The baby - Bertha - has had a very bad day - cried most all day.

Very pleasant this morning - Clouded up and was quite cool all day.

I fixed up the pig-pen etc. this fore-noon.

Mr. Smith and I put a cause-way in the road and hauled two loads of gravel this after-noon.

Mrs. Smith and Grace came over this after-noon.

Shelen and Lizzie came out this way and went to the corner.

Opened barrel of flour.

Pleasant this morning; clouded up and snowed some this after-noon and evening.

I hauled brush and brushed the house and barn.

Sarah and I went down to meeting this evening; Mr. Brown did not come over, and I led the meeting.

Grace stayed with Cora this evening.

Mr. Smith helped Uncle Ira kill his hog.

Mr. Samuel Smith came in here to see Mr. Smith, - got dinner here.

I put a causeway "in" down by the bars, fixed up the pig-pen, brushed round the well, went out to Mr. James Dunn's and hired him to work for me two weeks for \$7.00, got horse halter to Father's etc.

Helen came out this afternoon to help Clara make her dress and will stay all night.

Mrs. Smith went out to Mother's visiting.

Mr. Smith worked for Uncle Ira, cutting bushes.

Thrashed and winnowed (in the wind) one barrel of oats, cut some wood and went to the Corner this evening, to see Mr. Rogers. I am to teach school in Young's Cove at \$3. per Mr.

Sarah went home to day.

Helen helped Clara on her dress this fore-noon and went home this after-noon.

Mr. Smith worked for Uncle Ira, cutting bushes.
