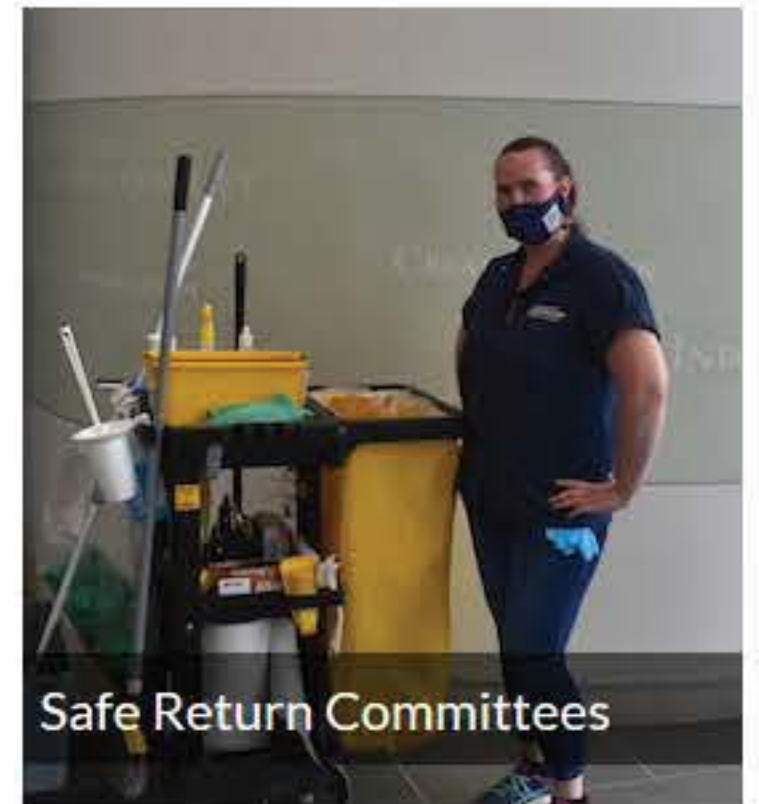
Together for Maine

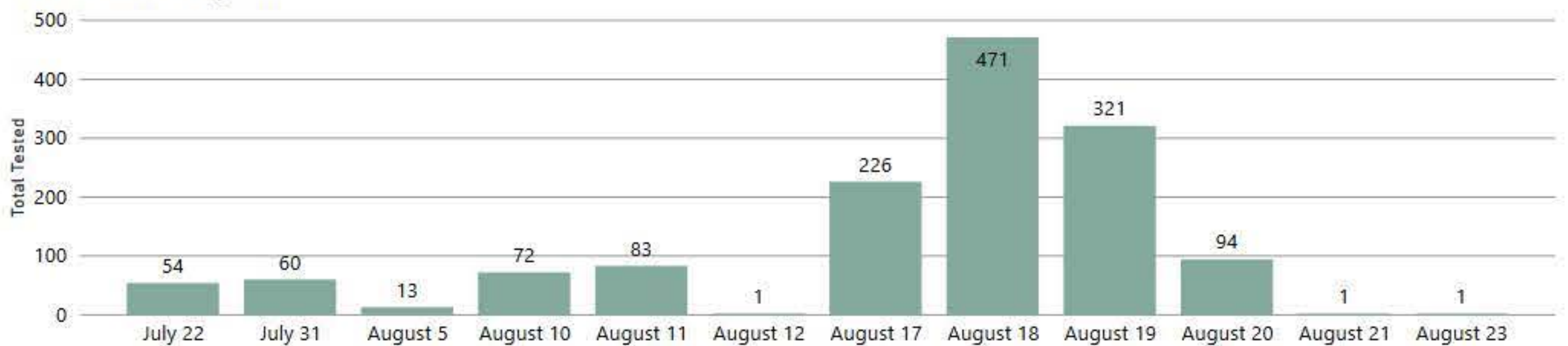
