Report of Milk Inspector

During the past year there has been a marked improvement in the average conditions of the dairies from which the milk supply of Skowhegan is furnished. The improvements recently added consist of closed packages of one dozen bottles each, for the delivery teams; a milking machine installed on the Malbon Bros. farm; tuberculin herds have been tested by Maurice Magoon, and Geo. L. Wheeler; the latter party also using a second, sanitary capping on his bottles.

One complaint only has been received. This was bitter milk, and was found to be due to feeds and was soon corrected. Many dairymen have voluntarily submitted samples for butter fat test. Of these none have tested below four per cent.

Park Commission

REPORT OF SECRETARY

At the annual meeting of the town on March 13, 1916, Louise H. Coburn was elected Park Commissioner to serve for a term of three years.

On account of an early spring, the work on the Park began in April. There are eleven acres of land in the Park, requiring almost all kinds of work during the summer season. Setting out of trees, shrubs, plants and bulbs and keeping the ground in proper shape, requires a good amount of work. This work also increases from year to year. Many trees and shrubs were set out last year, as well as bulbs and plants. Many of the trees and shrubs were given us. The horse lawn mower proved a success. Although there are places on the Park where it cannot be used, it had much to do in making the Park a beauty spot. The lawn-mower was kept very busy on account of the rainy season, making the grass very rank.

The roads were much improved and kept in better condition than ever before.

The money given us this year for the roads proved to be all right as we were enabled to hire two men for the work. The Road Commissioner loaned the drag at different times. As usual, the pond was cleared of debris, but the hard winds caused much litter to be blown in.

Signs were put up asking visitors not to pick the flowers or hurt the shrubs and trees. Picking the flowers must be stopped. Many of the tulips, lilacs and pond lilies especially were taken. We must acknowledge there are people who utterly disregard the notices, knowing that when taking flowers they are robbing the Park and depriving others of seeing what they seem to enjoy, but the general public give us little trouble. In fact want to help us in keeping things for others to enjoy.

The fences on the bank of the river need to be built new and the material for it was bought, but for want of funds, only part was built, in places it was repaired enough to be safe and some of the work on the seats, repairing was done. We hope to finish this work this year. The outlet at the pond must be repaired this year, too. We feel that our work is appreciated and we thank the people for their appreciation.

Skowhegan Fire Department

SKOWHEGAN, MAINE, FEBRUARY 15, 1917.

To the Board of Fire Commissioners and Citizens of Skowhegan:

We herewith submit the following report of the Fire Department.

The Fire Department consists of an Engineer, two Assistant Engineers for steamer, also one fireman, Steamer Company, Hook and Ladder Company and Union Hose Company of fifteen men each. The apparatus is the same as last year.

There has been purchased during the year 500 feet new hose, making 4200 feet of serviceable hose at fire station and 1000 feet condemned hose in basement for street purposes.

There is on hand at the present time about 1 ton steamer coal, 100 lbs. carbonate of soda, 1 carboy of sulphuric acid.

The following has been added to the alarm system during the year: One new alarm box No. 43, at the corner of North Avenue and Jewett streets. Two six inch tappers, one in the home of Charles Gamage, the other in the home of Tracey Cates on Madison St. plains, improving conditions in that locality. One-half mile of new wire has been added to the line, extending the same from box 42 up Madison Avenue and across Jewett street to box 43 thereby cutting out one very bad section across Maple street. The line has been cut into two loops instead of one as formerly, so in case of an accident to the line on one side of the river, the other side is still in service. We consider the line now in first class shape.

There has been installed in the station at the expense of about \$930.00 a new Storage Battery outfit to replace the old gravity battery.

This outfit is strictly up-to-date in every respect and (as compared with the old outfit) means a saving to the town of about \$300.00 a year, and is one that the people of the town can well be proud of.

Board of Health

To the Selectmen of the Town of Skowhegan:
Gentlemen:

We herewith submit to you our report in this department for the year current.

The members of the board have seen active service this past year.

We have had reported to us from time to time many cases of nuisance and places where unsanitary conditions were well established which were a menace to life and health.

In every instance the cause was speedily removed when the facts were properly presented to the right parties, and we wish to state that our citizens have always shown an interest in the sanitary welfare of our community and have willingly co-operated with the board to adjust to our satisfaction anything that would injure health or be a menace to life.

The diphtheria epidemic which came to our town during the months of October and November caused us and the people of our town considerable trouble and anxiety.

We entered into the work however with a determination to allay if possible this dread disease, and only after a strenuous effort both on the part of physicians and citizens did we succeed in staying its progress.

We had in all 37 cases reported with three fatalities.

The cost to the town has been a large item, but a mere trifle compared to the amount of good that antitoxin and other preventatives have accomplished in stamping out the fatal malady, and saving we believe many a young life which is dearer to us than life itself.

We wish to state further, that whoever you appoint to serve on this board we wish to ask the citizens of this town through you as selectmen, that when any of the board approach a citizen relative to conditions that are not to the best good of the community, that they heed the kindly advice given by the board and hasten at once to make each and every spot in this good town of ours a respectable place in which to live, and heed the Golden Rule: "Do unto your neighbor as you would like to have him do by you."

To Adam Simpson, Constable of the Town of Skowhegan, in the County of Somerset, Greeting,—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Skowhegan, qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet in the Auditorium in Municipal Building in said town on Monday the 12th day of March, A. D. 1917, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk.

Art. 3. To choose Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor, and fix their compensation.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to elect a Park Commissioner to serve three years.

Art. 5. To see if the town will elect a board of three special appraisers to make, prior to Jan. 1, 1918 a thorough revision of the valuation of all real estate in town for the purpose of recommending the said valuation to the consideration of subsequent boards of assessors; and to see what compensation the town will vote to said appraisers.

Art. 6. To choose all other officers required by law to be chosen at the Annual March Meeting.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to establish and maintain, within its limits, a permanent wood, coal, and fuel yard, for the purpose of selling, at cost, wood, coal, and fuel to its inhabitants; and raise a sum of money by loan or otherwise to establish and maintain the same; and pass all necessary votes respecting the same.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to accept highway laid out by the Selectmen. Beginning on the northerly side of Mt. Pleasant Avenue, midway between southwest corner of lot 69 and the Southeast corner of lot 68 according to plan of lots laid

out on land of Bisson and Young and recorded in Somerset Registry of Deeds in plan book No. 4, Page 20; thence running northerly at right angles with Mt. Pleasant Avenue four hundred feet; thence turning ten degrees and forty minutes to the left and running to and across Kennebec River and to an intersection with the center line of Kennebec Street, a distance of three hundred feet more or less. The above described line to be the center of a three rod street to be known as an extension of Kennebec Street. Said way passes over land of Charles E. Young and Amidee E. Bisson to whom we award no damage, and over land of Clara B. Moor on the north bank of Kennebec river to whom we award twenty-five dollars. To raise a sum of money for damages herein assessed and to pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to build a bridge across the Kennebec River at a point opposite Kennebec Street, together with such roads as are necessary to connect the same with Kennebec Street and Mt. Pleasant Ave., and to raise a sum of money by loan or otherwise and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to defray the expenses of the Fire Department the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to purchase two horses for the Fire Department. to make such changes as are essential for the care of said horses, and raise a sum of money for the same, and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for making and repairing highways in said town and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for making and repairing bridges and culverts in said town, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 14. To see whether the town will vote to raise money, and what sum, for the maintenance of State Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section 9 of Chapter 130 of the public Laws of 1913.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for breaking snow roads the present winter, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of Common Schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of a High School for the year ensuing, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the repair of the School Buildings for the ensuing year and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to purchase school supplies for the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to purchase text books for the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for Manual Training and Domestic Science for the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of an evening School for the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Superintending Committee to employ a School Physician or Physicians, as provided by Chapter 73, Public Laws of 1909, and raise a sum of money for the same.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be paid to the Trustees of the Skowhegan Free Public Library for the ensuing year, on consideration that Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) of the same be paid to the Trustees of Russell Post Grand Army of the Republic.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to defray the expenses of Memorial Day, under such directions as may be deemed proper, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for Hydrant Rental the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to defray the expenses of the Police Department the ensuing year, and pass all necessary votes respecting the same.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to light the streets the ensuing year and raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 30. To see if the town will raise Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) towards the maintenance of the National Guard in Skowhegan, and pass all necessary votes respecting the same.

Art. 31. To see what action the town will take in regard to sprinkling certain streets, or portions of said streets or parts thereof, and the material to be used; to instruct the Selectmen to assess the expense therefor upon abutters, and to pass all votes necessary regarding the same.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to employ one or more night watchmen for the ensuing year, and to provide compensation for the same.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) and to authorize the Selectmen to use the same to enforce the laws prohibiting fast and reckless driving of motor vehicles.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to employ a bookkeeper or stenographer or both on the town books and for town affairs not to exceed \$250.00 and to raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to raise \$3900.00 to pay the temporary loans obtained as per vote of special town meetings which include Harry Combs settlement of \$750.00, Patriotic Fund for Co, E \$1000.00, Steward Ave. Sewer \$350.00, Middle Street McAdam \$1000.00, Storage Battery Fire Department \$800.00, and pass all necessary votes,

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to raise Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for Band Concerts for the summer, and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the improvement of Coburn Park, to be expended under the direction of the Park Commissioners.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to defray town expenses for the year ensuing, which includes the expense of the Municipal Building, Officers' Salaries, Interest Money, and Support of Poor, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to pay One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to the Skowhegan Woman's Association, towards the support of the Public Rest Rooms for the year 1917.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the necessary repairs of the cemeteries in town, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to make improvements on town's land at Parkman Hill, with the end in view of using the same as a Cemetery, and to raise a sum of money and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to purchase from the Skowhegan Cemetery Association its property in Skowhegan, bounded on the North by Willow Street, on the East by land of Lord & Caswell, on the south by the South Side Cemetery, and on the West by McClellan Street, if a price can be agreed upon, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to raise Fifty Dollars (\$50) to defray the expenses of cutting brush and straightening stones in Cemetery on River Road, known as Herrin Cemetery, and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 44. To see if the town will allow One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of the cemetery appropriation for the Catholic Cemetery and pass such votes as are necessary.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to build a sewer to provide an increase in the capacity of the outlet from manhole at corner of North Ave. and East Street. Said increase in capacity to be provided either by rebuilding North Street Sewer below this point or by building a new sewer by such route as may be determined to best accomplish the desired result, and to raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to construct a sewer on West Front Street from Pine Street to McClellan Street, and raise the necessary money and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to complete the sewer on Chandler Street from Steward Ave. to Madison Ave. and raise a sum of money for the same. and pass all votes necessary.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to repair or rebuild sidewalk on Court Street from High Street to Winter Street and raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 49. To see if the town will vote to repair or rebuild sidewalk on Leavitt Street from Court Street to Madison Ave., raise a sum of money and pass all necessary votes for same.

Art. 50. To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk on Poplar Street from the easterly line of Lewis Weston's to the westerly line of Alonzo York's, and raise a sum of money and pass all necessary votes for same.

Art. 51. To see if the town will vote to build a gravel sidewalk on Milburn Street from Oak Street to the residence of George K. Thompson, and raise a sum of money and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 52. To see if the town will vote to build either a plank or gravel sidewalk, from the land of Jefferson Savage, on the Canaan Road to the residence of Fred Carpenter's on the Athens Road, to raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 53. To see if the town will vote to build a gravel sidewalk from the New Shoe Factory, south 200 feet to Chandler Street, then easterly on northerly side of said Chandler Street 800 feet to the easterly end of said street, and raise a sum of money for the same, and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 54. To see if the town will vote to build a gravel sidewalk from Joseph Murry's to Will Garnier's on the River Road and raise a sum of money and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 55. To see if the town will vote to complete building the gravel sidewalk on Prospect Street and raise the necessary money and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 56. To see what action the town will take to provide for measuring all wood, coal and coke sold in Skowhegan. To raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 57. To see if the town will vote to place a hydrant near the easterly end of East Maple Street, on condition that the Skowhegan Water Co. will furnish hydrant and piping without expense to the town. To raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 58. To see if the town will vote to erect a suitable railing on the easterly side of the foot-walk, on the Railroad Bridge, to repair or rebuild the railing on the westerly side of said bridge, to make such other alterations as are necessary to said walk and railing, to raise a sum of money for the same, and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 59. To see if the town will vote to exchange the town's hearse for a new one and raise \$750.00 for the same, and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 60. To see if the town will vote to maintain electric lights, leading from village to Woman's Reformatory and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 61. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the land on Parkman Hill providing a fair price can be obtained, and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 62. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire such sum or sums of money as may be necessary for current expenses in anticipation of taxes the year ensuing, and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 63. To see if the town will vote to fix a date when all taxes shall be due and also a date from which interest shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid and the rate of interest.

Art. 64. To see if the town will vote to purchase a street sweeper, providing the Selectmen, after investigating find it would be practical, to raise a sum of money not to exceed \$350.00 and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 65. To see if the town will vote to accept a highway as laid out by the Selectmen beginning on east side of said North Ave. at the northwest corner of land of Ogel Leo; thence easterly to the northeast corner of said Leo's land; thence south eight and one-fourth feet on the east line of land of said Leo; thence in a straight line to said Highland Avenue; thence north in the west line of said Highland Avenue three rods; thence west in a straight line parallel with the first line to the east line of land formerly owned by one Leo at a point eight rods distant from the east line of said North Avenue; thence south on the east line of said lot eight and one-fourth feet to the southeast corner of said lot; thence westerly in the south line of said lot to the east line of said North Avenue, being two rods wide on said North Avenue and three rods wide on said Highland Avenue:—said way passes over land of Edith Steward, to whom we award no damage; and pass all necessary votes.

Art. 66. To see if the town will vote to accept a highway laid out by the Selectmen beginning at the south west corner of lot 107, the same as designated on plan of house lot laid out by E. E. Greenwood and recorded in Somerset County Registry of deeds, plan book 3, page 33, and thence westerly on the southerly line on lots Nos. 107, 100 and continuing on southerly line of lots 80, 72, and 57 to the south west corner of lot No. 34, thence southerly about $49\frac{1}{2}$ feet to the north east corner of lot No. 58 and thence westerly parallel with the first line above mentioned on the northerly lines of lots 58, 73, 81, 86, 101 and lot (G) as designated on said plan, thence northerly about $49\frac{1}{2}$ feet to the point of beginning. Said way passes over land of Edith Steward to whom we award no damages, and to pass all votes necessary for same.

Art. 67. To see what compensation the town will vote to pay its School Committee.

Art. 68—To see if the town will appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of macadamizing North Street from Winter Street to Vallire Store a distance of about five hundred and fifty feet (550).

Art. 69—To see if the town will vote to re-surface the road on Madison Avenue from Elm Street to Leavitt Street and rebuild from Leavitt Street to Spring Street, providing the Somerset Traction Company will move their track to the middle of the road on said section; and raise a sum of money for the same; and pass all necessary votes.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters on Saturday, March 10, A. D., 1917, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

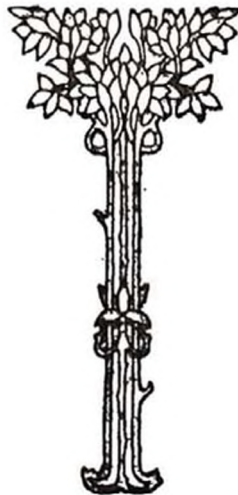
