She was homesick and Sarah came up with her. I went out in the pasture and after a while found "Ben" and started at 10 o'clock to carry Sarah home. I got back at 11:20.

Mr. Smith hosed his potatoes. Elias helped unload the Portland Packet. He went to the circus to night.

Elias went to the Corner this forenoon; bought his mother a set of glass dishes to replace (in part) the set Max broke the other day.

Owen's where I shall board
this week. I went up
to the factory this afternoon
and secured 7 cases of
Mustards and 2 of oil ⁽¹²⁾
40cts. 2 boxes of rice.
