Trophies for Class Competition

Memorial Fund Committee Offers Trophy Cup for General Competition. Class of 1912 Challenges Classes 1909-1915 and Offers Banner

The announcement of a handsome trophy cup, as the gift of the individual members of the Memorial Fund Committee, to stimulate competition between the classes of 1872 to 1922 inclusive has just been made public. This cup will reward that class graduating between 1872 and 1922 which shall show at the conclusion of the campaign, the highest percentage of its members, graduate and non-graduate combined, as subscribers to the Memorial Fund. The class of 1923 will not compete for the cup as solicitation of its membership was made on the campus where a 99 per cent plus record was established. The numerals of the winning class will be properly engraved on the cup and the trophy permanently placed on exhibition in the completed Memorial Gymnasium-Armory structure.

A Challenge from 1912


Almost simultaneous with the announcement of the Committee's trophy award comes the news that the class of 1912 desires to challenge the classes with it in college to a contest for a banner provided by it in the interest of the Memorial Fund. The challenge came about because of the fact that the classes of 1909, 1910, 1911, 1912, 1913, 1914 and 1915 are each showing less than 45% of their respective memberships as subscribers to the Memorial Fund. The class of 1912 has recognized that in this fact lies an opportunity for a contest which will renew the rivalry that once existed between it and its sister classes, and at the same time will assist in winding up the Memorial Fund Campaign.

Accordingly 1912 has issued a challenge for a contest to determine which class of this group will obtain the largest percentage of its membership as subscribers to the Fund. The winner will be rewarded by becoming the owner of a banner carrying a suitable inscription and showing the outcome of the contest,—this banner to permanently hang in a prominent place in the Memorial Gymnasium-Armory, and used by the winner in its class reunions and other gatherings. The challenge as issued by the class of 1912 is as follows:

"To the Classes of 1909, 1910, 1911, 1913, 1914 and 1915:

"The Class of 1912,—without doubt the greatest class that ever attended the University and in every respect infinitely superior to you whom we are addressing,—has come to realize that once again it is its duty to place its heel upon your necks.

"Therefore, we, the Class of 1912, hereby challenge you to a contest, the

winner of which shall be that class which at the conclusion of the campaign has secured the greatest percentage of its living members as subscribers to the Memorial Fund. This will settle for all time any question as to which class possesses the greatest proportion of real redblooded Maine men and women, and in recognition of this fact the winner will be awarded a suitable banner to be placed on display in the Memorial Gymnasium-Armory and otherwise to be flaunted in the faces of the losers as the winner may desire.

"In closing let us remind you that in this contest subscriptions do the talking,—alibis don't count! Put up or forever be known as dead ones!

Alumni Secretary Towner Resigns

At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Alumni Council held at Bangor, Sunday, August 19, Alumni Secretary W. D. (Pep) Towner '14, very unexpectedly presented his resignation in order to accept a position of greater service with the Boston Metropolitan Chapter of the American Red Cross. His resignation was accepted to take effect September 29. His new position will give him entire charge of the annual roll call and financial campaigns conducted by the chapter. No successor has been appointed.

Statement by President Stephens

By vote of the Executive Committee the following statement was ordered prepared by the president of the General Alumni Association:

"Wayland D. Towner, 1914, was employed August 20, 1919, by the General Alumni Association as its first paid executive Alumni Secretary. He was instructed to formulate and carry into effect a program best calculated to promote the interests of the alumni and the welfare of the University.

"The purpose of this article is to review briefly the work undertaken since Mr. Towner assumed office as Alumni Secretary.

"The list of addresses of the Alumni had not been revised for several years and since a correct mailing list was essential, this revision was immediately undertaken and upon completion published in the Alumni Directory of 1921. Since the publication of the directory, a record of the latest known addresses is kept in the office of the Alumni Secretary.

"The Secretary was charged with the responsibility for the ALUMNUS, the publication of which has meant so much in the welding together of our members. Through its columns the Alumni have been kept informed of matters relating to the welfare of the University. It has brought them into touch with the undergraduate life and has given them the latest information concerning their classmates.

"One of the duties of the Secretary has been to encourage existing local alumni associations and to promote the establishment of others where conditions warranted. The number of local associations has increased since the Secretary took office from ten to thirty-two. The Secretary has attended the annual meetings of the

Building Committee The recent appointment of a Building Committee for the Memorial Gymnasium-Armory by the Executive Committee of the Alumni Council is a step in advance toward the final erection of the building which will meet universal approval.

The personnel could hardly be improved upon we think. The presence of three engineers of note on the committee in Messrs. Philbrook, Mayo and Stephens is naturally to be expected. President Little and Alumni Trustee Buck are indispensable links between the administration and the alumni point of view. The unqualified fitness of "Mac" Sawyer to serve as chairman is unquestioned after the energetic and able manner in which he has conducted the campaign. The presence of a successful practicing physician and likewise educator in Dr. Ferguson gives ample indication that the physical well being of the students who are to use the building will be well provided for.

The very excellent report of the Requirements Committee presented on this and the opposite page will give the committee a splendid start toward the performance of its duties.

A New Editor This issue completes Volume IV of the publication started four years ago by the retiring editor. Your support has made possible

its continuance as a news carrier.

Volume V will commence with the October issue and under the direction of a new managing editor. Give him your unqualified support and his work will be as happily performed as that of the retiring editor.

Building Requirements Committee Reports

The final report of the Committee on Requirements for the proposed Gymnasium-Armory building appointed last winter has just been presented to the Alumni Council for acceptance and is herewith presented.

It should be understood that while the requirements for the building do not make reference to plans for women's physical education that by no means are women students to be left out. The present men's gymnasium in Alumni Hall is to serve this need as it is considered admirably adapted to meet the present requirements for women's work.

The report reads as follows:

Indoor Field

A structural steel building with dirt floor, of sufficient size and suitable arrangement to adequately provide for football, baseball, track, tennis and military training, including a 100-yard straightaway, cinder path, an oval cinder track, a rifle range, rifle room, sand room and map room.

Special study should be given to lighting, both natural and artificial; ventilation and heating of this indoor field, and of equal, if not greater importance, is the matter of determining the best practice in construction and maintenance of the dirt floor, with special reference to the elimination of dust and the spread of germ diseases.

Main Gymnasium

This room should be of sufficient size to provide for the present needs and the anticipated needs well into the future, both as a gymnasium and as an assembly room for accommodating large numbers of people on such occasions as, for instance, Commencement time. This room should have a spectators' gallery, sufficient to accommodate at least 2500 people.

It is natural at this point to consider the board track. In the first place it is the opinion of your Committee that the board track, wherever located, should be as nearly as possible a copy of the B. A. A. track in Boston, for the reason that it is on that track that we undertake our most important contests. The combination of a board track and spectators' gallery is always a cumbersome and unsatisfactory thing, and this fact leads us to suggest that careful consideration be given to the relative merits of having the board track in

the gymnasium, or suspended in the indoor field.

Swimming Pool

The swimming pool should be provided with spectators' galleries and, if possible, so located that the shower baths, which are essential in connection with all well regulated swimming pools, may also be useful and convenient in connection with all other branches of physical training, without the installation of duplicate shower baths at some other location.

Special Exercise Rooms

There should be at least two of these rooms which could be used for special exercises, such, for instance, as boxing, fencing and wrestling, as well as other exercises desirable in cases where proper physical development requires special treatment.

Physical Director's Office and Assistant's Office

Two rooms en suite.

Doctor's Office

This, if possible, should consist of two rooms arranged en suite, with toilet facilities, and one room either equipped or arranged for equipment, with simple laboratory facilities.

Graduate Manager's Office

Two rooms en suite.

Student Manager's Office

Coach's Office

Four of these.

Military Offices

Four or six.

Extra Offices Unassigned

Six of these should be provided.

Building Superintendent's Office

Athletic Board Room

Storage

Storeroom for apparatus, chairs and tables.

Storeroom for Building Superintendent.

Storeroom for coaches.

Storeroom for Military Department.

Supply Room.

General Locker Room

This room should be large enough to provide for two thousand occupants. Careful study should be made as to the best method of providing locker facilities from the point of view of space required and sanitary conditions.

Faculty Locker Room

This should be a separate room of sufficient size to accommodate 150 occupants.

Varsity Room and Lockers

With toilets and showers.

Visitors' Room

With lockers, toilets and showers.

General Toilet Facilities

Women's Dressing Room

For social gatherings, including adequate toilet facilities.

Women's Check Room

For social functions.

Men's Check Room

For social functions.

In connection with athletics and physical education the following space and equipment should be provided:

Drying Room.

Water Heater and Sterilizer.

Laundry.

Serving Room and Kitchen

These rooms should be designed and arranged for convenience in serving refreshments on occasions of social functions and of serving luncheons and banquets, and therefore should be considered with special reference to their connection with the main gymnasium above referred to, where such functions will be held, and also with reference to convenient access from the outside, without passing through other portions of the building, except possibly the basement or indoor field.

Sanitary Drinking Fountains

These should be of sanitary type and arranged in sufficient number and convenient locations through the building.

Special Memorial Features and Trophy Room

It is thought undesirable to provide for a special trophy room, but that an entrance hall or approach to the other quarters of the building, spacious and imposing in design, should be provided, wherein should be located, so that it may not escape the observation of all who enter, an appropriate memorial tablet, recognizing those who died in service and those who served, but were not called upon to make the supreme sacrifice.

There are three important fundamental problems to which your Committee has given no time in study, but which we believe should be taken up at an early date:

1. *Water supply for the swimming pool.* The pool will require a large amount of water, and our general impression is that the existing supply upon the campus might be found impracticable, and if this were so the Stillwater River or artesian wells might have to be considered. The use of the River water would require a purification system.

2. *Heating Plant.* The heating requirements of this building will be considerable, and it seems extremely doubtful that the existing central heating plant on the campus will be found adequate in

capacity, unless it is to be expanded in the near future, and before the Memorial Building is constructed.

3. *Sterilizing.* Heat for the sterilizers must be provided, and various possible sources, such as electricity, gas, coal or oil ought to be investigated at an early date.

All of that portion of the building, except the indoor field, your Committee would like to see constructed of red brick and granite in Colonial design.

This report concludes our activities as a Committee. If any of us can render further assistance, we shall welcome the opportunity.

LAPORTE, Ind., Aug. 8.—Organization work is quickly progressing in northern Indiana and throughout the state to bring Robert J. Aley, president of Butler college, into the race for the democratic nomination for governor. Mr. Aley was formerly superintendent of public instruction. Formal announcement, it is said, will be made in a few days of the candidacy of Dr. Carlton McCullough, who was a candidate in 1920, while Senator Batt of Terre Haute has already entered the race.

local associations and has kept them informed concerning the work of the General Association and its relation to University affairs. He has also presented moving pictures of events at the University during Commencement week.



"It is with deep regret that the Executive Committee has accepted Mr. Towner's resignation to enable him to take a position with the Red Cross which offers a field of service for which his experience as Alumni Secretary eminently qualifies him. Mr. Towner is held in high esteem by the entire membership and every alumnus will join in wishing him Godspeed in his new field of endeavor.

"In continuing its work of service the plans of the Association include the extension of the Employment Bureau, the compiling of the Alumni War Record and the development of Loan Funds and Scholarships.

"Due to the excellence and thoroughness of Mr. Towner's work the Association is now so firmly established that its officers face the task ahead with assurance and are confident that another loyal Maine man, recognizing the opportunity for experience and service, will come forward to take up the work and carry it on.
