Partnering to address health

- The University of Maine System has entered into a partnership with [Shield T3](#) to provide weekly on-campus COVID-19 PCR testing beginning Feb. 1. A mobile testing laboratory at UMaine will eliminate the need to ship collected saliva samples for processing. Test results are expected to be delivered electronically to participants within 24 hours. A news release with more details is [online](#). UMaine's phase six testing will be in Wells Conference Center and the Collins Center for the Arts.
- [LiveWell](#), a program of the UMaine Student Wellness Resource Center, is accepting student mentors and mentees for the peer education program. LiveWell is a way for students to coach or learn about health and wellness. To participate, email kayla.cormier1@maine.edu. Other center programs are [online](#).
- Beginning next week, UMaine residential students on campus and out-of-state off-campus students with at least one face-to-face class on campus this spring will be tested at designated days and times as part of UMaine's COVID-19 phase four testing. Phase five testing is Jan. 25–29. More information about phases four and five testing is [online](#). A COVID-19 Testing Guide for Students also is [online](#).
- Also next week, UMM residential students and off-campus students with in-person classes will be tested as part of phase four COVID-19 testing. Phase five testing is Jan. 25, with make-up test dates available as needed. More information for UMM students is [online](#).
