Dear Students,

We are writing to check in with you and share a few important messages.

- 1. You should have received an email yesterday from Student Records regarding the Pass/Fail Spring 2020 Protocol. Please read it carefully. Before you decide to switch a course(s) to pass/fail, please reach out to your academic advisor or undergraduate program coordinator to ensure the Pass/Fail option will not impact your academic program, financial aid, or future goals. Requests can be made between April 10-May 1. This action is final. You may want to wait until you have collected all information related to Pass/Fail before taking action.
- 2. The course drop deadline has been extended to May 1. This is the last day to drop a class and receive a W grade on your transcript. If you are struggling with a class, consider waiting until closer to May 1 and drop the course if needed to avoid receiving an F on your transcript.
- 3. Peer Mentor program: If you are having a hard time with the remote learning format or time management, our student peer mentors would love to help you! Please contact us at nsfaacademics@maine.edu or 581-3206 for more information.
- 4. You should also know that the Counseling Center is available to meet with ALL students via Zoom or telephone, even if you aren't in Maine.
