## WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To Ernest H. Allen, a Constable in the Town of North Yarmouth in the County of Cumberland.

### GREETINGS :

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of North Yarmouth, qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Grange Hall in said town on Monday, the twelfth day of March A. D. 1962 at one o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles, to wit :

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose by secret ballot the following officers, to wit: Town Clerk, one Selectman, Assessor, Overseer of the Poor for a term of three years; Road Commissioner, for a term of one year; Treasurer, for a term of one year, also one member of the School Committee for a term of three years.

The Polls will be open at the Grange Hall between 1 p.m. and 7 p.m. At 7:30 p.m. the following articles will be taken up:

Art. 3. To hear and act on the report of the North Yarmouth School Fund Trustees and vote how the money shall be expended.

Art. 4. To hear and act on the report of the Cemetery Commission.

Art. 5. To hear and act on the report of the Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, Superintendent of Schools, and Trustees of the North Yarmouth Water District.



Art. 6. To receive accounts against the town and raise money for such as may be allowed.

Art. 7. To fix compensation for town officers.

Art. 8. To choose a Cemetery Commissioner for a term of five years.

Art. 9. To elect one or more fire wards, designate one as inspector and fix compensation.

Art. 10. To elect a member of the Board of Trustees of the North Yarmouth School District to serve for five years.

Art. 11. To elect four members to serve on the budget committee for three years.

Art. 12. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Subsidized school accounts to cover instruction, fuel, janitor, cleaning, conveyance, tuition, elementary, textbooks, supplies, utility service and equipment.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the superintending school committee to appoint a school physician.

Art. 14. To see if the inhabitants of the town of North Yarmouth will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for the purpose of repairing the town grader.

Art. 15. To see if the inhabitants of the town of North Yarmouth will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the money for the purchase of a grader.

Art. 16. To see if the inhabitants of the town of North Yarmouth will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose the old town tractor.

the ensuing year.

Art. 20. To see if the inhabitants of the town will vote  
to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the sum of seven  
thousand two hundred and fifty dollars (\$7,250.00) for the  
purpose of paying the town's share of cost of construction  
of a new bridge across the Sweetsir River on the North  
Road in cooperation with State and Cumberland County,  
and to issue serial notes of the town, payable as nearly  
as possible one-quarter of the aggregate amount, begin-  
ning with December 15, 1963 to be signed by the Select-  
men and countersigned by the Treasurer, in such form  
and upon such interest rate and other terms and con-  
ditions as the Selectmen may negotiate on behalf of the  
town.

Art. 21. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to 9,000.  
raise and appropriate for bridges and culverts for the  
ensuing year.

Art. 22. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to 4,250.  
raise and appropriate for cutting bushes on town roads  
for the ensuing year.

Art. 23. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to  
raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction (in ad-  
dition to the amounts regularly raised for care of ways,  
highways, and bridges) under the provisions of Section  
25 and 29, Chapter 20 R. S. 1944 as amended.

Art. 35. To elect a trustee of the North Yarmouth Water District to serve for three years.

Art. 36. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Control of Dutch Elm Disease or take any action thereon.

Art. 37. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to take from the town surplus to apply against year's appropriations.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to cooperate with the State Forest Service and Federal Government in the control of White Pine Blister Rust, in accordance with Revised Statutes of 1954, Chapter 36, Section 69.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to winterize the town house.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to discount taxes or take any action thereon.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to charge interest on taxes or take any action thereon.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to set a time when taxes for 1962 shall be paid.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to buy a Collector's and Treasurer's bond for the ensuing year.

Art. 44. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to post roads.

Art. 45. To see if the town will appoint a committee of three to look over old records and preserve same, and to raise and appropriate for the support of the program.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to form a town planning committee of six (6) members and appoint or elect the members at this meeting. Two for 3 years, two for 2 years, and two for one year. Hereafter two members to be elected for a 3 year term at future town meetings.

Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to instruct the planning committee to bring a zoning map and ordinance to the next town meeting for peoples consideration.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to close the present town dump on Mountford Road and find a more suitable and safer location for it elsewhere.

Art. 49. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer on behalf of the town to sell or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town, for non-payment of taxes as they deem advisable and execute quit claim deeds for same.

Art. 50. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to procure temporary loans in anticipation of taxes, for the purpose of paying obligations of the town, such loans to be paid during the current year from money raised during said municipal year, by taxes.

Art. 51. To see if the town will provide transportation to and from Yarmouth and Cumberland Ctr. for the high school students. And to raise and appropriate money for same.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that the Registrar of Voters will be in session for the purpose of correcting the voting list of said town, and hearing and deciding upon applications of persons wishing to have their names entered on the voting list at the Grange Hall at 11:45 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.

Hereof fail not to make due return to one of us on or before the day of said meeting.

## COMMENTS

### Cash

The cash balance, as noted in the balance sheet, was reconciled with the bank statement, and a written confirmation of the balance was made.

### Uncollected Taxes

A percentage of the uncollected taxes, as shown on the collector's records at December 31, 1960, and unpaid tax liens, were verified by written confirmation with the taxpayers.

### General

The procedure for keeping the municipal records of the town officers was examined, and found to be adequate, and in compliance with the General Laws of the State of Maine, as approved by the State Department of Audit.

### Scope of Audit

This audit was made as required by the State Department of Audit, Chapter 405, Section 26, of the General Laws of 1957.

Records were checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions. The system of internal control was reviewed as to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. External verifications, on a test basis, were utilized to determine the correctness of recorded Assets and Liabilities.

Receipts, vouchers and cancelled checks were examined for a selected period. Bond and insurance coverage were examined. Excise tax collections for a selected period, were verified with copies of the receipts retained by the Tax Collector. The Trust Fund Investments were physically verified.

### **ANNUAL REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE**

#### **North Yarmouth - 1961**

At the year's end it is again appropriate to give you an accounting of Public Health Nursing Service as carried on in North Yarmouth.

In the past three years attempts have been made to limit the Child Health Conference to 15 children. This gives the doctor an opportunity to give a thorough examination to children and guidance to mothers in child development. This plan of the community service has not had the support of all members. Many people still think of the Child Health Conferences as immunization clinics.

Total attendance at Child Health Conference —	70
Infants	13
Preschool	39

50% of the children attending received a physical examination. Forty children received protection against polio and 12 children were protected against diphtheria, tetanus, and whooping cough. Five children were vaccinated against smallpox.

Your nurse visited regularly six children who are under supervision of State Crippled Children's Services. Other visits were made to adults in interest of tumor, tuberculosis, cardiac, ulcers, and rehabilitation. This service helps families know the facilities and assists them to carry out physician's or clinic's instruction for treatment. Home visiting is still the most important part of public health nursing.

There is still need for immunization clinics in North Yarmouth which include the pre-school child at which age it is most important to provide immunization. There is need for further group planning if the public health nursing program is to improve.

#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

In accordance with the requirements of the laws of the State of Maine, I herewith submit the annual report and financial statement of the North Yarmouth School System for the fiscal year of 1961.

The schools opened in September 1961 with 261 pupils in the elementary grades. There are 80 students attending secondary schools. Starting in September 1962, there will be about 94 students attending high school from North Yarmouth. The cost of tuition for a high school student will average \$500 or higher per year for 1962-63.

From a preliminary study, it appears that changes made in the School Administrative District Laws would bring financial benefits to each town, Cumberland, North Yarmouth and Pownal, if a School Administrative District were formed. A complete study of the District operation and financing is being undertaken.

The scores of the Stanford Achievement tests reveal that the median obtained by the North Yarmouth pupils is a considerable amount higher than the National Median. The parents receive a copy of the achievement test record for their child and they are encouraged to discuss the progress of the child as well as the test score with the



teacher. It should be noted that the enrollments in the subprimary grade and second grade are very large and this makes it difficult for the child to receive the proper instruction.

During the summer the school was painted on the outside. A hood was installed over the kitchen range. During the coming year the roof must be repaired to take care of the leaks in the gutters.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the teachers and other school personnel for their cooperation and diligent work during the past year. I wish to thank the School Committee and parents for their sincere support during the past year.

### **REPORT OF ELEMENTARY MUSIC SUPERVISOR**

I am pleased to submit my report of weekly visits to the North Yarmouth Elementary School.

Singing, theory, rhythmic response, listening and creating instrumental accompaniment is a program which is being continued from previous years.

Rhythmic response is expressed by the child through dancing, singing games, and performing on rhythmic and simple melody instruments. The foundation of theory and music reading begins through the above approaches.

Last spring a minstrel show was given by the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades, which was a great success as a performance and proved to be an inspiration and enjoyment in the preparation by the children.

Singing songs in parts is started in the fourth grade in the form of rounds and by rote, followed by note reading in the fifth and sixth grades.

In the seventh and eighth grades there is a very good chorus which sings in parts, and it is planned that a Gilbert and Sullivan operetta will be performed by this group augmented by other grades.

The flutophone band started in the fourth grade is the forerunner of woodwind and brass instruments in the school band.

Xylophone and autoharp playing begins in the primary grades and continues through the intermediate grades.

The Listening program is carried on from subprimary through the eighth grades. This year more extensive study is being done in music appreciation as a set of classical records was secured in the fall.

A Christmas pageant was prepared for presentation but due to inclement weather was cancelled.

I want to thank the Superintendent of Schools, the Superintending School Committee and especially all the teachers for their excellent work and loyal support.

#### **SCHOOL NURSE REPORT**

The school health program has progressed very satisfactorily the past year and all clinics were very well attended. Patch tests were given to the subprimary and eighth grades for tuberculosis re-active but no re-actives were found. The eyes and ears of all pupils were examined at the beginning of the year and if any defects were found the parents were notified.

Immunization clinics for diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus and polio were held in February, March and April. At the April clinic, vaccinations for smallpox were also given.

Dental clinic started in September and continued for six weeks. Dr. James McCullum of Cape Elizabeth was the dentist. In October, physical examinations were given by Dr. Barron McIntyre for the first, third, fifth and seventh grade pupils. If any defects were found from these examinations the parents were notified. In November, a clinic was held for teachers and school personnel for flu vaccine.

At this time I wish to thank the members of the Health Council who have helped with the clinics this past year.

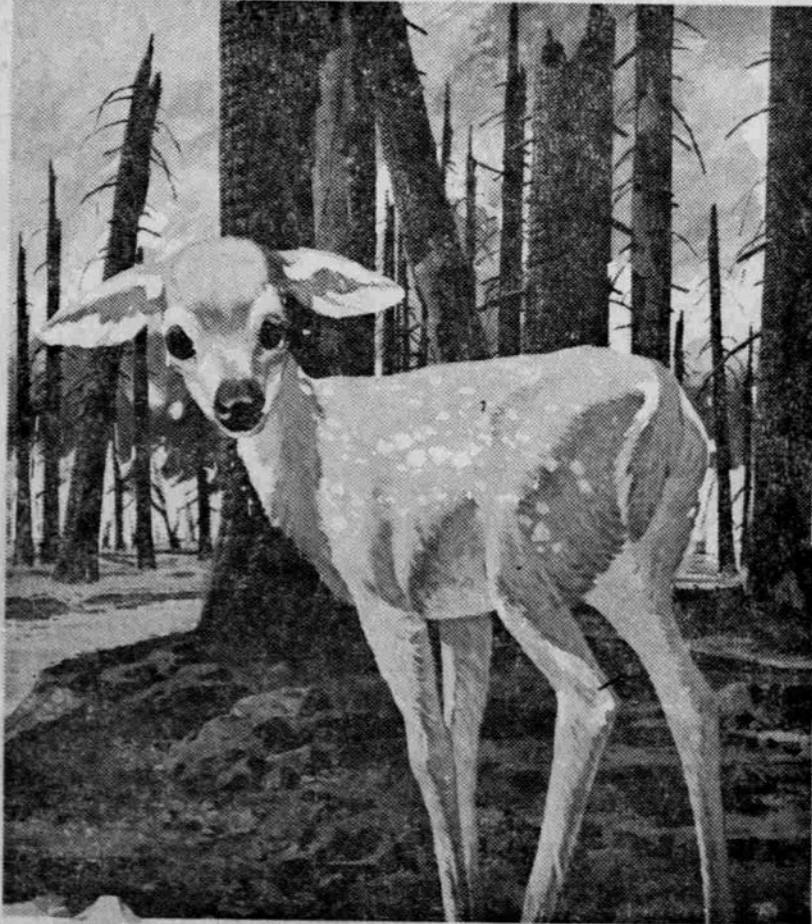
