board of Selectmen a number of improvements were made on several of the school buildings through labor furnished without cost to the town by Federal Funds. While

the labor for this work was contributed by the Government, it was necessary to provide the material required from the repairs account. These E. R. A. projects for school building improvements were carried out under efficient management, and have added to the attractiveness and utility of the school sites and buildings in several districts.

PROGRAM OF BASIC READING

As a result of trial and consideration of different modern systems of reading, the Gates-Huber-Ayer system has been introduced as a basic course for beginners. Teachers report that this program of reading is effective, and helps to develop the many skills essential to accurate and complete comprehension in recreational and informative reading; and to create desirable attitudes and interests of the pupils. It has been said that reading is the key to all other subjects. In view of the fact that it was necessary to purchase new readers and work books of some kind to replace

and supplement the used books on hand, the additional cost for this up-to-date system of reading will be small. The teachers are enthusiastic in the improvement of the pupils' reading during the short time that this new technique of teaching has been in use.

CONCLUSION

The Three R's are not the end-all of the elementary school, but they are basic to the real structure of education. The teacher who knows that her job is to assist some children to read, to write, to add, subtract, multiply and divide, to tell the truth, to respect the rights and property of others has always conducted a progressive school.

It is a pleasure to speak of the splendid professional attitude of our teachers. 1935 marked the tenth consecutive year that the teachers of School Union No. 74 have maintained 100% membership in the Maine Teachers' Association. In recognition of this evidence of professional spirit a letter of appreciation has been received from the state secretary.

Much credit is due to the members of your superintending school committee for their unfailing assistance and guidance. In closing I wish to express sincere appreciation for the cooperation given by your municipal officers, teachers, and citizens.

GREETING:
