# Fall 2020 Move-in and COVID-19 Testing Information

Residential students at UMM will be invited to move back to campus on three dates. Detailed information about move-in times will be communicated directly to students.

Aug. 14: Resident Assistants will move in

Aug. 17: Resident Assistants, students already living on campus, and some commuter students will be tested on campus

Aug. 25: First day of move-in

Aug. 26: Second day of move-in

Students will be asked to quarantine in their dorms until they are tested and receive their results

Aug. 27: On-campus testing for all residential students, and for commuter students arriving from out-of-state

Aug. 31: Second day of on-campus testing for those who were not tested Aug. 27

All other arrangements will need to be coordinated with Dean of Students Marnie Kaler (marnie.kaler@maine.edu).

All residential students, and commuter students arriving from out-of-state, will be tested or will be asked to bring proof that they have received a negative test result within the past 72 hours.
