She was appointed Town Clerk in 1946, at the death of her husband, Henry H. York. She had served as Deputy Town Clerk for six years previously. In 1947 Mrs. York was elected Town Clerk in her own rights, and reelected each year thereafter. She is the fifteenth Clerk to serve this historic town, and the only woman to have held this position.

It is also worthy of note that Mrs. York is the only woman in the history of this town to have served on its Board of Selectmen. This was in 1927.

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To Ernest H. Allen, a Constable in the Town of North Yarmouth in the County of Cumberland.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of North Yarmouth, in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Grange Hall, in said town, on Monday, the ninth day of March, A. D., 1964, at one o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on articles numbered 1 through 6, and to notify and warn said voters to meet at the Grange Hall, in said town on Monday, the ninth day of March, A. D., 1964, at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on articles numbered 7 through 52; all said articles being set out below, to wit:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2. To elect all necessary Town Officers by secret ballot.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the residents of the Town of North Yarmouth, will vote to adopt the proposed zoning ordinance as resented by the Planning Board.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the residents of the Town of North Yarmouth, will vote to adopt the proposed Trailer Ordinance as presented by the Planning Board.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the residents of the Town of North Yarmouth, will vote to adopt the proposed Fire ordinance as presented by the Planning Board.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the residents of the Town of North Yarmouth, will vote to adopt as a replacement for the present Building Code, the proposed New Building Code as presented by the Planning Board.

The Polls for voting on articles 1 through 6 will be open at one o'clock in the afternoon and will close at seven o'clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 7. To hear and act on the report of the North Yarmouth School Fund Trustees.

ARTICLE 8. To hear and act on the report of the Cemetery Commission.

ARTICLE 9. To receive accounts against the Town and raise money for such as may be allowed.

ARTICLE 10. To fix compensation of Town Officers.

ARTICLE 11. To choose a Cemetery Commissioner for a term of five years.

ARTICLE 12. To elect one or more Fire Wards, designate one as inspector and fix compensation.

ARTICLE 14. To elect four members to serve on the Budget Committee for three years.

ARTICLE 15. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Subsidized School Accounts to cover instruction, fuel, janitor, cleaning, conveyance, tuition, elementary textbooks, supplies, utility service and equipment.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Superintending School Committee to appoint a school physician.

ARTICLE 17. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Roads for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee Recommends: \$5,000.00

ARTICLE 18. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town equipment.

Budget Committee Recommends: \$1,500.00

ARTICLE 19. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal and sanding for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 29. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for contingencies for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee Recommends: \$3,200.00

ARTICLE 30. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Fire protection for the ensuing year.

Budget Committee Recommends: \$1,300.00

ARTICLE 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended for advertising the natural resources, advantages, and at-

tractions of the State of Maine, in accordance with the Provisions of Chapter 80, Sec. 95, R.S.

Budget Committee Recommends: Be Dismissed

ARTICLE 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Public Health Nursing in North Yarmouth, said sum to be expended by the Department of Health and Welfare for local services.

Budget Committee Recommends: \$100.00

ARTICLE 33. To choose a Director of Civil Defense, and see wha sum, if any, the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of the program.

Budget Committee Recommends: \$500.00

ARTICLE 34. To elect a Trustee of the North Yarmouth Water District to serve for three years.

ARTICLE 35. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for control of Dutch Elm Disease or take any action thereon.

Budget Committee Recommends: Be Dismissed

ARTICLE 36. To see what sum, if any, the Town will vote to take from the Town Surplus to apply against years appropriations.

ARTICLE 47. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to the account in the Maine Savings Bank under the name of, The North Yarmouth Old Home Association.

ARTICLE 48. To see if the Town will authorize Robert Anderson to fence a portion of the Siligo Road from Route 9 Northwest approximately one-quarter mile.

ARTICLE 49. To see if the Town will vote to adopt Sec. 25, 26, 27, 28, of the Revised Statutes of Maine—1954 Chapter 141.

ARTICLE 50. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Superintending School Committee to accept a contract for Education of grades 8 through 12 offered by School Administrative District 15 or take any other action thereon.

ARTICLE 51. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a School Bus or Busses.

ARTICLE 52. To see how the Town wishes to purchase the bus or busses mentioned in the above article.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Municipal Year
Ending December 31, 1963

Yarmouth, Maine

Gentlemen:

In accordance with your request, we have audited the records of the Town of North Yarmouth, for the municipal year ended December 31, 1962, as required by Chapter 91, Section 142 of the Revised Statutes of 1954.

This examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards that pertain to governmental accounting, and included all procedures which were considered necessary in the circumstances. Within the scope of the examination, the financial affairs of the Town appear to have been administered in a proper and efficient manner.

The results of the audit are disclosed in the exhibits and schedules embodied in this report and fairly present the financial position of the Town of North Yarmouth, and the results of its operation for the municipal year ending December 31, 1962.

Cash

The Cash Balance, as noted in the Balance Sheet, was reconciled with the bank statement, and a written

confirmation of the balance was made.

Uncollected Taxes

A percentage of the uncollected taxes, as shown on the collector's records at December 31, 1962, and unpaid tax liens, were verified by written confirmation with the taxpayers.

General

The procedure for keeping the municipal records of the town officers was examined, and found to be adequate, and in compliance with the General Laws of the State of Maine, as approved by the State Department of Audit.

Scope of Audit

This audit was made as required by the State Department of Audit, Chapter 405, Section 26, of the General Laws of 1957.

Records were checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions. The system of internal control was reviewed as to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. External verifications, on a test basis, were utilized to determine the correctness of recorded Assets and Liabilities.

Receipts, vouchers and cancelled checks were examined for a selected period. Bond and insurance coverage were examined. Excise tax collections for a selected period were verified with copies of the receipts retained by the Tax Collector. The Trust Fund Investments were physically verified.

Report of School Nurse

The school health program has progressed very satisfactorily with all clinics well attended. At the beginning of the year, all childrens' eyes and ears were examined and if any defects were found, the parents were noti-

fied.

In September, dental clinic started and lasted for six weeks, one forenoon each week. Dr. Kenneth Bunnell was the attending dentist this year and the clinic was well attended. Due to the limited time of this clinic, children who have their own dentist are urged to go to him.

In the fall, physical examinations were given to children in the first, third, fifth and seventh grades by the school physician, Dr. Barron Mc Intyre. If any defects were found from these examinations, the parents were notified.

Immunization clinics were held in March, April and May for diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus. At the May clinic, vaccinations for smallpox were also given. This year, intradermal skin tests for tuberculosis were introduced in the subprimary and seventh grades. This was given by the school physician and if a re-active was found, it was followed up by a chest X-ray. The percentage of children having this test was very high and I wish to thank the parents for responding so well.

At this time I wish to thank the Health Council and parents for their cooperation and help with the clinics.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

In accordance with the requirements of the laws of the State of Maine, I herewith submit the annual report and financial statement of the North Yarmouth School System for the fiscal year of 1963.

The schools opened in September with 293 pupils in grades SP - 8. There were 98 students attending secondary schools on a tuition basis.

A second attempt at forming a School Administrative District with Cumberland and Pownal was defeated in Cumberland by reason of a tie vote. Realizing that tuition costs are rising rapidly, the Town of North Yarmouth felt that they must do something to assure

some degree of stability regarding high school education. A special town meeting was called last summer to determine an immediate course of action. It was decided that no action should be taken at that time, but that the School Committee should undertake a preliminary study with School Administrative District No. 15. If the study proved unsuccessful, they were to investigate other possibilities and report back to the town. School Administrative District No. 15 chose not to take any action at the present time with respect to accepting North Yarmouth into a District. The School Committee asked the Towns of Freeport, Yarmouth, Cumberland and School Administrative District No. 15 whether or not they would be interested in contracting with North Yarmouth for junior and senior high pupils. School Administrative District No. 15 and Cumberland submitted tuition figures and a Special Town Meeting was called to decide which offer was most acceptable. The voters chose to send their high school pupils to Cumberland for a period of five years. The Selectmen of North Yarmouth have been instructed to appoint a committee of twelve people including the School Committee and the Selectmen to determine whether or not North Yarmouth should undertake construction themselves or contract to educate their 7th and 8th grades in Cumberland beginning September 1965.

The teachers in North Yarmouth should be commended for the fine job they are doing despite several excessively large classes. The January 1, 1964 enrollments for the past three years are listed below:

Report of Music Program

I am pleased to submit my annual report of weekly visits to the North Yarmouth Memorial School and the sub-primary school at the Vestry.

In the lower grades, rhythmic response is stressed through singing, games, dancing and performing with rhythmic and melody instruments. A great deal of emphasis is put on accompanying the songs with the rhythmic instruments. The foundation of music begins through the above approach.

The basic program is singing, theory, rhythmic response, listening, creating own dramatization and accompaniment from the sub-primary through the eighth grade.

Rounds are introduced in the third grade followed by rounds and two-part songs in the fourth grades, continuing rounds and many two-part songs in the fifth grade. Rounds and introduction of three-part songs in the sixth grade.

The changing voice occurs in the seventh and eighth grades, therefore songs are sung which fit the voice, mostly three-part songs.

New music books, published by the American Book Co., were put in the first, third, fourth and fifth grades. The material is interesting, stimulating and brings in many of the "old" songs of years ago, which the children enjoy singing. The songs are full of rhythmic responses and adapted to the autoharp which children learn to play.

The listening program is somewhat limited as there are few records. New material is needed for rhythmic and listening response.

A large chorus in the Junior High grades is preparing for the graduation program. There is some theory introduced, but as time is very limited, chorus development is more immediate.

I want to thank the Superintendent of Schools, Superintending School Committee and all the teachers for their work and support.

School Lunch Report

In 1963 there were 22,102 type A lunches served to the North Yarmouth School children. These lunches must include at least 2 ounces of cooked protein, $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of fruit and/or vegetable, 1 slice of bread or equivalent, two teaspoons butter and $\frac{1}{2}$ pint milk. Vitamin C served each day and vitamine A three or four times a week. This is equal to one third the daily nutritional requirements of school children.

Daily participation has increased from 132 lunches served in December 1962 to 156 in December 1963.

Through the efforts of the cooks in the kitchen, we have been able to serve what we feel is an adequate and nutritional lunch with a minimum cost to the town. We feel very fortunate to have lunch personnel with so

much interest in the children and the program as a whole.

Under the Special Milk Program, the children were served 12,455 half pints of milk. This does not include the milk served with the type A lunch.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all school personnel for their cooperation.

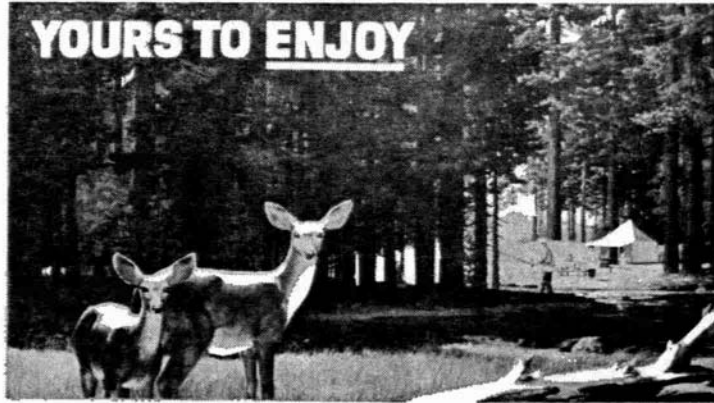
