1. Whereas, the 1975 National Convention of AAUW voted to award dues-free membership to fifty-year members, with such action covering only the national portion of an individual's total dues; and

Whereas, certain members of the Maine division of AAUW feel that such consideration be given to members of fifty years at the division level;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Maine division of AAUW will award dues-free membership to fifty-year members.

2. Whereas, the proposed Dickey-Lincoln dams would have adverse economic, social, and environmental consequences; and

Whereas, to build these dams before an accepted national energy plan requires them would irreversibly damage Maine's resources without corresponding benefits; be it

Resolved, that the Maine Division, AAUW, oppose any further studies or planning for the Dickey-Lincoln dams, unless an accepted national energy plan demonstrates a need for them.
