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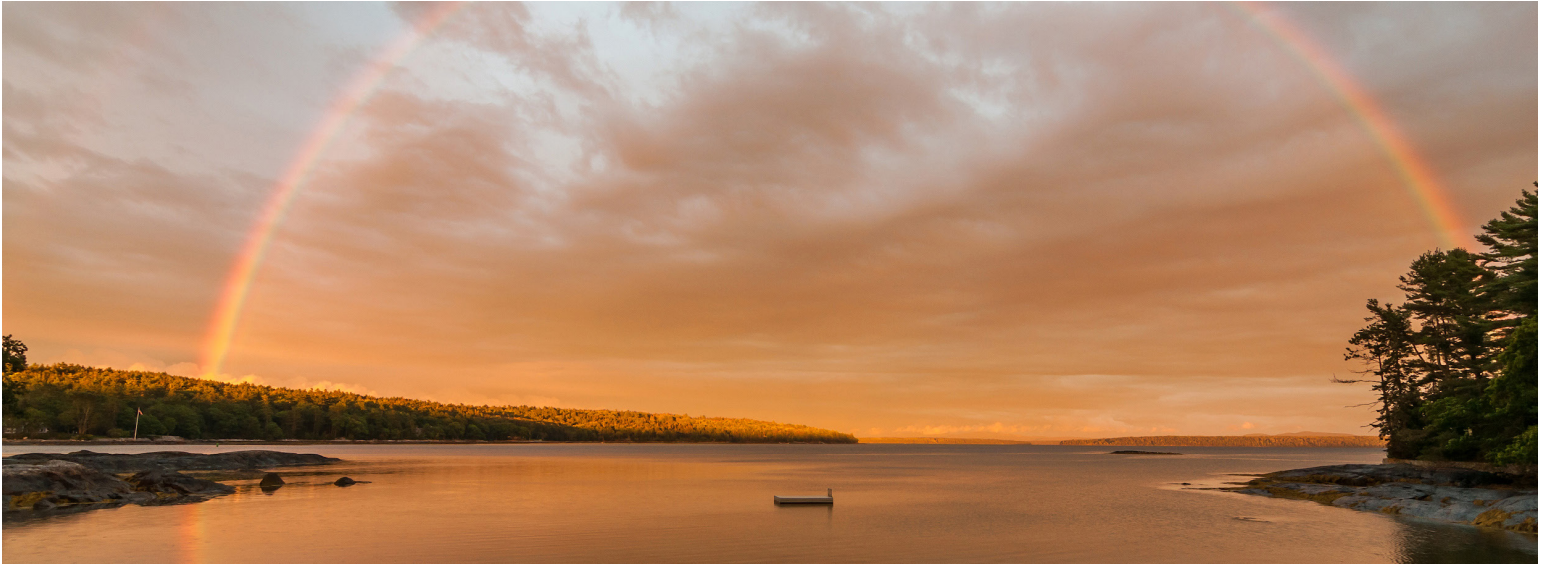

Letter from the Select Board

2019 has been a year of change and a year of progress. We started by welcoming James Dow to our board at the 2019 elections. Jim brings to the Board a vast amount of experience with duties such as employee management, a keen eye for the budgeting process and great familiarity with governmental process, land use regulations and grant writing. We also completed the hiring of a Town Administrator. With the help of Maine Municipal Association, we widely advertised the opening, received and reviewed many applications and interviewed several qualified applicants. We made the decision that Shawna Ambrose was the right person for the job. She not only had the right set of skills, she also had experience with our town government, a strong commitment to our community and a great work ethic. It has been our pleasure to have Jim and Shawna onboard to help us move forward on a variety of matters important to our Town.

Since last year's Town Meeting, we have taken action on several warrant articles approved at that meeting, in addition to hiring a Town Administrator. These included the completion of an engineering study of the near- and long-term maintenance needs of our town hall building and the replacement of the siding, doors and windows at our Town Wharf building. We also applied for and received a grant to help cover the cost of a replacement float at the South Blue Hill wharf, implemented a digital document storage plan that has reclaimed much needed space in the Town Office (over 2000 Pounds of paper was recycled and over 120,000 pages are now stored in the Cloud). Weekly Select Board meetings have been moved to Wednesday evenings at 5:30 pm. The Town Office is now open for business until 5.30 on Wednesdays as well.

Three Special Town Meetings were held during the year at which articles were passed to allow the Select Board to accept gifts and grants, to apply for and accept a

Community Development Block Grant on behalf of the Community Compass Organization (to provide local community social services), to increase the snow removal budget at the request of the Road Commissioner (made necessary by last year's extreme weather), to move money from the Select Board wage budget line to the road account to pay for an engineering study of Town roads (which is being completed by CES in cooperation with our Road Commissioner), and last but not least, to request money for Special Education for the Blue Hill Consolidated School.

As we look ahead in 2020, we expect to be working on a variety of issues, including long term improvement of Town roads, broadband infrastructure improvement, waste disposal costs, sewage treatment plant maintenance needs, Town Park improvements, the sale of tax acquired property, and solar power as a way to reduce electricity costs. We also expect to work with other area towns and George Stevens Academy's leaders on the school's long-term funding needs, to ensure that a local high school of good quality continues to be available for our young people.

We remain keenly aware of the need to keep the property tax burden manageable for all of our citizens as we address the Town's needs.

Thank you for your confidence in allowing us to serve you.

Blue Hill/Surry Transfer Station Annual Report 2019
Reduce/Reuse/Recycle

The Blue Hill/Surry Transfer Station finished the year within budget. Last year's elections brought new faces to the board, James Dow, Blue Hill and Betsy Armstrong, Surry. This brings to the board new sets of eyes and ears to help in development and planning for the future.

We realize that substantial increases in the cost to each sending town would be required for the facility to meet budget as it is currently staffed and its current hours of operation. As a means of lessening the financial impact to sending towns and taxpayers we are adjusting the hours of operation of the Transfer Station and the number of full-time employees. The new hours as of March 29, 2020 will be from 9 AM to 5 PM. The facility will also be closed on all holidays except Labor Day.

We are still in the "break in" period with the Fiberight facility in Hampden, as it is taking waste on a regular basis, but at this time they are still on an uphill climb to meet a recycling goal of 80% or more. They are securing markets for their products and continue to strive to meet the goals we were assured would be achieved.

Currently patrons can source recycle corrugated cardboard, newspapers, clean glass and redeemable bottles and cans at the recycling windows. Single stream is available which can accept all other recyclables such as Plastic HDPE 1 through 8, tin and aluminum cans, all mixed paper and Styrofoam.

Here are a few figures to give you a sense of quantities generated throughout the course of the year. We received and transported 4,154.12 tons of municipal solid waste. This represents 280 container truck loads. Single stream recycling totaled 350.69 Tons, and Fifty-one container truck loads. Construction and demolition debris received and transported totaled 801.03 tons. 698.38 tons of demolition and the 350.69 tons of single stream were all incinerated at the PERC facility, diverting 1,049.07 tons from being landfilled while creating electricity.

The costs of waste disposal are steadily increasing. The way to keep those costs in check is for each of us to reduce our waste.

The committee meets the 4th Tuesday of each month at 4PM at the Blue Hill Town Office. All meetings are open to the public.

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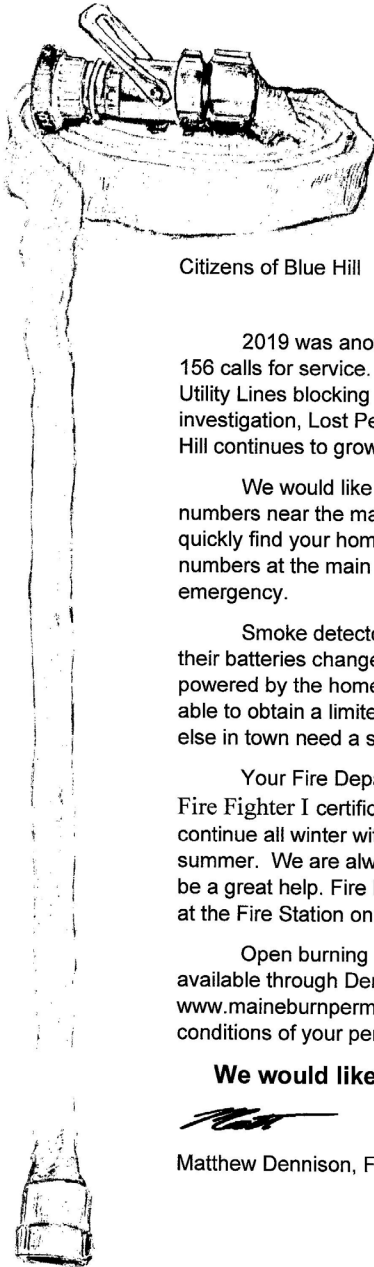

2019 was another busy year for the Blue Hill Fire Department with 156 calls for service. We responded to Fires, Vehicle Accidents, Trees / Utility Lines blocking the roads, Smoke, Odor or Carbon Dioxide investigation, Lost Persons, Water Emergencies, and more in 2019. As Blue Hill continues to grow, we anticipate our call volume will only increase.

We would like to remind people to properly post 4" tall street address numbers near the main road so we and other emergency services can quickly find your home. Since many of us may live down long drives, LARGE numbers at the main / access road are invaluable in the event of an emergency.

Smoke detectors only have a 10-year service life and need to have their batteries changed twice a year. While we know that smoke detectors powered by the home electrical system are more reliable, we were recently able to obtain a limited number of battery-operated units. If you or someone else in town need a smoke detector, please let the fire department know.

Your Fire Department currently has 4 new members training to obtain Fire Fighter I certification, weekly classes in all Firefighting aspects will continue all winter with skills testing and qualification taking place in the early summer. We are always looking for new members and these 4 members will be a great help. Fire Department meetings are held every Wednesday night at the Fire Station on Water Street.

Open burning in Blue Hill requires a State Burn Permit. Those are available through Denny and Dolly Robertson at (207) 374-5561 or online at www.maineburnpermit.com. Please remember to always follow the conditions of your permit.

Report to the Towns 2019 01.23.2020

PENINSULA AMBULANCE CORPS

This was the first year of Peninsula Ambulance Corps (PAC) 6th decade! Our longevity is due not only to the dedication of staff and management but also to the steadfast support of our Town governments and those many private citizens who respond to our appeal every year.

Our new manager, Alan Henschke, completed his first full year at PAC. The management team is continuing to reorganize our business model to improve efficiency and to match our staffing model with call volume patterns. 2019 performance demonstrates how these changes have improved our bottom line. We have had an increase in the availability of ambulances to serve the community and an increase in our call volume.

PAC has partnered with Healthy Peninsula, At Home Downeast, and Northern Light Blue Hill Hospital to provide Community Paramedicine services to the communities we serve and been approved by the State of Maine to do so. Funded by a grant, there is no charge to patients at this time. The program enables EMS staff to visit patients in their homes and provide services such as welfare checks, home safety evaluations, medication reconciliation, vital sign checks and other procedures as requested by a patient's physician. PAC then provides reports to the patient's physician and care givers.

We are proud of our 5 full-time and 25 part-time staff—the Paramedics and EMTs who make the program work. We continue to provide staff with continuing education for mandated federal and state classes. Our employees like their jobs and provide real benefit to the communities we serve.

Our fleet of three ambulances allows us to maintain our staffing model of two on-duty ambulances with a spare to use when an ambulance needs to be serviced. This also allows us to staff the third ambulance for a stand-by such as the Blue Hill Fair and at times of high call volume. We utilize management to staff the third ambulance during these high-volume times, which allows us to respond to more calls.

Our largest customers remain Medicare (federal government) and Medicaid/MaineCare (state government). Together, they represent 44% of our billing. However, for every \$1 of that billing, we are paid only \$0.70 at best. Medicaid reimbursements are often less than 50%. This accounts for most of our operating deficit. The remaining shortfall is the result of running a service in a large territory with a small population.

Call volume—the basis upon which we are reimbursed—was 1,448, an increase of 370 calls from 2018. Totals by Towns are given in the chart below. Inter-hospital patient transports, which were 39% of call volume, are also included in call totals. We identified another 25 calls (all non-emergency) which we could have completed if we had had available staff. This is down from 69 calls in 2018. This increase improves our income and our service to all residents of the Greater Blue Hill Peninsula.

We decrease our deficit in three ways: with the support of our town governments, by individual donations to our annual appeal, and by using volunteer board members to accomplish administrative and fund-raising tasks.

This year we are asking our Towns for the same support as last year: \$18.50 for the operating budget and \$4.43 for the ambulance reserve fund, for a total of \$22.93 per capita. Next year, in addition to increasing our call volume, we will be further invigorating our annual campaign.

Staff and ambulances are the visible aspects of PAC, but community loyalty and the funds provided by the Towns are its lifeblood. Our annual appeal to the public provides an essential and remarkably consistent source of support, but we must rely to the greatest extent on the common sense of Town governments and citizens to understand the necessity for an ambulance service, and that, if we don't hang together and make it work, no one else will.

Dear Fellow Citizens,

This has been a good year for everyone who utilizes our bay and wharf facilities.

The Mackerel run was a bit later than usual and not quite as robust a school of fish as in past years, but this did not seem to dampen the enthusiasm of the fisherman a bit. It was pleasing to see groups enjoying the sport while socializing with other fisher folk.

I was equally pleased to see a high degree of teamwork between commercial and recreational folks enjoying, and together utilizing this maritime opportunity.

We sponsored a "Lifejackets for Lobsterman" event at both the South Blue Hill and the Town wharfs last summer. This program offered a variety of different styles of flotation devices at 50% below retail price and was well attended.

We had a 36' lobster boat break it's mooring and drift across Blue Hill Bay in a full gale one night. She came to rest on Mill Island just North of the Falls Bridge where she grounded out. The following morning a team effort including the boat owner, Marine Contractors, and helpful citizens gathered and with work and good luck she was patched and gumped to be floated off at High Tide. She steamed towards East Blue Hill to be hauled out for repairs. I wish to thank all those who unselfishly gave of their time and abilities to help the skipper, crew and I save this vessel.

We had another mishap occur in the Salt Pond when a lobsterman struck a rock disabling his outboard motor and the outgoing tide

carried them under the bridge towards the bay. As they passed some ledges, just below the falls, his wife jumped overboard and managed to get the bow line tied to a boulder.

I received the call at about 4 PM. The caller added that the man had suffered a medical event. I notified Blue Hill Fire Department and Peninsula Ambulance for assistance. Upon arrival, they went to work stabilizing the patient and carrying them to the awaiting ambulance for transport to the hospital and on for further care. The neighbors came down and offered their dock for the boat for the night.

Because of the Fire Department and Peninsula Ambulance have advanced training and abilities, the patient is on the mend and I hope he can lobster once again next year. All made possible by the wonderful people of Blue Hill.

The NO WAKE ZONE imposed in Blue Hill Harbor this year was a success made possible by the marine operators who shouldered the burden and made it work. I remain deeply humbled and forever grateful.

Lastly, I offer a "Thank You" to the Selectmen and Marine Resources Committee for their continued support. I also wish a tribute for the superior work of my Assistant Harbormaster and Administrative Assistant, John Chapman. His hard work and treasured guidance are the adhesive that holds it all together.

Tree Warden's Report

My philosophy concerning the trees of Blue Hill is that there is always an optimum moment to take down a tree. Every single tree will come down eventually, no exceptions. For weed trees, that moment is usually when they are still small. For shade trees, which we want large, that moment is when they are mature. For lumber trees, we want to harvest them before the wood begins to deteriorate. Knowing when the optimum time has arrived is the challenge.

There is a shade tree in the town park that I think has reached that moment. It is an aspen. You might not know it to look at it. It looks more like a hickory. Very large, very tall, shaggy bark, next to the big white pine tree you see as you drive in. I think it should come down soon. The top is starting to die off. It will make a good lumber tree.

We are lucky to have several good arborists in the area. Lots of good tree knowledge out there. We had a crew in the Old Settlers Cemetery in 2018 who removed five ancient oaks without damaging a single headstone. In 2019 we had a sick elm tree on Tucker Lane, sandwiched between two buildings with wires overhead. That was an especially difficult removal which required a large crane but was successfully accomplished and beautifully cleaned up with minimum inconvenience to the neighborhood. We'll be taking bids on the tree in the town park this spring.

Back to those five oaks from the cemetery; four of them were rotten to the core, but one was solid all the way through. That tree was cut into saw logs which were transported to my sawmill in East Blue Hill. That tree I am calling the Jonathan Fisher oak because it was probably planted by the august minister himself and he was planted under that tree fourteen years later. The plan is to slice the butt log (36" in diameter) in thirds with an Alaska chainsaw mill. Then the pieces will be quartersawn to an inch and a

quarter on my bandsaw mill. The resulting lumber will be perfect for cutting boards.

The cutting boards will be a bit smaller than the elm boards we made in 2002. There were 400 elm boards manufactured by the town that year and they sold at town meeting for \$40 apiece. We'll see how many finished cutting boards we can get from a twelve-foot oak log.

The oak boards will feature a silhouette of Jonathan Fisher and a burned-in inscription. I have no doubt they will sell rapidly to the people of Blue Hill.

Blue Hill Public Library - Municipal Report 2019-2020

In 2019 the Blue Hill Library continued to be a community gathering place, a common ground for residents of, and visitors to the Blue Hill Peninsula.

1. Activities

During 2019 BHPL:

- Welcomed 126,442 patron visits. The library averaged 417 visits each business day
- Issued 801 new library cards, a 28% increase compared to the 625 cards issued in 2018.
- Loaned 105,457 physical and digital items (books, audiobooks, movies, etc.). Use of physical items in the library collection decreased slightly, 2%, while digital library use increased 17%.
- Answered 2,328 reference questions. In addition, library staff and volunteers provided 1,391 technology help sessions to patrons.
- Hosted 15,360 WiFi sessions and 7,577 sessions on our in-house computers and tablets.
- Sponsored 694 cultural programs that attracted 10,339 attendees. Of these cultural programs, 429 were geared towards adults with 6,083 attendees, and 265 youth programs were enjoyed by 4,256 children, teenagers, and caregivers.
- Was the site for an additional 487 community-sponsored events (lectures, movies, meetings, etc.) with an estimated attendance of 5,388. Combining library-sponsored and community-sponsored events, BHPL was a gathering place for 1,181 events and 15,727 attendees.



2. Funding

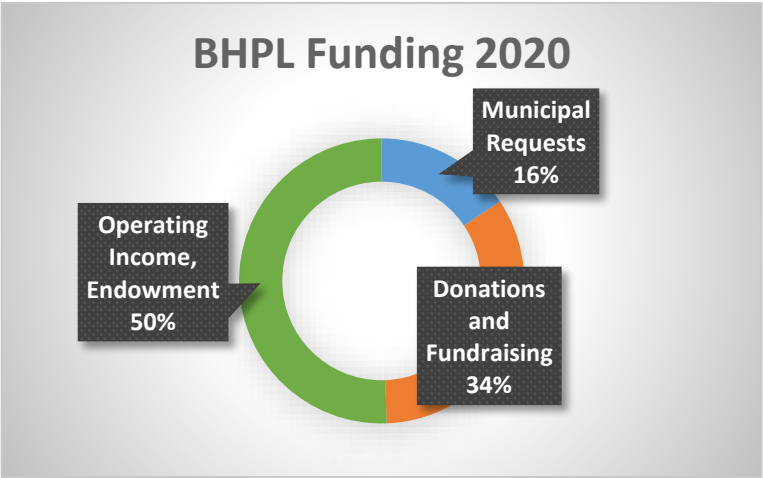
The 2020 operating budget is projected at \$637,736. Funds for operations are broken down as follows: **Operating Income**, primarily from endowment, 50%; **Annual Fundraising**, 34%; **Municipal Funding**, 16%, provided by Blue Hill, Penobscot, Sedgwick and Surry.

The 2020 library budget increased by \$66,000 compared to 2019. Most of the overall increase (\$62,792) is being borne by increased funding from the endowment. The largest part of that increase is related to a new staff position, made possible by a gift to the BHPL endowment. The “Ruth Slaven Teen Services and Outreach Librarian” is now serving our middle through high schoolers and is meeting a previously unmet need in our community, both during and after school hours.

All of us at BHPL are proud to serve our community, six days, 55 hours weekly, year-round. We thank you for the honor and privilege.

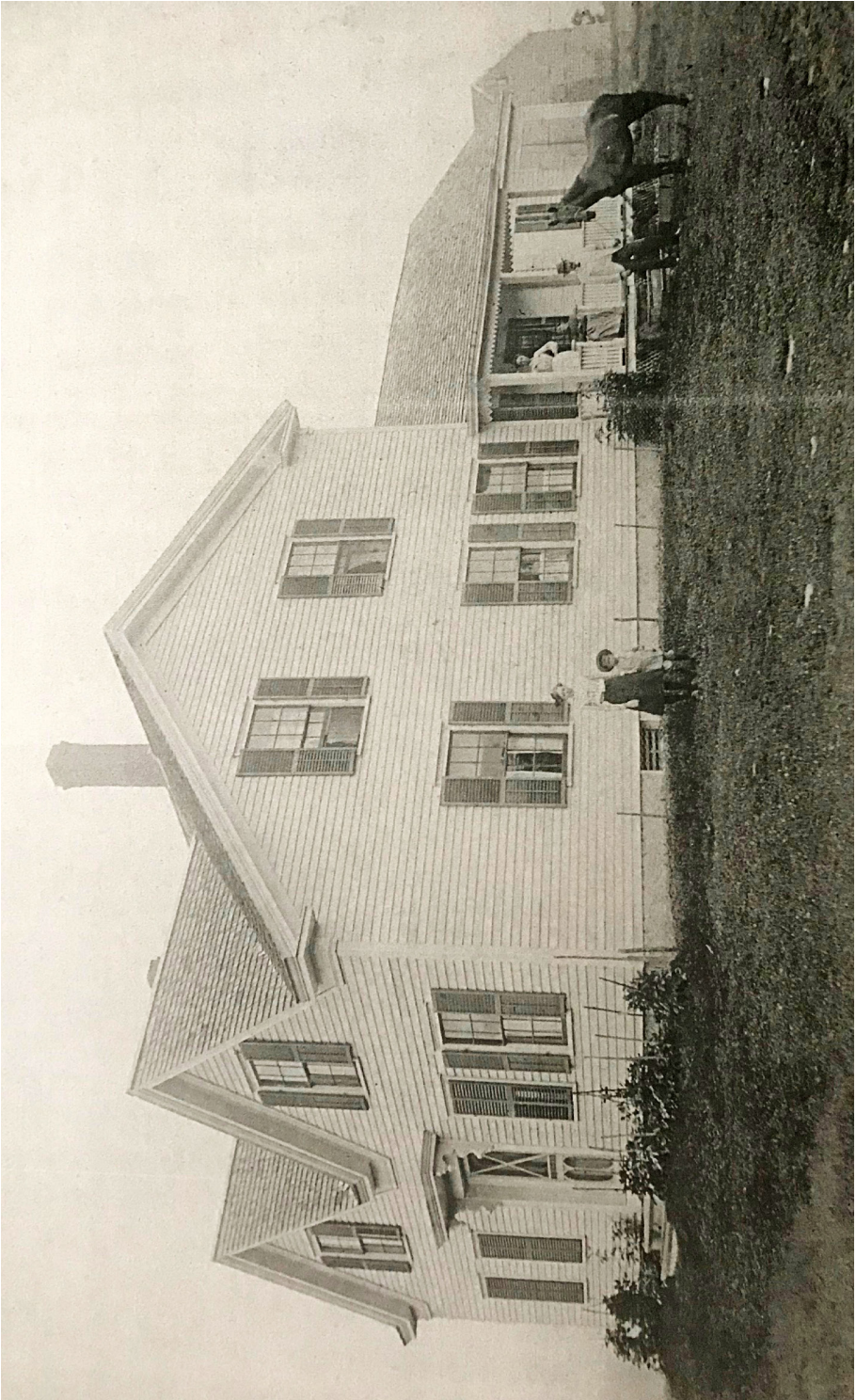
We continue our program and facilities planning to correct long-standing issues and set GSA up for the next few decades with a first rate campus and programming, looking at all we do to be sure we are making the best use of the resources we have, and forming plans to get the resources we need. Finances

The state-set tuition rate for FY19 was \$11,759.07, but our actual per-student-cost was close to \$14,700 (comparable to the costs of similarly-sized public high schools). To close tuition gaps like this one, we have, for years, relied on three additional revenue sources: *income from our endowment* (following strict laws limiting the amount we can spend); *philanthropic gifts* to the school, including the annual GSA Fund which goes directly into the operating budget; and *surplus revenue from our international boarding program*. Revenue from that third source has diminished dramatically over the past two years, and is unlikely to rebound. For that reason, we have begun discussions with the "tuitioning" towns (including Blue Hill) about increasing tuition (Maine law allows this) to help us close the tuition gap.

Blue Hill Consolidated School

The Blue Hill Consolidated School Community is committed to providing a well-rounded education that prepares each student, academically and personally, to be a responsible, creative, self-motivated, and thoughtful citizen of our community, nation, and world. - BHCS Student Handbook

It is a privilege to update the Town of Blue Hill on our year at Blue Hill Consolidated School. In September, we welcomed 47 new students in PK-8, and after some moving in and out throughout the year, our current enrollment is 258 students. It is my goal that as you look through our budget this year that the numbers have meaning. Included are costs for electricity, school supplies, busing, and so much more, but my hope is that you see how your tax dollars are being used to educate all the students in Blue Hill--from pre-K through grade 12--in a way that we can all be proud.

First, our renovation project is very close to being completed at this point. All of the inside work is done and the final piece of work to be completed is securing and filling the cistern that will supply water to our sprinkler system in the event of a fire. We are very pleased with all of the work that has been done to our building to make it more accessible and safe while also creating more spaces in our building that are usable for students during the school day.

One of these spaces that I'm most excited about is our RtI/Title I room that we call "The Learning Loft". This is where teachers Tarsha Astbury and Katie Danielson provide learning intervention for students who need extra support in math and reading but who are not in our Special Education program. Through the hard work of these teachers and our faculty who provide intervention in the regular classrooms, our school-wide math and literacy data for the school year of 2018-2019 showed huge gains from the Fall to the Spring on our AIMSweb benchmark assessments, and we exceeded our goals! As a frame of reference when looking at the data below, our goals (based on national best practice guidelines) are 80-85% of students will meet or exceed standards using our regular instructional modes in the classroom (Tier 1), 10-15% of our students will need strategic interventions, most often by their classroom teacher (Tier 2), and 5-10% of our students will need intensive interventions in a separate setting (Tier 3).

Each year we spend time as a faculty reviewing and updating at least one area of our curriculum. In the '18-19 school year we reviewed our health curriculum and began to review social studies, as well. This

year we are piloting a comprehensive, school-wide health curriculum called *The Great Body Shop*. We like that the monthly topics for all grade levels are the same, but implemented using materials and lessons that are age-appropriate. The state learning standards for social studies were updated late last school year, so over the summer teachers reviewed our current units with the standards and found areas where we needed more resources. A goal for our social studies teachers is to have our unit plans outlined to account for all of the learning standards by September of 2020.

As you might imagine our school is like most others in that we spend a good deal of time thinking about school safety. This fall our entire staff was trained by our school counselor, Megan Granger, and Maine State Police detective Greg Roy in the ALICE program. ALICE is a highly-recommended program used worldwide to train people in a wide range of organizations how to survive a violent critical incident. This is a training that is responsible for us to have, but one we hope we never need to use.

This year we've had to be very flexible as our building was under construction. The dedication and flexibility of the staff and community during the renovations exemplifies an important mindset we strive to instill in our students: by working together to find creative solutions and not being discouraged by setbacks, we can reach our goals.

Finally, I want to thank the many families, volunteers, organizations, our incredible staff, and our school board for your support of our school. I invite all Blue Hill residents to attend school events, volunteer at the school, follow us online, or just get to know the kids next door to fully appreciate what your tax dollars accomplish. Thank you for your continued support of our school, our teachers, and our students.

Letter from the Superintendent

February, 2020

To My Fellow Citizens of Blue Hill:

This year's proposed school budget is up \$350,829.90, or 5.78%. The School Board has worked through seven versions of this document, making cuts in each version. The story of this budget is really this: Of the \$350,829.90, \$316,299.10 is fixed in that it represents our two construction loan payments coupled with the increase in special education for next year. So, minus that stuff, the rest of the budget up 0.86%.

Our multi-year school renovation project is basically done, with the last piece, final hook up of the sprinkler system, scheduled to be completed by Town Meeting. The school has been refreshed, it is ADA compliant, it is sprinkled, the parking lot is awesome, and the new teaching and learning spaces are amazing. A special shout out to the new Fab Lab, one of the only such facilities in Maine. Thanks to the Town of Blue Hill for supporting this amazing 2.4-million-dollar renovation!

State subsidy is at \$313,537.40 this year, and is projected for \$402,427.88 in 2020-21, an \$88,890.40 increase. This is potentially very good news, if that figure holds up through the current legislative session which will adjourn in mid-April.

As always, BHCS is an active place where students and adults thrive. Shelly Schildroth, Derek Perkins, and their

staff have done such a wonderful job with the children of Blue Hill this year. It's a pleasure for me to be associated with such an impressive organization full of skilled, committed adults, working hard for our kids.

During the Legislature's second session, we will review more than 650 pieces of legislation covering a wide variety of topics. Last year, our Legislature passed bills to expand health care coverage, reign in the skyrocketing prices of prescription drugs, address climate change, lift up working Maine families, support our schools, improve broadband access, and provide meaningful property tax relief.

When it comes to health care, we are focused on making sure comprehensive care is not limited by age, gender, pre-existing conditions, or income. There are bills up for discussion that would address surprise billing, cap out-of-pocket costs for medications like insulin, and improve dental health coverage. Every Mainer deserves access to quality, affordable health care, and we are fighting for just that.

With a roadmap provided by the 10-year strategic economic development plan from Gov. Mills, our Legislature will also be working to implement policies that grow jobs and support local industries. Mainers are willing to work, and we need secure, good-paying jobs that support our families, strengthen our communities, and grow our economy.

I continue to serve on the State and Local Government Committee, where we are working on legislation related to Maine's aging population, our state's roads, and procurement of American-made goods.

The work I do in Augusta is an extension of the important work we all do here for our community. It is about moving forward together, sharing the load, and making sure that everything we do reflects shared values, hopes, and dreams about what we want this community, and our state, to be. Blue Hill Heritage Trust

Blue Hill Heritage Trust's mission is, "to lead in conserving land, water, and wildlife habitat on the greater Blue Hill Peninsula. To teach and practice a stewardship ethic. To promote ecological, economic, and community health for this and future generations." We welcome use of our properties for a variety of uses including hunting, and we hope that the community is taking full advantage of our land and trails.

We have not added this year to the 1524 acres we own in Blue Hill, and our most popular property in town continues to be the Mountain, though Peter's Brook and Penny's Preserve are close contenders. In 2019, the Trust voluntarily paid \$5342 in real estate taxes to Blue Hill and a total of \$17,100 to all the towns in our service area. Our lands are open to the public and we maintain trails, but we continue to believe that it is important to keep land on the tax rolls. In addition, our properties provide a return in ecosystem services, public health, in recreational and traditional uses, and indirectly in the tourist dollars that flow to our area precisely because our communities protect and preserve land and water.

The Trust provided many community activities in Blue Hill this year, including our Spring lecture series and the Collaborative Speaker Series presenting Sue Morse's talk on Cougars at Emlen Hall. We worked with the Blue Hill Library to bring Wabanaki REACH to do a workshop, and with SEED Barn on a Sow Dry Seed Workshop for Pierce's Pond Plant Restoration at the fishway. We also hosted full-moon hikes on Blue Hill Mountain and many other outdoor activities for the community and schools.

Over last summer, we held public listening sessions in all our towns, including two in Blue Hill. I want to thank all those who took time out of a busy summer to share ideas and ask questions. In our annual report this year we will give an overview of those sessions, as well as the public survey we conducted last year.

Blue Hill Heritage Trust is committed to both conserving land in our towns and serving those communities, and we want to thank all our Blue Hill supporters for being our partners in this work. We are very much looking forward to another good year in 2020 and hope to see many of you out enjoying the land and water this coming year.

Budget Committee Report

The warrant articles to be put to votes at the 2020 Town Meeting will result in an approximately 13% increase in property taxes if approved as recommended by the Select Board, School Committee, and Budget Committee. While spending on general municipal and educational activities is up only modestly (with a few exceptions discussed below), the fact that the Town has substantially depleted its Undesignated Funds reserves means that a much higher proportion of our “regular” spending must be funded from property taxes.

As you consider how to vote on the various articles, recognize that, in the future, there will be a much closer linkage between total appropriations and property taxes.

Summary of Budget (and Hypothetical Property Tax Implications). As shown in the table below, the total appropriations recommended by the Select Board/School Committee for Town Meeting is \$9.7 million, of which \$8.0 million would be funded from property taxes.

While the Budget Committee agrees with and supports most of the Select Board and School Committee recommendations as outlined in the Town Meeting Warrant, there are several areas in which our recommendations differ or we think more context would be useful as you consider how to vote. These are discussed below.

Select Board and Road Commissioner Compensation and Benefits (Articles 30, 31, 33-35). In 2019, the Town paid health insurance benefits amounting to \$31,000 to the Select Board (\$19,000) and Road Commissioner (\$12,000). The Select Board also received \$12/hr. compensation and received, in total, more than \$22,000 in wages and other wage benefits.

Because the town was transitioning to a Town Administrator, the Budget Committee voted to recommend these expenditures in 2019, providing time to assess the effects of this move. We asked that the Select Board change their compensation to a fixed stipend in 2020 and they agreed to consider this.

The Budget Committee’s fixed stipend recommendation reflects the practice of other towns in the area. We believe that this method of compensation provides an equal pay structure, more transparency, and a better ability to manage the Town’s cost structure. Under the current policy, Medicare-eligible officials cost the Town much less than

others; if none of the Select Board members were eligible for Medicare, the cost of this health insurance benefit could have been \$20,000 higher.

We question whether the Town should provide health insurance benefits to part-time elected officials. We also feel that the \$12 hourly rate for the Select Board is not a fair total compensation level. Therefore, the Budget Committee indicated that it would prefer higher wage compensation for the Select Board and Road Commissioner in conjunction with the elimination of health insurance benefits for these elected officials.

However, the articles drafted by the Select Board do not provide for a stipend and, instead, largely replicate the compensation package voted on in 2019 before the Town Administrator was hired. The only change is that the Town would now pay only 80%, rather than 100%, of the cost of Select Board health insurance, matching the benefit plan in place for Town office staff.

Therefore, the Budget Committee recommends approval of the \$12/hr., \$20,000 Select Board wage article and, for health insurance, appropriation of \$10,000 toward the Select Board's costs. For the Road Commissioner, we recommend an \$8,000 stipend in lieu of Town-provided health insurance. This would result in the equivalent (approximately) of an \$11,000 stipend for each Select Board member—if divided equally among the members.

GSA Tuition (Article 5). After initially requesting more than \$2,000 per student in increased tuition, George Stevens Academy (GSA) is now proposing a \$300 per student increase in "Insured Value Factor" payments from each "sending town," including Blue Hill. This question will be decided in a referendum vote on Friday, April 3.

The Budget Committee recommends a "no" vote on this question, for several reasons. While we recognize that GSA may well need increased tuition to maintain its current programs, we also believe that the short time frame between GSA's initial request for additional Town funds and our Town Meeting has not provided an appropriate opportunity for a robust and transparent discussion about the GSA budget, its current and future transparency (financial and operational) with sending towns, and whether sending towns will be afforded an enhanced role in GSA governance.

Until these discussions take place and a consensus is reached between the principal sending towns and GSA, we believe it is premature and counterproductive to authorize this payment. Looking forward, however, we expect that the sending towns will support GSA with increased tuition payments (looking much more like the \$2,000-3,000 per student initially discussed than the \$300 proposed for this year) as part of an agreement that would provide increased transparency and, perhaps, governance rights.

Town Road Repairs/Maintenance (Article 6). There has been discussion over the last two years (and more) about the state of our Town roads (as distinct from the State roads that are the major arteries through Town) and the need to substantially increase our spending to rehabilitate these roads, improve their condition and reduce our future costs to maintain and repair them. It appears that we have been under-

investing in our road infrastructure for many years. Therefore, the Budget Committee supports substantially increased spending on our roads.

This year's Warrant includes three articles related to road repair and rehabilitation: the general repair and maintenance article we vote on each year (this year with a moderately increased amount), a \$100,000 article to continue work on Parker Point Rd., and a referendum article to appropriate \$250,000 for ditching and clearing brush alongside other Town roads.

We support all of these articles (totaling \$998,100 with our recommended \$8,000 Road Commissioner Stipend amount) and, most importantly, encourage voters to keep in mind that, looking forward over the next decade, we may well need to spend something more like \$1.1-1.2 million annually to maintain our "good" roads and rehabilitate our "bad" ones. We believe that planning for this fundamental priority should inform voters' views on some of the other appropriations requested at Town Meeting.

Harbor Dredging (Article 7). The Town finds itself in the unenviable position of having invested \$104,000 toward the cost of an Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) study of the costs and benefits of dredging a channel in Blue Hill Harbor, but \$20,000 short of the latest estimate of the cost to finalize the study. The Town will be asked to vote on an appropriation of this \$20,000 as an April 3 referendum vote. We use the term "unenviable" because, since the Town originally voted to appropriate \$80,000 for the study in 2013, several aspects of the proposed dredging project have become less attractive, making the overall project a more difficult decision than it might originally have been.

The two principal changes (other than the fact that the cost to the Town of the study will be 50% higher than originally planned) are dredging cost and the Town's share of this cost. In 2015, the total cost of the project was reported to be \$1 million and the Town's share was \$100,000. The draft ACOE report reviewed in 2019 showed estimated costs of \$3.5 million for dredging a 6' channel. The Town also learned that our share of this cost will be 20%--with no interest-free loan available. The Town's share of the dredging cost appears to have risen from \$100,000 (with 10% sharing) to \$700,000 currently.

In addition, there will be additional costs—100% borne by the Town—for floats, etc. to connect our wharf to the channel/turning basin for all-tides access (estimated cost undetermined as of the date of this report), an additional \$250,000 if the channel were dredged to a 7' depth, and a likelihood that the actual dredging costs will exceed the ACOE estimates.

While this report has been written prior to the public hearing on the subject, we believe that the increased cost to the Town of the dredging project may well have pushed this project from one that is worthwhile to one that is not justified in the face of other Town spending priorities.

Third Party Requests (Articles 68-83). This year, the Town requested that all third party requests (all from non-profits), include a standardized form that, among other things, identifies the organization's mission and services, how it helps the Town of Blue Hill, the basis for its request of the town and other information. We hope that, with all parties providing information on a standardized basis, it will be easier for voters to compare these requests, all of which represent worthy causes.

Most of the third parties requested essentially the same amounts appropriated last year, with the exceptions of the WIC program and the Blue Hill Public Library.

We support the increase for the WIC Program, which is based on a formula reflecting the number of people actually served in Town and, we understand, is applied consistently in their requests of all local towns.

We do not support the requested increase for the Library. While the Library is a treasured resource for our community, we believe that, in the context of our Town's depleted reserves, future spending increases for roads and education on the horizon, and the substantial increases in property taxes, maintaining the 2019 appropriation amount balances fairness to the Library and to the broader Blue Hill community.

Public Works Position (Article 37). The Select Board has incorporated an appropriation to establish a "public works" position. Their view is that this person can perform some of the outdoor maintenance/cleanup and interior "handyman" work that the Town currently contracts out to third parties, while providing the Town with more control of schedules, quality, and priorities.

We support this article, which appears to have minimal effect on overall spending. But voters should recognize that this year's appropriation covers only 7/12 of the expected annual cost going forward.

Looking Forward. For the first time in many years, property taxes will closely track our spending appropriations. And, while the Select Board and School Committee have, in our view, exercised due care in managing the Town's finances overall, we also foresee continued pressure to increase spending going forward. In particular, the increased cost of education (both at the Consolidated School and, likely, at GSA), the need to invest more in the Town's roads, and, possibly, substantial costs associated with the proposed harbor dredging project will further drive property taxes to higher rates of increase than we have seen in the recent past.

We encourage Town voters to think carefully about their priorities for Town spending, their appetite for further increases in property taxes to fund these priorities, and the effect of property tax increases on those who are already finding it difficult to meet their obligations.

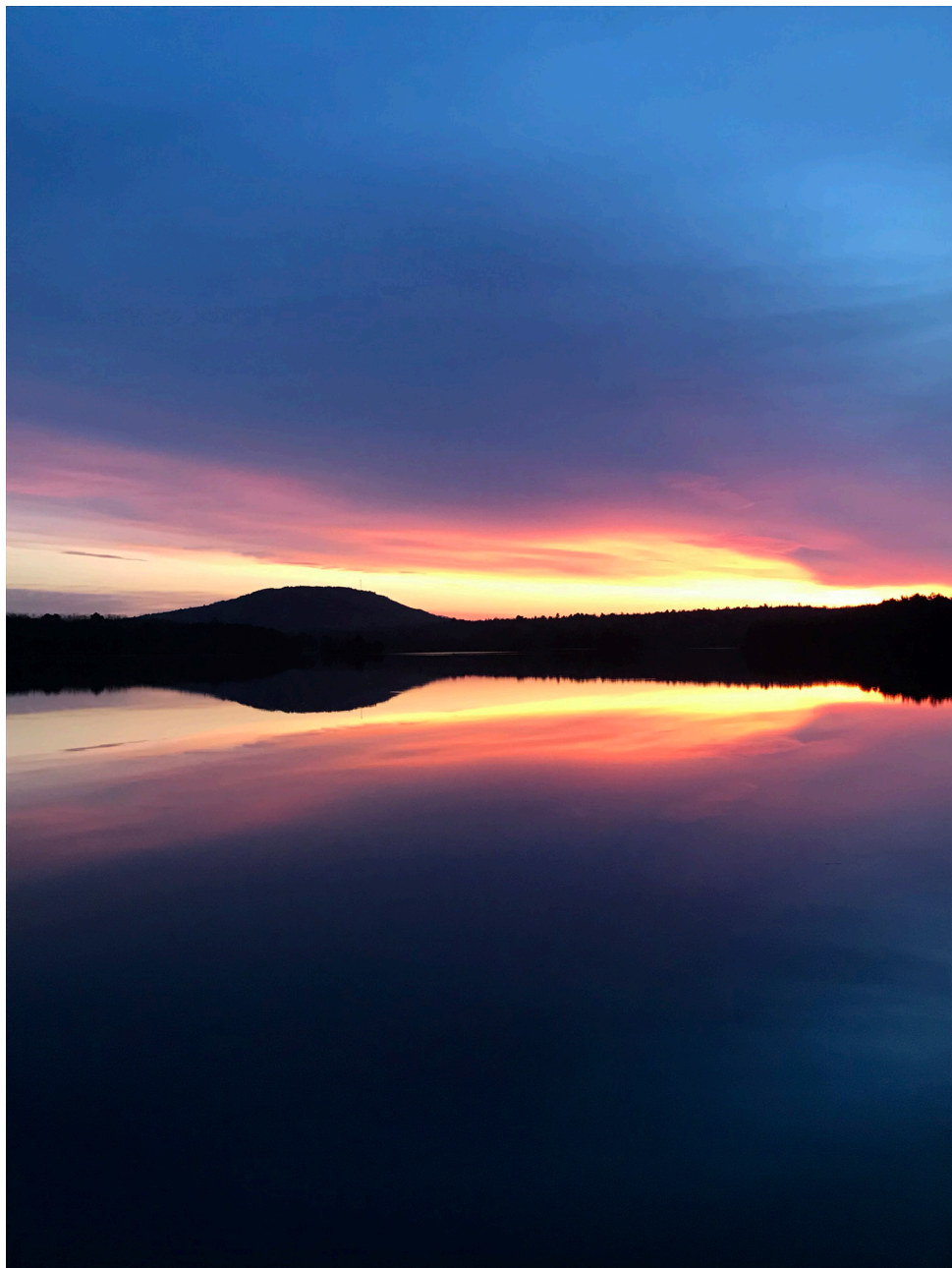
