# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The annual report of the school department for the fiscal year ending February, 1939, is hereby submitted in accordance with the requirements:

#### ELEMENTARY ENROLLMENT

The following tabulation indicates the assignment of teachers and registration of pupils for the beginning of the fall term, 1938:

During January arrangements were made to have the State Rural Agent visit each of our schools. These visits were followed by a teachers' meeting where special problems relating to the schedule of classes and teaching methods were discussed by this specialist in education. Methods of control of communicable diseases and cooperative duties of teachers with the health officers were outlined by Dr. J. W. Loughlin. Several of our teachers have undertaken, voluntarily, special school projects, such as, coping-saw carpentry, paper handicraft, improving the conditions in the classrooms, and utilizing the special school traveling libraries of the Maine State Library to supplement the study of reading and literature.

The educational standards are being increased from time to time, both by new laws and special rulings of the Department of Education. Minimum requirements for the first teaching certificate have been increased from attendance at a single summer session in our normal schools required in 1925 to two full years of normal school attendance now demanded. consideration of the needs for teaching materials we should have several new sets of maps. According to the recommendation of the State Commissioner of Education expenditures for text books and reference sets should annually equal about \$2.50 for each pupil enrolled. Pursuant to the school laws the usual recommendation of \$15 is suggested for maintenance of flags and flagstaffs for the schools. The enrollment at the Pond Road School has now been reduced to eight pu-Newcastle provides elementary school privileges for over 150 pupils; employs seven teachers; furnishes conveyance service to four school buildings; supplies fuel, text books and supplies. In spite of the large area of the town and the distribution of the school communities, these services are provided by your school committee at approximately the average tax rate for school purposes of all the towns of Maine.

#### TEACHERS' SALARIES

Because of the date of the closing of the town books the expenditures for the fiscal year cover a period of only thirty-four weeks. Following is a tabulation of the amount paid to each teacher for this period:

#### REPAIRS ACCOUNT

The Repairs Account must be charged with all expenditures for apparatus and equipment used in connection with the schools, such as permanent maps, chairs, desks, stoves and furnaces, janitor equipment, in addition to the ordinary expenses for general repairs and construction on school buildings and grounds. Your Superintending School Committee has carefully checked each item in the recommendation for repairs; also items in the recommendations for the general school accounts, including secondary school tuition, property and transportation insurance coverage, conveyance of pupils, teaching materials, janitor service, water, lights, teachers' salaries, flags, and fuel.

It is a pleasure to take this opportunity to urge parents and citizens to visit their schools. It has been said that parents and teachers are 50-50 partners in the school life of the child. Grateful acknowledgment is made for the many valuable suggestions and assistance of your Superintending School Committee. The co-operation of the Municipal Officers, Teachers, and Citizens is greatly appreciated.

ART. 12 To see if the Town will vote to raise \$70.00 for District School Nursing, as recommended by State Department of Health & Welfare.

- ART. 13 To see what sum, if any, the Town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid Account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads, in excess of the requirements of Sec. 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1935.
- ART. 14 To see if the Town will instruct the Selectmen and Road Commissioners to make it a part of all contracts with persons laboring upon the Highways or School Payrolls, to deduct not more than thirty-five percent from the amount of any Town Order or Check given them for such service, to be credited on their delinquent or current taxes.
- ART. 15 To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Fish Committee to enter into a contract with some reliable party, for a term of one or more years, for the sale of surplus Alewives at the Fish Stream, in conjunction with the Town of Nobleboro.
- ART. 16 To see if the Town will vote to elect three members of Budget Committee for three years.
- ART. 17 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money, as may be necessary to pay current expenses, in anticipation of taxes.
