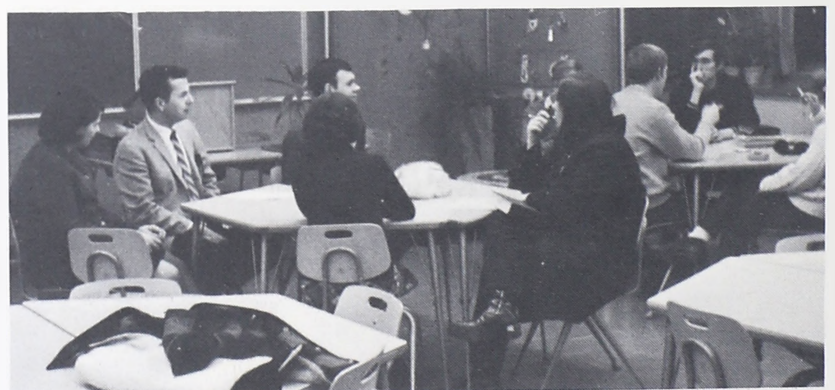
HUMANITIES FORUM
