I stayed to Ezra Lyon's all
day.

Pleasant and mild.

I seamed 250 mustards
(22) and 28⁰⁰ oils (1.96) \$2.18
Father brought Helen to Eastport
en route for Clinton, Mass. He
called to the factory. I cut
5 cases of plume tin on the sham
this evening for Arthur.

Dull.

I seamed 29⁰⁰ oils \$2.03
Got out of tin and did not
work for about 1 1/2 hours.

Cloudy.
I seamed 30⁰⁰ oils
\$2.10

THURSDAY, NOV. 12, 1891

Wea.

Pleasant. ^{night} Rained last

I seamed 600 mustards
(34) and 1800 oils - (1.26)
1.50 Geo. Antone and I work-
ed 4 1/2 hours this evening
making cases, and in the ship-
ping room (90) = 2.70

I seamed 700 mustards
(63) and 1800 oils - (1.25) - 1.89

Pleasant and cool.

I seamed 1200 oils (54) and

a suit of clothes ^{11.25}, a hat ^{1.50} and a
pair of gloves ^{1.00} to Bradford's

Will and Sarah came over to
Mr. Smith's last night; they came
over here to dinner. Geo. M. C. Dick
brought Mr. Smith home to-night,
he having hurt his foot gratulat-
ing. I rode to the Corner with him
and went to Southport with Arthur.

Cloudy and windy.

I seamed 700 mustards (63)
and 2500 oils (1.75) - 2.38
We worked this evening

TUESDAY 17

Wea.

Rained this fore-noon. Wind
blows a gale.

I did not feel very much
like work to-day. I seamed
2400 oils ^{1.60}

WEDNESDAY, NOV. 18, 1891

Wea.

Quite pleasant and cool.
I scanned 26⁰⁰ oils. \$1.52

Ther.

SATURDAY, NOV. 21, 1891

Wea.

Pleasant and moderate.
We only worked this forenoon. I started from Eastport about 3 o'clock and walked part of the way to Pembroke and got a ride part of the way. I went down to Will Morgan's to supper and then to the S. of V.

Pleasant.

Don't know how many I scanned, Ezra Lyons and I went down town this evening. I bought a book - "Campfires of Lepoliam"

SUNDAY 22

Wea.

Looks some like a storm.
I went over to see Mr. Smith a little while. His foot is little or no better, he not being able to step on it yet. I came down to Eastport tonight with Arthur. Mr. Smith killed his cow, "Spot" last week.

Pleasant and mild.
I scanned to day but don't know how many.

Wea.

Cloudy.
I scanned 22⁰⁰ oils \$1.34
Benj. Dudley and I went down town this evening.

TUESDAY, NOV. 24, 1891

Wea.

Rained some last night.
Pleasant and mild to-day.
I seamed 900 mustards (.81)
and 900 oils (.63) - \$1.44

Ezra Lyons and I roused up
and went down town about 12
o'clock to the fire - a sardine factory
burned down.

I seamed 2400 oils - \$1.68
Geo. Antone and Howard Antone
called here a few minutes this
evening and then went down
town.

Thanksgiving.

Pleasant and mild.
We worked in the factory till
about 10 o'clock this forenoon.
I started about 1 o'clock and
got home about 6 o'clock. Walked
most of the way home.

Big rain last night and
this morning. Cleared up pleasant,
this afternoon. ~ I worked
around the barn this forenoon, and
went out to father's this afternoon.
~ Mr. Smith's foot is

went down to Will Morgan's. ^{this forenoon.}

Wea.

Rainy this forenoon. Snows
this evening. ~ Clara and I and
Mrs. Smith went down to Will Morgan's
this afternoon. Clara and I went
over to the Corner.

Father went down to Eastport
with Arthur's team and will stay
down and bring the team back, tomorrow.

Quite pleasant and cold
I went down to Arthur's a few
minutes this afternoon and over
to see Mr. Smith this evening.

Benj. Dudley will not go down
to work in the factory any more
this fall. ~ Elia shot a deer in
my field last Wednesday and found him to-day.

Pleasant. ~ I went over to the Union House to meeting this afternoon ~ Father went to Eastport this afternoon.

I commenced my 24th term of school at the Cross-Roads, and the 8th term at that place. I got some wet coming home to night.

I went up to Admas at noon.

Pleasant and mild.
Elias went to Eastport after Venie. He got home about 5:15 to night.
Clara went over a little while this evening.
Allie Anthony and Will Carter came in this forenoon and butchered for me, my cow (Simah) and the bull that I bought of Anthony.

Wea.

Pleasant, mild.
After I got home from school I went out to father's and got his wagon. ~ Venie will stay here to night.

SATURDAY, DEC. 12, 1891

Wea.

Pleasant and cooler.

I went over to the Head of the Tide this fore-noon and got "Ben. Harrison" shoed and got him weighed (915^{2 1/2} lbs). This after-noon I took "Tip" and carried Mrs. Capt. Dudley's ^{7 1/2} carrots and parsnips to and ^{5 1/2} Arthur's side of beef and ^{1 1/2} Lemons' ^{5 1/2} beef. Carroll went with me.

Pleasant.

Home all day. ~ Mrs. Smith, Elsie, and Venie went down to Sarah's to-day and they and Clara went over to the "Union House" to meeting this evening.

MONDAY 14

Wea.

Cloudy. Cleared up towards night. Cooler and windy. ~ Arthur commenced work for me - cutting fire-wood.

TUESDAY, DEC. 15, 1891

Wea.

Cloudy, cool. Commenced to snow about 5:30 to night.

Arthur broke his ax-handle this morning and so did not work only about an hour. ~ Elsie hauled hauled brunking brush for Will Morgana this after-noon. ~ ^{meeting tonight.} and Venie and Mrs. Smith went to Baptist

WEDNESDAY 16

Wea.

Snow-storm of last night turned to rain. Rained most of the fore-noon. ~ Venie came over and will stay to night. ~ Pastures and woods nearly filled with gunners. ~ I borrowed Mrs. Smith's rubber boots and umbrella to go to school.

Will and Sarah came up to Mr. Smith's this after-noon.

Pleasant and cold.
Clara was sick to-day and
Venie came over and stayed

Pleasant and moderate.
Clara and I went to the
Head of the Tide with the cult, "Ben"
and Mr. Smith's wagon, it being
the second time he has been har-
nessed to a wagon. - Arthur came
up to-night and brought our camp
books. He was not able to go over. Dunt.

Pleasant and moderate.
Mrs. Smith went to the Union House
to church this forenoon. She and
Venie went to the Vestry this ev-
ening.

Looked some like a storm.
Elias went up to Adams to go
to Charlotte, after hay, but they did
not go. - Venie and Mrs. Smith
went down to Sarah's. Venie will
stop a few days.

Dull. Looks much like a
storm. - I went round the
Head of the Tide to night. It was
very dark and mild. - James
stayed here from school, and will
stop all night.

Dull. Rained most of the af-
ter-noon and evening. - Elias
went up to Charlotte to get a load
of hay. He left it up to Adams
and came home this evening.
Will Morgan brought Venie and
Sarah in home this after-noon. He
carried the team back, and then came back.

over here to dinner.
