This bereavement taking the fathers from homes of large families, a condition heretofore unequalled in any one year. We have reluctantly expended \$800 for the James Donahue family which consists of an incapable and crippled mother with five young children. We are pleased to report that arrangements are being made whereby an organization known as the Moose Hart will care for these children without expense to the town. Mr. Donahue, deceased, belonged to the Order of Moose.



From the James Frost fund, worthy poor in accordance with the provisions of this bequest, have been assisted to the amount of \$354.70. This account is open to public inspection.

St. Leger-Smith on their own account, heat, light and janitor such portion of building as is used for pictures, and as a rental for the same, they heat, light and janitor that part used by town and pay \$400 or the equivalent of \$2400, the town, school and churches having free use of building whenever desired. It will be found by averaging the maintaining expense of the building for the past five years it cost annually \$1850 and this expense is based on a lower wage scale, and with coal at about one half of the present price. Contract with lessees allows \$700 for heating portion of building used by town, it will cost not less than \$1000 in addition to auditorium which is heated by St. Leger-Smith.

Elements beyond man's control have contributed in reducing the town's cash balance during the year past, although the school and fuel departments and town's expenditures are practically within their respective appropriations notwithstanding unforeseen high wages and increased cost of materials.

Reasons for overdraft appearing as it does in the highway department are so obvious that an explanation is hardly necessary. It may be in order, however, to state that the many storms of last summer caused an unusual damage by washing out our highways and destroying culverts and bridges.

The main snow expense of last winter came after closing the books for 1917 and the quantity of snow with continued cold weather and high wages have made an expense almost unheard of, not only in Skowhegan but throughout the state.

## REPORT OF SECRETARY

At the March town meeting of Skowhegan, 1917, the town voted to appropriate five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for continuing the work on Coburn Park.

All expenses from the work on the Park, lighting it, repairing roads, seats, rests and keeping trees in a healthy condition, etc., etc., to be paid by the Commissioner. Also to have the use of the needed machines of the town to help in this work when convenient for the Road Commissioner to let us use them. We paid twenty (\$20.00) for the use of them. The roads were kept in better condition than ever, by having the use of this needed help. New fences have been built and others repaired. Trees were treated and we hope the work will last many years.

The Pine tree weevil attacked many of our common ever-green trees. They were dealt with, but there is a liability that other trees will be attacked.

The Pond was drained and the debris well scraped out of the bottom of it. It had some winter visitors (The Muskrat). These animals ate all the lilly bulbs they could get at and made many roads around the Pond. However, many lilly bulbs were saved, and others put in. The usual work was done, all over the Park.

We hope and think our people appreciate our efforts for the town and hope nothing will prevent this work going on indefinitely. It is needed in our town.

The caretaker of the Park, Charles Moody, whom we have employed for the whole twenty years that the work has been going on has died. He was always interested in the work and in everything connected with the Park and we shall miss him.

## Report of Milk Inspector

---

My work the past year has been almost entirely in conjunction with Brooks Brown, the State Dairy Inspector. Early in the year Mr. Brown reported to me the names of the dairy-men and dealers, twenty-nine in number, who were licensed to sell milk in the town of Skowhegan. Upon investigation, I found that there were thirteen others who had failed to take out the license required by the State Laws. These were notified and subsequently complied with the statute.

It will be of interest to know that from samples taken by the State Dairy Inspector and by myself, the average fat content of the milk offered for sale in Skowhegan the past year was 4.68. The minimum required by law for Maine is 3.5. From this it appears that the consumers of milk in Skowhegan are getting a product averaging 1.18 per cent higher than the Maine standard.

Called by the Commissioner of Agriculture, a meeting of all the local inspectors was held at Augusta last November. At this time an organization was formed and certain rules promulgated for inspection work thereafter. It was decided that all local inspectors were to report to the State Dairy Inspector, and that official, after verifying the work of the local man by taking a sample of the dealer complained of, was to take such legal steps as the law provided, revoking license where necessary.

# Skowhegan Fire Department

SKOWHEGAN, MAINE, FEBRUARY 10, 1918

---

To the Board of Fire Commissioners and Citizens of Skowhegan:

We herewith submit the following report of the Fire Department.

The Fire Department at present consists of an Engineer, two assistant engineers, one engineer for steamer also one fireman, steamer company, hook and ladder company and union hose company of twelve men each and two permanent men. The apparatus is practically the same as last year.

There has been purchased during the year 500 feet of new hose, one pair of horses with harness and equipment for same; also another horse to replace one that died during the year.

The Fire Station has been remodelled to accomodate the horses and drop harness have been installed. There is on hand at present about 4000 feet of serviceable hose at Fire Station and 1000 feet condemned hose in basement for street purposes. Also 1½ tons steamer coal, 200 pounds carbonate of soda, ½ carboy sulphuric acid.

## Warrant for Annual Town Meeting

---

To Adam Simpson, Constable of the Town of Skowhegan, in the County of Somerset, Greeting:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Skowhegan, qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet in the Auditorium in Municipal building in said town on Monday, the 11th day of March, A. D. 1918, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:—

Article 1. To choose a Moderator.

Article 2. To choose a Town Clerk.

Article 3. To choose Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor, and fix their compensation.

Article 4. To elect a Park Commissioner to serve three years.

Article 5 .To elect a School Committee to serve three years.

Article 6. To see whether the Town will vote to express a preference as to the person whom the voters would desire to have appointed as Road Commissioner for the ensuing year, and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to maintain the Municipal Fuel Yard as now established and to pass all votes respecting the same.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to defray the expenses of the Fire Department the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.

(\$4,500 raised last year. Fire Commissioner recommend \$5,500 for 1918.)

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for making and repairing highways in said town and pass all votes respecting same.

(\$9,000 raised last year. Road Commissioner recommends \$10,000 for 1918.)



Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for making and repairing bridges and culverts in said town, and pass all votes respecting the same.

(\$1,500 raised last year. Road Commissioner recommends \$1,500 for 1918.)

Article 11. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid, as provided in section 19 of chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

(Last year voted "yes." Road Commissioner recommends "yes" for 1918.)

Article 12. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$1333.00 for the improvement of the section of state aid road as outlined in the report of the state highway commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges; the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of section 18, chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

(\$2,000 raised last year. The state will refund only on \$1,333 for 1918.)

Article 13. To see whether the town will vote to raise money, and what sum, for the maintenance of State Highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Sections 8, 17, 26, 27, 28, chapter 25, Revised Statute, 1916.

(\$450 raised last year. Road Commissioner recommends \$500 for 1918.)

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for breaking snow roads the present winter, and pass all votes respecting same.

(\$2,000 raised last year. Road Commissioner recommends \$3,500 for 1918.)

Article 15. To see if town will vote to raise a sum of money to install an electric motor to operate stone crusher, and pass all necessary votes.

(To replace worn out engine. Estimated to cost, installed, \$550.)

Article 16. To see if town will vote to raise a sum of money to repair old tractor and pass all votes respecting the same.  
(Estimated to cost by road commissioner \$450.)

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of Common Schools for the ensuing year.  
(\$5,500 raised last year. School Committee recommends \$7,000 for 1918.)

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of a High School for the year ensuing, and pass all votes respecting same.  
(\$3,600 raised last year. School Committee recommends \$5,000 for 1918.)

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the repair of the school buildings for the ensuing year and pass all votes respecting the same.  
(\$1,000 raised last year. School Committee recommends \$1,000 for 1918.)

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to purchase school supplies for the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.  
(\$1,300 raised last year. School Committee recommends \$1,300 for 1918.)

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to purchase text books for the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.  
(\$700 raised last year. School Committee recommends \$700 for 1918.)

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for Manual Training and Domestic Science for the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.  
(\$1,000 raised last year. School Committee recommends \$1,000 for 1918.)

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of an evening school for the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.  
(\$300 raised last year. School Committee recommends \$300 for 1918.)

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Superintending Committee to employ a School Physician or Physicians, as provided by Chapter 73, Public Laws of 1909, and raise a sum of money for the same.

(\$200 raised last year. School Committee recommends \$200 for 1918.)

Article 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be paid to the Trustees of the Skowhegan Free Public Library, for the ensuing year, on consideration that Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) of the same be paid to the Trustees of Russell Post Grand Army of the Republic.

(\$1,000 raised last year. Trustees recommend \$1,000 for 1918.)

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to defray expenses of Memorial Day, under such directions as may be deemed proper, and pass all votes respecting the same.

(\$175 raised last year. Selectmen recommend \$175 for 1918.)

Article 27. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for Hydrant Rental the ensuing year, and pass all votes respecting the same.

(\$2,500 raised last year. Selectmen recommend \$2,750 for 1918.)

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to defray expenses of the Police Department the ensuing year, and pass all necessary votes respecting the same.

(\$750 raised last year. Fire Commissioners recommend \$750 for 1918.)

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to light the streets the ensuing year and raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

(\$3,000 raised last year. Selectmen recommend \$3,000 for 1918.)

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of poor for year ensuing and pass all votes respecting the same.

(Expended last year \$5181.24. Selectmen recommend \$4,750 for 1918.)

Article 31. To see if the town will vote to employ one or more night watchmen for the ensuing year, and to provide compensation for the same.

(\$850 raised last year, Selectmen recommend \$850 for 1918.)

Article 32. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enforce the laws prohibiting fast and reckless driving of motor vehicles, to raise a sum of money and pass all votes respecting the same.

(\$450 raised last year. Selectmen recommend \$450.)

Article 33. To see if the town will vote to employ a book-keeper for town affairs, to raise a sum of money for same and pass all necessary votes.

(\$250 raised last year. Selectmen recommend \$350 for 1918.)

Article 34. To see if the town will vote to raise \$2,150 to pay the temporary loans obtained as per vote of special town meetings which include Public Safety Fund \$250.00, Traffic Laws \$150.00, North street McAdam \$750.00, Canaan Line Bridge \$500.00, Richardson Bridge \$500.00, and pass all necessary votes.

(Selectmen recommend paying temporary loans.)

Article 35. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to pay interest money for year ensuing, and to pass all votes respecting same.

(Expended last year \$7883.92. Selectmen recommend \$7,500 for year 1918.)

Article 36. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for officers' salaries for year ensuing and pass all votes respecting same.

(Paid last year \$4,433. Selectmen recommend \$4,500 for 1918.)

Article 37. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to insure the town's property and to pass all votes respecting the same.

(Selectmen recommend \$1,350. Expended last year \$1,373.)

Article 38. To see if the town will vote to exchange the town's hearse for a new one, raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

Article 39. To see if the town will vote to take some action regarding disposition of the Austin Farm and to pass all votes respecting the same.

Article 40. To see if the town will vote to raise Two Hundred Dollars (\$200) for band concerts for the summer, and pass all necessary votes.

(\$200 raised last year. Band asks for \$200 for 1918.)

Article 41. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the improvement of Coburn Park, to be expended under the direction of the Park Commissioners.

(\$500 raised last year. Park Commissioners recommend \$500 for 1918.)

Article 42. To see if the town will vote to pay One Hundred Dollars (\$100) to the Skowhegan Woman's Association, towards the support of the Public Rest Rooms for the year 1917.

(\$100 paid this association last year. Same amount asked for 1918.)

Article 43. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the necessary repairs of the cemeteries in town, and pass all votes respecting same.

(\$500 raised last year. Selectmen recommend \$550 for 1918.)

Article 44. To see if the town will allow One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of the cemetery appropriation for the Catholic Cemetery and pass such votes as are necessary.

(\$100 paid last year. Selectmen recommend \$100 for 1918.)

Article 45. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) for the expenses of the Committee on Public Safety and such other war committees as may be necessary to comply with the demands of state and national authorities.

(\$250 raised last year. Committee on Public Safety recommends \$300 for 1918.)

Article 46. To see if the town will vote to Macadamize East Front street from Mechanic street to South street, a distance of about 500 feet, to raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes respecting the same.

(Estimated to cost \$1,500 to macadamize this road.)

Article 47. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire such sum or sums of money as may be necessary for current expenses in anticipation of taxes the year ensuing, and pass all votes respecting same.

(Last year town voted to authorize selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.)

Article 48. To see if the town will vote to fix a date when all taxes shall be due and also a date from which interest shall be added to all taxes remaining unpaid and the rate of interest.

(Last year taxes due June 1st, interest after October 1st, if not paid December 1st. Selectmen recommend taxes due July 1st, interest after October 1st, if not paid December 1st.)

Article 49. To see what action the town will take in regard to the sidewalk and appurtenances in connection with the railroad bridge over the Kennebec river in Skowhegan village, and whether the town will vote to keep the same free from snow and ice, and become responsible to the Maine Central Railroad Company for such maintenance, and for all damages that may arise in connection therewith for so long a time as the town may vote.

Article 50. To see what action the town will take with reference to the adoption of the following proposed municipal ordinance:

"On and after May 1, 1918, no person shall conduct, carry on, or engage in the business of a public hackman or taxicab driver, in the town of Skowhegan, or use any team, automobile or other conveyance, in the business of transporting passengers for hire upon any public highway or town way within the limits of the town of Skowhegan, until he shall have procured a license therefor from the municipal officers of said town; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall apply to steam or electric railroads, or to drivers of stages transporting passengers from Skowhegan to other towns.

"Said municipal officers may in their discretion establish reasonable uniform regulations as to rates of fare, routes, places of standing, hours of doing business and other matters properly incidental to the reasonable control of said business, to which they may require the consent of any applicant for a license as a

condition of obtaining the same, and for a violation of which said license may be revoked, and may also require the payment of a reasonable license fee at the time of granting any license, which fee shall not exceed the sum of Two Dollars.

"Licenses granted under the authority of this ordinance shall be in force for the term of one year from the date of issue, unless sooner revoked, and shall be personal and non-assignable. Any license may be revoked by said municipal officers for cause shown, upon seasonable notice and hearing.

"Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a penalty of not exceeding twenty dollars, to be recovered as provided by law.

"This ordinance before taking effect shall be published for two successive weeks in some paper printed in the town of Skowhegan; and shall be submitted to a justice of the Supreme Judicial Court for his approval."

Article 51. To see if the town will vote to macadamize Cross street from North street to Court street, and raise a sum of money for the same and pass all necessary votes.

(Distance 500 feet; estimated cost \$1,000.)

Article 52. To see what sum the town will vote to reimburse the Chamberlain Bros. for loss of farm machinery while in the camps, located on the Washburn wood lot. Camp partially occupied by wood choppers employed by town when camps were destroyed. Loss sustained by said Chamberlain Bros. estimated at \$400.

Art. 53. To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk on the westerly side of Beech Street, raise a sum of money for the same, and pass all votes necessary, respecting the same.

(Distance about 200 feet, estimated cost \$85.00)

Art. 54. To see if the town will vote to construct a sewer on Beech Street, connecting with the Hathaway Street sewer and raise a sum of money, and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

(Distance about 200 feet, estimated cost, \$250.00.)

Art. 55. To see if the town will vote to re-cover High Street, from Railroad Crossing to Madison Avenue, and raise a sum of money for same, and pass all necessary votes.

(Distance 200 feet, estimated cost \$175.00.)

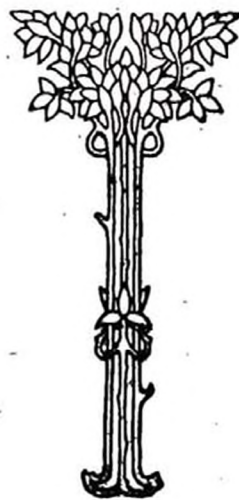
