UMPD follows the public health protocols of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Maine Center for Disease Control, the Maine Emergency Management Agency and Maine Public Safety guidance for law enforcement agencies.

If you call UMPD (207.581.4040) to request officer assistance, the dispatch personnel will ask if you may have been exposed to COVID-19.
