Dear Friends of Stockton Springs:

It has been a privilege to serve the State of Maine since being sworn into the U.S. Senate.

Much of my time in Washington this past year has been devoted to the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Select Committee on Intelligence. Protecting our homeland and the people of Maine from terrorism and violence remains one of my top priorities. Through my work on the Armed Services Committee, I was able to secure several provisions in the 2016 National Defense Authorization Act that benefit Maine. The legislation authorizes the construction of an additional DDG-51 Arleigh Burke Class Destroyer that could be built at Bath Iron Works and expands the HUBZone program to stimulate economic growth at former military installations like the former Brunswick Naval Air Station.

Returning control to teachers, school districts, and states has also been a primary concern of mine. I am encouraged that the Every Student Succeeds Act has become law. It eliminates the burdensome requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act and ensures access to a quality education for all students. A provision I helped author in the bill will give states the opportunity to pilot the use of their own proficiency-based assessments in lieu of federally-mandated standardized tests. Also included in the bill are several measures I secured to promote local input, fund education technology initiatives, and explore new strategies to increase student access to the internet outside of school.

Communities across Maine have taken bold action to improve their broadband connectivity, and I have been proud to foster federal support for these types of projects. My amendments to the Every Student Succeeds Act will promote the type of work already occurring in Washington County, where students who lack broadband access are able to check out mobile hotspots from their local libraries. Additionally, a bill I co-sponsored, the Community Broadband Act, helped pave the way for the FCC to enact rules protecting the ability of municipalities to invest in better broadband. I am excited by Maine's leadership on this important economic development issue and will continue to support local efforts in this area.

After extensive negotiations, the Senate passed a five-year transportation bill that will increase highway and transit funding in Maine and provide stability to improve our transportation infrastructure. The legislation contains provisions I cosponsored to cut red tape and improve predictability and timeliness by streamlining the federal permitting process for large infrastructure projects. Also incorporated in this bill are my provisions to relieve financial regulations on Maine's community banks and credit unions and to reauthorize the Export-Import Bank, a critical tool that supports communities and small business across the state.

Following my inquiries in the Energy and Natural Resources Committee, the National Park Service has announced they will begin exploring strategies to allow park visitors to purchase electronic passes online and will pilot the program at Acadia National Park. These passes would improve access to our nation's most treasured landscapes and would generate resources for years to come. I remain deeply engaged in preserving Maine's natural beauty and strengthening our outdoor recreation economy.

It is with solemn responsibility that I have focused my energy addressing the opioid epidemic in Maine. This work includes convening roundtables with a wide-range of health care and law enforcement professionals to combat addiction; introducing a proposal to safely dispose of excess prescription drugs; cosponsoring a

Senate-passed bill that addresses mothers struggling with addiction and the alarming effect it has on newborns; cosponsoring the TREAT Act, which expands the ability of medical specialists to provide life-saving medication-assisted therapies for patients battling heroin and prescription drug addiction; and calling on the Commander of U.S. Southern Command to increase efforts to stop the flow of heroin at our southern border.

I like to think of Maine as a big small town – and in a small town, the leaders are accessible and eager to listen. In that spirit, I've made it a priority to stay connected with people from all over Maine who e-mail, write, and call with suggestions or questions. 

In the Waldo County Probate Court, we address family matters such as guardianships (for both minors and adults), adoptions, name changes and wills and trusts.

As for this year's probate court news, we are happy to report that in the many contested family matters in this court. We continue to offer and find that our mediation program helps families develop their own skills at solving family problems. We also believe that these mediation opportunities serve to reduce disputes within families.

As a reminder, each fall, I also continue offer free probate basics workshops in town halls, adult education centers and libraries. At these, I provide free legal forms for medical and financial powers of attorney and wills. By then explaining the various legal provisions on these legal document forms, I try to help all understand how we use these documents to state our wishes. I truly believe that in documenting our wishes, in turn, we also greatly help our loved ones know what our wishes are. As for workshop times and places for my next series of these free probate basics workshops, come fall, simply watch for the times, dates and places posted in our local newspapers. Come one. ## ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE STOCKTON SPRINGS SELECT BOARD

Yes, time flies when we're having fun! As mentioned in our October and February updates (available for viewing at [www.stocktonsprings.org](http://www.stocktonsprings.org)), much work has been done in this fiscal year on our policies, plus some ordinance proposals for our voters at town meeting. We are currently wrapping up the proposed 2016-2017 budget for approval at town meeting as well – our Town Manager Marnie Diffin has again come through for us, making some important improvements while we keep taxpayer contribution steady. We look forward to presenting these to you, so please mark your calendars for June 25<sup>th</sup> and join us if you can!

As for personnel matters, an Assistant Harbormaster has been appointed, and we have negotiated the Town Manager's contract with Marnie for another 2 years. We hope she will stay with us for as long as possible; she has many years of experience, does excellent work, and is a great fit for our town!

The 2005 Comprehensive Plan Review now involves a formal update, which we will continue to work on steadily. At this point, we do not anticipate that the necessary changes will alter the essence of the Plan, so the update process should be much simpler than when it was originally created. We will inform you of necessary Public Hearings when scheduled so you may attend and provide your input.

One of the largest decisions currently facing us is a renegotiation of our solid waste contract, which has been a widely publicized issue throughout this part of the state. In addition to the two giant companies under consideration, we are looking into other options that may be more viable at this time. Information will be made available to you at the town office and at least one Public Hearing will be held; the matter will also be touched upon at town meeting.

A great deal of work is involved in the success of a town. Thanks again to all who contribute to ours in any way – we couldn't do it without you!

## **STOCKTON SPRINGS AMBULANCE**

### **YEARLY REPORT**

To The Citizens of Stockton Springs,

2015 saw a substantial decrease in total calls for the year. Total calls for 2014 were 303, and the breakdown for 2015 is as follows. Stockton had 122 transports, Prospect topped out at 46 transports. No transports for Stockton were 30, and Prospect were 6. We had 13 mutual aid calls for Winterport and Searsport, and 1 transport from Waldo County General Hospital back to a patient's residence. This breakdown gives us a total of 218 calls for the year. I have no explanation why we have this substantial decrease in calls, except maybe we are taking better care of ourselves? Perhaps the weather played a factor in the decrease of calls, being as it was so mild.

Our new Zoll Heart Monitors have been put through their paces, on several occasions and have performed flawlessly. Having the newest equipment helps us to help you.

Last September Stockton Ambulance held our first 5K-10K Run for Your Life road race, around Cape Jellison. This turned out to be a huge success, and plans are being set forth to make this an annual event. Many thanks go out to all the businesses that helped with sponsoring the event. Anyone interested in participating in this years race, contact me at 567-4322 for more information.

We at the ambulance service are constantly doing trainings to keep us up to date on procedures and protocols so that we can provide you the best pre-hospital care possible. We now have a CPR instructor on staff, and in the near future will be offering CPR training for the lay person. American Heart Association guidelines for CPR are changing right off, so we will be offering classes after the changes.

## **ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER ANNUAL REPORT**

I would like to thank the Town Office staff for the more efficient dog license system they have adopted. A dog that is licensed has a tag that helps me identify it and makes it much easier to get it back home safely.

### **Reminders:**

- Dog licenses are available at the Town Office on October 15<sup>th</sup> for the following year. They are due by December 31<sup>st</sup> of every year. There is a \$25 fine if your dog is not licensed by February 1<sup>st</sup>.
- To license your dogs, please provide current proof of rabies vaccine, and neuter or spay certificates if applicable, to the clerk.
- Every year the Town hosts a low cost Rabies Clinic. Usually it is held between October and January. For more information on this you can check the Town's website to see when it will be held.
- There is a pet food donation box at the Town Office. Anyone who needs pet food is welcome to come in and get some. We realize money is tight at times, but we want everyone to be able to keep their pets! Thank you to all who have donated. It is very much appreciated.

Anyone interested in finding out the laws pertaining to animals can find it on the Maine Department of Agriculture site under Animal Welfare.

## ASSESSOR'S REPORT FOR 2015-2016

Dear Stockton Springs Residents and Taxpayers,

The revaluation conducted by the Maine Assessment and Appraisal Services, Inc. has been completed. Thank you for all your patience during the revaluation!

I have listed some of the tax exemptions you may qualify for:

**HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION** – To qualify for this program you must live in and own a home in Maine for one year as of April 1<sup>st</sup>. You must file the application with the Assessor's Office by April 1<sup>st</sup>. This exemption reduces your valuation by \$15,000. Applications are available at the Town Office or online at <https://www.maine.gov/revenue/forms/property/apps/homesteadapp.pdf>.

**VETERAN EXEMPTION** – To qualify for this program you must be a Veteran who has served during a federally recognized war period and have reached the age of 62, or be receiving government compensation for a service connected disability. Applications are available at the Town Office or online at <http://www.maine.gov/revenue/forms/property/apps/veteranapp.pdf>. 

To the Citizens of Stockton Springs,

The winter of 2015-2016 was a mild one when compared to the previous year. No large snow or ice storms left the town in good shape.

The spring has left us with several isolated power outages from high winds. Cape Jellison seems to be vulnerable to these outages. Even my road in Sandy Point fell victim to fallen trees from high winds.

Just a reminder, in the event of severe weather, the basement of the Town Office will serve as a temporary shelter. Our local American Legion Post will man this center as needed. You will need to bring any necessities with you. In the event of severe weather with severe damage I could use some local volunteers to assist me.

With summer approaching Maine DOT is going to be working on the Penobscot Narrows Bridge and the rock walls approaching the bridge. Seems water is leaking under the road deck and causing problems. Expect delays. They will be shutting down one travel lane, and have alternating traffic in the other. Their plans for the rock wall will be to scale off any loose rocks. This project may take 2 years.

In an effort to help Emergency Services and Fire Department find you in a timely manner, please have your house number clearly visible. Mailboxes could be numbered on both sides, and if you don't have a mailbox you can order a house number sign at the Town Office. The cost of these signs is \$12.00, and they are highly visible.

## STOCKTON SPRINGS POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Stockton Springs Police Department has experienced an increase in complaints this past year. The total complaints this year from July 1, 2015 until March 16, 2016 are at 459, keep in mind there are still fifteen weeks left in the year. The 459 complaints that we have covered are up from the 300 that we covered last year. The complaint types covered are from civil issues, such as property disputes, child custody issues, to criminal issue such as assaults, threats, harassment and burglaries. We have made several traffic stops and a lot of these stops have come from the radar details that we have conducted in the neighborhoods throughout the town. We have been conducting house checks for residents upon their request.

As stated above we have been doing radar details throughout the town, this is an attempt to keep the traffic slowed through our neighborhoods. We will continue to do these details throughout the year.

The members of the police department consist of Supervisor Darrin Moody, Patrol Officer Richard Sullivan, Patrol Officer Michael Larrivee, and Patrol Officer Christopher Hast.

I am honored to provide you with the annual report of the Waldo County Sheriff's Office. 2015 was an exciting year at the Sheriff's Office. Along with me being sworn in as Sheriff, several promotions were made among the ranks. Jason Trundy was promoted to Chief Deputy. Chief Trundy is a twenty-two year veteran of the Sheriff's Office where he has served as a Corrections Officer, Patrol Deputy, Detective, Jail Administrator, and Patrol/Detective Division Lieutenant. Matthew Curtis was promoted to Lieutenant where he will oversee the Patrol and Detective Divisions. Matt is a twenty year veteran of the Sheriff's Office also with a wide range of experience. He has served as a Patrol Deputy, Detective and Patrol Sergeant. Nicholas Oettinger was promoted to Patrol Sergeant. Nick most recently served as the School Resource Officer at the Mt. View School Complex in Thorndike. In 2015, Sergeant Oettinger received the honor of being named Deputy of the Year by the Maine Sheriff's Association. This leadership team will assist me in taking the Sheriff's Office to even greater levels of service and professionalism.

The patrol division had another very busy year in 2015, handling 7,652 calls for service from the public. These calls include all manner of incidents to include domestic violence, burglaries, thefts, child abuse, sexual abuse, motor vehicle crashes and more. The epidemic of drug dependence continues to ravage the citizens of Waldo County generating much of the crime experienced in our county.

The Maine Coastal Regional Re-entry Center served 52 residents in 2015. These residents were men who were nearing the end of their term of incarceration. Our many programs assist them with their integration back into society as productive and contributing citizens. The re-entry residents provided 6,587 hours of free community service all over Waldo County. If this labor was paid at minimum wage, it would translate to \$48,403 in free labor to Waldo County Communities. The re-entry residents also provided 63,000 pounds of fresh produce to local food pantries from the County's Garden Project overseen by Waldo County Commissioner William Shorey. The residents also paid \$23,992 dollars in room and board payments to the County during the year.

The 72 hour holding and booking facility processed 1,023 persons who were arrested in Waldo County by all the law enforcement agencies serving our County. If a person who has been arrested cannot make bail within 72 hours, he or she has to be transported to the Two Bridges Regional Jail in Wiscasset by our Transport


## RECREATION DEPARTMENT 2015-2016

## HARBOR COMMITTEE REPORT

June 2016

Stockton Harbor was home to 68 resident boat moorings and 73 non-resident boat moorings during the 2015 boating season. Our harbor facility also supports numerous trailered vessels, kayakers and families enjoying the picnic area or simply being near the water. Shore-side dinghy space and parking congestion remain a challenge, and a mooring site waiting list system remains in place as a result. Residents of Stockton Springs are always given priority for mooring sites. On behalf of the Harbor Committee, I would like to thank Harbormaster Les Bryant for another year of great service to our boating community. The Assistant Harbormaster position authorized by the Select Board in 2015 was recently filled by Ms. Monet Brazier. We welcome Monet aboard, and look forward to having her fill in for Harbormaster Bryant when needed, and to having her assist with the administrative duties at the Harbor.

The Harbor Committee also wishes to thank the citizens of Stockton Springs for their continued support of the annual Town Warrant article which dedicates harbor-generated revenues to the operation of the harbor. Through the use of these funds, Stockton Harbor continues to be funded by the boaters, and not property tax payers. Stockton Harbor fees remain the same as last year. All State-registered boat owners are reminded to renew their annual registrations and to affix their stickers after their boat's registration numbers. Owners of Documented vessels are obligated to pay their annual excise tax at the Town Office, and to affix their excise tax stickers in easily visible locations on their boats. Please note that all mooring and dinghy fees are due by 30 April. Mooring fees received after 30 April will incur a \$50 late fee, as per Section 7.2 of the Harbor Ordinance.

Once again, the Harbor Committee has secured a 90 percent State operating expense grant for our pump-out barge for the 2016 boating season. In order for us to meet State grant requirements, boaters utilizing this facility must fill out the simple log sheet on the barge each time they pump. To help keep this a free service, your cooperation is requested and greatly appreciated.

Late in 2015, Stockton Springs purchased a newer Harbormaster boat using funds from the boat replacement reserve account, the Harbor account, and a generous donation from an anonymous donor. The Committee would like to thank that donor, as well as Russell's Marine who facilitated the transaction. This boat will be put into service for the 2016 boating season, is larger and more robust than the old boat, and should serve the operational needs of the Harbormaster for many years to come.

The Harbor Committee meets on the second Thursday of each month (except December) at 7 PM in the Town Office. Any and all interested citizens are encouraged to attend our meetings.

## RECYCLING COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2015

Citizens of Stockton Springs and Sandy Point continue to support our single stream and curbside recycling program. This helps to support a vibrant and healthy environment in our town. Eco-Maine, our recycling facility in Lewiston, reports that our curbside recycling materials remain good clean loads. Thank you citizens and let's all keep this going.

The recycling statistics this past year (2015) include the following figures for roadside recycling:

- Spring clean up - 20.69 tons
- Biweekly recycling - 67.19 tons

Recycling collection for 2015 equaled 20.47% of all trash generated.

E-Waste recycling held at the Town Garage continues on the last Saturday of each month and is staffed by Committee members and town employees. The Recycling Committee continues to explore options to recycle other materials. A statewide paint-recycling program is now in effect. Unused paint can now be returned to the site of purchase or to other stores that sell paint. Alkaloid batteries containing mercury continue to present a recycling concern and are not presently recyclable on E-Waste days at our town garage. We will continue to explore options to change this.

Some interesting E-Waste totals for 2015 include the following:

- 139 4 ft. fluorescent bulbs
- 165 compact fluorescent bulbs (curly bulbs)
- 40 computer CPUs totaling 1,122 lbs.
- Microwave ovens totaling 796 lbs.
- Miscellaneous electronics totaling 3,207 lbs.
- 21 computer monitors totaling 660 lbs.
- 66 computer printers totaling 1,050 lbs.
- 207 televisions totaling 9,041 lbs.

We feel the above numbers and weights are both positive and impressive and request that our residents continue to use our recycling program. This helps to insure that the items mentioned above and other recyclables are recycled and dealt with in a proper method.

A recycling newsletter is updated annually mailed to all residents. This newsletter provides the most recent guidelines for what is and is not recyclable and for what is accepted at the monthly E-Waste days in our town. Managing recyclables and waste materials is vital for successful programs and progress towards a clean and safe environment. The newsletter also provides suggestions for other ways to recycle and reuse.

The Warm Window Project supported by the Window Dressers Project in Rockland continues to grow here in Stockton Springs in collaboration with the town of Searsport. Last year volunteers in our communities made and helped to install over 500 window inserts during the month of October to help reduce heating costs for our local citizens. Many local business and community programs contributed not only volunteers but also food for the volunteer workers over a two-week period. This is another positive effort on the part of local people to make our town a caring and better place for all in which to live.

The five current Recycling Committee members are: co- chairs Beth Smith and Sam Fuller, members Henry Martin, Wesley Olmstead and Charlie Smith and alternate members Wayne Kraeger and Nancy Galland. Sara Skolfield is our select board representative. We have several engaged volunteers and welcome you to attend our meetings on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of January, March, May, July, September, and November at 6 PM at the Town Office. Please feel welcome to come and help us make a difference!

## **STOCKTON SPRINGS COMMUNITY LIBRARY REPORT 2015**

The Stockton Springs Community Library (SSCL) had another very busy and productive year in 2015 with people of all ages checking out books, audio books, e-readers, and movies, using the computers, attending events, and supporting our fundraising efforts. In 2015, the library had 1,089 registered patrons. 6,619 items were circulated, there were 497 computer users, and we saw an increase in the number of people who come to the library to access the wireless internet services on their own electronic devices. Many people do this even when the library is closed, proving how important this service is to the public. We have seen an increase in the number of downloadable items through Maine InfoNet, with patrons downloading 5,255 items.

Attendance at all of our programs increased in 2015 over 2014. In 2014, 852 people attended SSCL programs, while 1,100 people attended programs in 2015. Our programs included 2 book groups, author presentations, film screenings, watercolor group, poetry readings, children's programs, aging in place group, gardening group, and much more. Our all-volunteer library's offerings are comparable to many libraries with full time staff.

For fundraisers we had a very successful book, bake and plant sale, which everyone looks forward to each year. We also hosted our last Tea Party. Our second annual Pie & Art Sale was a wonderful success which also led to regular art exhibits and art sales to benefit both the contributing artists and the library. Once again we offered free income tax service in collaboration with AARP which many people take advantage of and appreciate. The Bottles for Books Campaign is still going strong, and the funds raised are all used for purchase of books, audio books, and movies.

We hosted programs with authors John Ford, Mike Nickerson, Paul Betit, Joan McCracken, and poet Carolyn Locke. Children's programs included film screenings, LEGO program, pre-school program, storyteller Michael Parent, story hours, and summer reading series. We had a Winnie-the-Pooh day and our children's Halloween Party and Parade had more children attend than ever before.

In 2015, we sent out our third annual appeal letter and the response was once again excellent, demonstrating how much the community values the library. We have now an endowment fund which will ensure the library will be here for years to come.

In 2015, we received a grant from the Stephen & Tabitha King Foundation to continue work on the building stabilizing the building and making it more energy efficient.

## **STOCKTON SPRINGS HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT**

The Stockton Springs Historical Society had another busy year. We started an inventory of our complete collection. Two rooms are completely inventoried and a third is partially done. The filing cabinets have been reorganized, with business, history and organization files separated into three distinct groups making it easier to find information. Marion Fisher, Marsha Shute and Kathy Harrison continue to work Monday mornings filing, organizing and working on the inventory. Diane Coose Littlefield, Andre Blanchard and Kathy Harrison had our rooms open most Saturdays from May to October for anyone who wanted to see our exhibits or do research.

The library and the historical society were able to have the cellar encapsulated which eliminated the problem with dampness as well as adding more insulation. With the dampness no longer creeping into the building we are now planning for exterior painting. One of the chimneys needs some major work so we have to start putting aside money for that as well.

Monthly meetings were held from April to November with 39 present at our December Christmas party when we played hosts to the library volunteers who had decorated the Colcord House. Programs included Bob Brooks telling about early settlers in the area; Dan Harrison reading from the society's collection of Clifford family letters and papers; Ryan King telling of Fred Lunt of Frenchboro; a program where members attempted to identify, at times successfully, some of the images from the Harriet Hichborn glass plate negatives; information on the ancestry of Ursula Bither, who married Joseph W. Thompson; as well as a member show and tell and the sharing of lesser known items in our collection.

Thank you to the town, the library, and all the individuals who have supported the society through financial support, helping with the building and grounds, donations of artifacts, coming to meetings, visiting our showrooms, and presenting programs. We are excited that we will be making our collection more accessible to all those who have supported us and those who are interested in the area's history. We have new cataloging software which will enable our collection to be viewed on a library computer. Entering data is a long term project; one small box may have over a hundred items that need to be entered into the catalog. As we get more items entered with basic information, we will start going back to add more details. The software allows one to search or to browse our collection.

We invite anyone interested in the town's history to join us at our meetings and to participate in our archiving and cataloging work, or to help to add to the genealogical information in our files.

**SECTION XV. GENERAL PERFORMANCE STANDARDS**

**BB. Off Street Parking and Loading**

i. No structure shall be erected nor shall any of the following uses be established unless at least the minimum number of off-street parking spaces as provided below is provided. Off-street parking, either by means of open air spaces or by garage space, in addition to being a permitted use, shall be considered as an accessory use when required or provided to serve conforming uses located in any District.

ii. The following minimum off-street parking requirements shall be provided and maintained in case of new construction, alterations and changes of use or as deemed appropriate by the Planning Board:

- a. Residential – Two (2) parking spaces for each dwelling unit
- b. Transient Accommodations:
  - 1. Bed and Breakfast accommodations, motels, hotels, boarding houses, and inns with ten (10) rooms or less – Two (2) parking spaces plus one space for each guest room
  - 2. Motels, hotels, boarding houses, and inns with more than ten (10) rooms – One (1) parking space for each guest room plus one (1) for each three (3) employees
- c. Schools – Five (5) parking spaces for each classroom plus one (1) for each four (4) employees
- d. Hospitals, Nursing Homes (bed facilities only) – One (1) parking space for every three (3) beds, plus one (1) for each employee based on the expected average employee occupancy
- e. Funeral Parlors – twenty (20) spaces or as determined by the Planning Board
- f. Theaters, churches, and other public assembly places – One (1) parking space for every four (4) seats or for every one hundred (100) square feet or major fraction thereof of assemblage space if no fixed seats.

- g. Retail Stores and Businesses – One (1) space for every two hundred (200) square feet of retail area, plus one for every two employees
- h. Automotive Repair and Service Stations – One (1) space for each regular employee plus one (1) space for each fifty (50) square feet of floor area
- i. Roadside Farm Stand – Four (4) spaces
- j. Restaurants, eating and drinking establishments – One (1) parking space for every four (4) seats, plus one (1) for every two (2) employees
- k. Drive-In Restaurants and Dairy Stands – Ten (10) spaces plus one (1) additional space for each person serving or preparing food
- l. Professional Offices and Public Buildings – One (1) parking space for every two hundred (200) square feet of working space
- m. Fraternal Organizations and Clubs – One (1) space for each five (5) members
- n. Other Commercial Recreation Establishments (mini-golf courses, etc.) the number of spaces deemed appropriate by the Planning Board
- o. Industrial – One (1) parking space for each 1.5 employees, based on the highest expected average employee occupancy, plus employee, visitor and customer parking to meet the needs of specific operations
- p. For uses not specifically listed in this section, the Code Enforcement Officer shall prescribe the number which in no case will be less than an adequate number for employees and customers and visitors anticipated on the site

iii. Location on Other Property - If the required automobile parking spaces cannot be provided on the same lot where the principal use is conducted, the Planning Board can permit that such spaces may be provided on other off-street property provided that such property lies within five hundred (500) feet of the main entrance to such principal use and is in the same zone. Such automobile parking space shall be associated with the principal use and shall not thereafter be reduced or encroached upon in any manner, provided however, that it may serve different principal uses at different times of day.

**Solid Waste Flow and Recycling Ordinance  
Town of Stockton Springs, Maine**

**§1 IDENTIFICATION AND DEFINITION OF ORDINANCE**

**§1.1 Identification.**

This ordinance shall be known as the TOWN OF STOCKTON SPRINGS SOLID WASTE FLOW AND RECYCLING ORDINANCE herein referred to as "the Ordinance."

**§1.2 Purpose.**

The purpose of the Ordinance is to protect the health, safety and general wellbeing of the citizens of Stockton Springs, Maine, enhance and maintain the quality of the environment and conserve natural resources by providing for a comprehensive, rational and effective means of regulating the disposal of domestic solid waste in the Town of Stockton Springs in accordance with the provisions of Title 38 M.R.S.A., §1301 et seq. (the Maine Hazardous Waste, Septage and Solid Waste Management Act) and Title 30-A M.R.S.A., §3001 et seq. (Ordinance Powers of Municipalities and Counties).

An additional purpose of this ordinance is to validate the Town's user fee system for the curbside collection and disposal of domestic solid waste. The user fee plan promotes equity and fairness by linking the cost of waste disposal to the amount of waste actually generated by a person or household.

**§1.3 Applicability.**

This ordinance applies to all domestic, residential, and governmental generators of solid waste in the Town of Stockton Springs. This ordinance further applies to waste that is left curbside to be collected by commercial haulers under separate contracts with the Town.

**§1.4 Definitions.**

Except as provided below, the definitions set forth in Title 38 M.R.S.A. §1303-C as amended (Solid Waste Definitions) apply to the Ordinance and are incorporated herein by reference. Any word not otherwise defined shall have its ordinary meaning.

**§1.4.A Acceptable Waste** is that non-hazardous solid waste generated by domestic, residential, and governmental generators in the Town of Stockton Springs which may include, but is not limited to: household rubbish, garbage, recyclables, white goods, metals and construction and demolition debris.

**§1.4.B Commercial Hauler** is any company or individual who transports solid waste for compensation while being under contract with the Town.

**§1.4.C Curbside** is defined as a collection location, usually at the end of the driveway or private road, within Town or State road limits, but not on actual pavement.

**§1.4.D Designated Facilities** are those facilities for disposal and recycling processing that have entered into negotiated agreements or contracts with the Town of Stockton Springs.

**§1.4.E Recyclable Materials** are a type of acceptable waste that is collected curbside separate from other forms of acceptable waste, and which may include, but are not limited to: cardboard, newspapers & inserts, office paper, milk jugs, detergent bottles, rigid containers marked #1 thru #7, tin cans, empty aerosol cans, all glass bottles & jars.

**§1.4.F Unacceptable Waste** is that portion of solid waste which is not defined as acceptable waste and includes, but is not limited to: sewage, liquid waste or sludge, junk vehicles, wet cell batteries, dead animal carcasses or portions thereof, hazardous waste, infectious waste, special waste such as asbestos, industrial process waste, medical waste, contaminated soils, tree stumps, waste oil, and electronic waste, tires.

**§1.4.G User Fee Sticker** is a sticker, issued by the Town of Stockton Springs pursuant to this ordinance, which allows a container of domestic solid waste to be disposed of curbside.

### **§1.5 Designation of Solid Waste Facilities.**

**§1.5.A** The Select Board is authorized to designate facilities for the disposal of acceptable waste and for recycling processing, subject to the constraints set upon them by Town Meeting Action.

## **§2 REGULATION AND ENFORCEMENT**

### **§2.1 Rule Making Powers.**

The Select Board shall adopt written solid waste rules and regulations for the processing, recycling and disposal of domestic solid waste. The Select Board shall have the authority to establish and collect fees for user fee stickers that are required for curbside collection.

### **§2.2 Enforcement Powers.**

Town Officials, so designated by the Select Board, are authorized to enforce the requirements of this ordinance and such Solid Waste Rules and Regulations as are enacted under §2.1.

### **§2.3 User Fee Sticker Required.**

No person may dispose of domestic acceptable waste curbside unless a user fee sticker is affixed to the container (plastic bag, box, or other) containing such waste. Each container must have its own sticker and the sticker shall be clearly visible on the container.

## **§3 COLLECTION AND TRANSPORT**

**§3.1 Curbside Collection.** Any person using curbside collection of acceptable solid waste or recyclables shall follow these regulations:

**§3.1.A Curbside Acceptable Waste** that is to be placed at curbside for disposal must be in plastic bags or other containers which are acceptable to the hauler and each of which contains no more than 40 pounds of waste. Bags and containers shall contain no unacceptable waste and shall be placed at curbside not more than 24 hours before scheduled pick up.

**§3.1.B Curbside Recyclables** that are to be placed at curbside for collection must be prepared according to current regulations and placed in an approved container. Haulers may reject material which is not prepared according to specifications. Recycling containers shall be placed at the curbside no earlier than 24 hours before scheduled pick up.

**§3.1 C Curbside Special Collections** are for the collection of demolition and wood debris and metal. Specific instructions will be issued in advance of each collection.

### **§4 FLOW CONTROL**

#### **§4.1 Direction of Applicable Solid Waste to Designated Facilities.**

The Town has entered into one or more binding contracts to deliver all applicable waste to their designated facilities. As authorized by 38 M.R.S.A. §1304-B as amended (Flow Control - Delivery of Solid Wastes to Specific Waste Facilities), the Town hereby controls and directs acceptable solid waste to be delivered only to those facilities designated in §1.5. Any Commercial Hauler who delivers acceptable solid waste, and recyclables to any other facility is in violation of this ordinance.

### **§5 VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES**

#### **§5.1 General.**

Violations of this ordinance shall be enforced under the provision of 30-A M.R.S.A. §4452 as amended (Enforcement of land use laws and ordinances) as land use violations. The penalties set forth in the aforementioned statute shall apply to violations of this Ordinance.

#### **§5.2 Municipal Costs of Enforcement.**

In addition to the foregoing penalty provisions, any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be liable to reimburse the Town for costs of enforcement including reasonable attorney fees and court costs. This provision shall not preclude the Town for seeking and obtaining equitable relief.

#### **§5.3 Costs of Disposal.**

In the case of illegal dumping upon private or public land, the costs of clean up and disposal shall be borne by the person so dumping, unless no person is so charged. If no person is so charged, then the costs shall be borne by the land owner. The Town may pay the tipping fee for disposal of illegally dumped material if the land owner reports the violation to the Town's Police Department or to the Town's Code Enforcement Officer and the person or persons responsible for the act cannot be determined.

### **§6 STIPULATIONS**

**§6.1 Severability.** If any provisions of this ordinance or the application thereof is held invalid by any court of law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end, the provisions of the ordinance are declared to be severable.
