**WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING**

To Ernest H. Allen a Constable in the Town of North Yarmouth in the County of Cumberland.

**GREETINGS:**

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of North Yarmouth, qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Grange Hall in said town on Monday, the eleventh day of March A.D. 1963 at one o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose by secret ballot the following officers, to wit: Town Clerk, One Selectman, Assessor, Overseer of the Poor for a term of three years; Road Commissioner, for a term of one year; also one member of the School Committee for a term of three years.

The Polls will be open at the Grange Hall between 1 p.m. and 7 p.m. At 7:30 p.m. the following articles will be taken up:

Art. 3. To hear and act on the report of the North Yarmouth School Fund Trustees and vote how the money shall be expended. *Page 44*

Art. 4. To hear and act on the report of the Cemetery Commission. *35*

*Assessor's report missing*

Art. 5. To hear and act on the report of the Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, Superintendent of Schools, and Trustees of the North Yarmouth Water District.

Art. 6. To receive accounts against the town and raise money for such as may be allowed.

Art. 7. To fix compensation for town officers.

Art. 8. To choose a Cemetery Commissioner for a term of five years.

Art. 9. To elect one or more fire wards, designate one as inspector and fix compensation.

Art. 10. To elect a member of the Board of Trustees of the North Yarmouth School District to serve for five years.

Art. 11. To elect four members to serve on the budget committee for three years.

Art. 12. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Subsidized school accounts to cover instruction, fuel, janitor, cleaning conveyance, tuition, elementary, textbooks, supplies, utility service and equipment.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the superintending school committee to appoint a school physician.



Art. 14. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of town roads for the ensuing year.

Art. 15. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of town equipment.

Art. 16. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal and sanding for the ensuing year.

Art. 17. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for bridges and culverts for the ensuing year.

Art. 18. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting bushes on town roads for the ensuing year.

Art. 19. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for care of ways, highways, and bridges) under the provisions of Section 25 and 29, Chapter 20 R.S. 1944 as amended.

Art. 20. To fix wages of men, team, trucks and other equipment per day and hour.

Art. 21. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Aid to Dependent Children for the ensuing year.

Art. 22. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 23. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 24. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries for the ensuing year.

Art. 25. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of interest for the ensuing year.

Art. 26. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for contingencies for the ensuing year.

Art. 27. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection for the ensuing year.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended for advertising the natural resources, advantages, and attractions of the State of Maine, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 80, Section 95, R.S.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Public Health Nursing in North Yarmouth, said sum to be expended by the Department of Health and Welfare for local services.

Art. 30. To choose a director of Civilian Defense, and what sum, if any, the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the program.

Art. 31. To elect a trustee of the North Yarmouth Water District to serve for three years.

Art. 32. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Control of Dutch Elm Disease or take any action thereon.

Art. 33. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to take from the town surplus to apply against year's appropriations.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to cooperate with the State Forest Service and Federal Government in the control of White Pine Blister Rust, in accordance with revised Statutes of 1954, Chapter 36, Section 69.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to discount taxes or take any action thereon.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to charge interest on taxes or take any action thereon.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to set a time when taxes for 1963 shall be paid.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to buy a Collector's and Treasurer's bond for the ensuing year.

Art. 39. To elect two members to serve for three years to the Town Planning Board.

Art. 40. To hear report of the Committee appointed last year to look over old records of the town. *over 1/1*

Art. 41. To see what sum, if any the town will vote to raise and appropriate for preserving the old records of the town.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer on behalf of the town to sell or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town, for non-payment of taxes as they deem advisable and execute quit claim deeds for same.

Art. 43. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to procure temporary loans in anticipation of taxes, for the purpose of paying obligations of the town, such loans to be paid during the current year from money raised during said municipal year, by taxes.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to allow all or any businesses in town to stay open on Sundays or take any action thereon.

Art. 45. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fencing and maintaining a dump or take any action thereon. *15000*

Art. 46. To see what action the town will ~~take~~ regarding fees for building permits.

Art. 47. To see what sum, if any, the town will raise and appropriate to be used by the planning board for maps, printing, etc., or take any action thereon.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to consolidate the offices of the Tax Collector, Treasurer and Town Clerk or take any action thereon.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that the Registrar of Voters will be in session for the purpose of correcting the voting list of said town, and hearing and deciding upon applications of persons wishing to have their names entered on the voting list at the Grange Hall at 11:45 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of the said meeting.

Hereof fail not to make due return to one of us on or before the day of said meeting.

# Auditor's Report

In accordance with your request, we have audited the records of the Town of North Yarmouth, for the municipal year ended December 31, 1961, as required by Chapter 91, Section 142, of the Revised Statutes of 1954.

The examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, and included all procedures which were considered necessary in the circumstances.

The results of the audit are disclosed in the accompanying exhibits and schedules, and present fairly the financial position of the Town of North Yarmouth, and the results of its operations for the municipal year ended December 31, 1961.

## COMMENTS

### Cash

The Cash Balance, as noted in the balance sheet, was reconciled with the bank statement, and a written confirmation of the balance was made.

### Uncollected Taxes

A percentage of the uncollected taxes, as shown on the collector's records at December 31, 1961, and unpaid tax liens, were verified by written confirmation with the taxpayers.

### General

The procedure for keeping the municipal records of the town officers was examined, and found to be adequate, and in compliance with the General Laws of the State of Maine, as approved by the State Department of Audit.

### Scope of Audit

This audit was made as required by the State Department of Audit, Chapter 405, Section 26, of the General Laws of 1957.

Records were checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions. The system of internal control was reviewed as to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. External verifications, on a test basis, were utilized to determine the correctness of recorded Assets and Liabilities.

Receipts, vouchers and cancelled checks were examined for a selected period. Bond and insurance coverages were examined. Excise tax collections for a selected period, were verified with copies of the receipts retained by the Tax Collector. The Trust Fund Investments were physically verified.

## SCHOOL NURSE REPORT FOR NO. YARMOUTH

The Health Council has been most cooperative with helping in all the school clinics. Most of these clinics are very well attended. Patch tests were given to the sub-primary and eighth grades for tuberculosis re-active. If a re-active is found, the pupil is sent to the Maine Medical Center for a chest x-ray. All the children's eyes and ears were examined at the beginning of the year and if any defects were found, the parents were notified.

In November, physical examinations were given to the seventh, fifth, third and first grades by Dr. Barron McIntyre, the school physician. If any defects were found from these examinations, the parents were notified. In November, a clinic was held for teachers and school personnel for flu vaccine.

Dental clinic was started in September, with Dr. James McCullum of Cape Elizabeth, as the dentist. This clinic was held for six weeks with very good attendance. The school population has grown so, it is impossible to see all the children at this clinic, so the ones who signed for it in the eighth, seventh, fifth and third grades were seen and children who had their own dentists were urged to see them.

Immunization clinics for diptheria, whooping cough, tetanus and polio were held in March, April and May. At the May clinic, vaccinations for smallpox were also given.

At this time I wish to thank the members of the Health Council who have helped with the clinics this past year.

**REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS**

In accordance with the requirements of the laws of the State of Maine, I herewith submit the annual report and financial statement of the North Yarmouth School System for the fiscal year of 1962.

The schools opened in September 1962 with 268 pupils in the elementary grades. There were 86 students attending secondary schools. Starting in September 1963, there will be about 100 students attending high school from North Yarmouth. The cost of tuition for a high school student will average \$600.00 or higher per year for 1963-64.

During the month of November the Towns of Cumberland, North Yarmouth and Pownal voted on the formation of a School Administrative District. In Cumberland the proposal was lost by 36 votes, in North Yarmouth and Pownal the proposal was favored by a great majority. The North Yarmouth Superintending School Committee is very much aware of the educational needs of the Town. The Committee members have

devoted more than 50 meetings to study in an effort to bring about better educational programs without excess taxation. Several of the meetings have been held at Augusta with representatives of the State Department of Education. The School Committee is continuing to work for the formation of a School Administrative District. The analysis of such joint educational endeavors must carefully consider what is best for North Yarmouth over an extended period of time. The immediate need in the elementary grades is to improve the educational program in grades seven and eight. Also the classes in the lower grades are too large. The program for the junior high school grades can be improved by the departmentalization which would be forthcoming if a School Administrative District were formed.

The scores of the achievement tests reveal that the results of the tests are equal to or above the national average. The test grades in the individual subjects are analyzed to determine the areas where the instruction can be improved. This year special attention is being given to mathematics and science in the upper grades.

During the fall the roof was repaired and the school was completely cleaned.

I wish to thank the Members of the School Committee, teachers and other school personnel for their sincere cooperation during the past school year.
