- Dec. 1st, 1894 -

Sat.

Snowy all day. - I walked up from Eastport, yesterday, and am pretty sore to-day.

Sun., Dec. 2 -

Pleasant - Mrs. Smith, Carroll, Clara and I went over to the Vestry to church, this fore-noon. - Eliza came home from Red-Beach and Sarah and Will came in to Mr. Smith's. - Clara and I went over a little while and father came out towards night.

Mon., Dec. 3,

Pleasant. - I put my sled together and went out to father's and bought a quarter of beef and also paid him ^{2.00} 50¢ for freight on cabbage. Ulysses sent me. - Clara, Owen and Clara came out just before noon. She will stay over and help Clara do some sewing. James came out this evening.

Tues, Dec. 4, 1894.

Pleasant-soft. — I went up to Dennyville this fore-noon and got some lumber to build a back-house and to fix up in the tie-up. Carroll and I went over to the Head of the Tide this after-noon and I got a barrel of glass etc. — Clara Owen has been making Stella's dress.

Wed., Dec. 5-

Pleasant, moderate. — I went over to the Corner this morning and got some meal. — Mr. and Mrs. James Owen and Chas. came out here and stayed till near night. Mother and Helen came out too and father came out after them and stayed to supper. — Charles helped me on my Water closet.

Clara Owen has been working on the girls dresses; she went out with mother to night.

Thurs, Dec. 6, 1894.

Looked much like a storm this morning; cleared up pleasant. — Carroll and I went down to Eastport to day. I sold some butter and got my pay for working in the factory. I stayed over to Chas. Owens to supper and Carroll came home with the team. I went down to Camp S. of V.

Fri, Dec. 7-

Pleasant. — I worked on the back-house part of the time, and finished banking the house. Clara Owen came out this fore-noon and sewed till near night when she went home. — Clara and I went over to quarterly meeting this evening. Preaching by Rev. Mr. Norton, P.E. — We went in to the S. A. S. a little while.

Sat. Dec. 8, 1894-

Pleasant cool. - I went over to the Vestry this fore-noon to the Dr. Conference. I worked on the back-house this afternoon. Clara and I went out to father's this evening.

Sun. Dec. 9-

Pleasant-cold. - Clara and I went over to the Vestry to meeting this afternoon.

Mon. Dec. 10 -

Pleasant-cold. - James commenced school in Charlotte. - I got my (Clara's) heifer from father's. Carroll and I stayed out there to dinner. I have a very bad cold. - Mr. Josiah Page came in a little while this afternoon.

Tues. Dec. 11, 1894-

Pleasant- I have been about "played out" with a cold. - Thomas and I cut alders in the pasture this fore-noon. I worked on the back-house a little while this afternoon. Mrs. Laura Page came in just before dinner. Mr. Page came in this afternoon and they stayed to supper. Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Smith called in here just before supper. -

Stella went over to Clara Owens to have her jacket made. Carroll went over too.

Wed., Dec. 12 -

Rainy most all day.

I hauled up a load or two of scattering wood in the pasture, some cedar, etc. I "fixed up" under the barn some this afternoon - I have a very bad cold.

Thurs, Dec. 13, 1894 -

Wet most of the day. - I went over to the Corner this after-noon and got a bag of corn and paid W. W. W. B. on $\frac{1}{2}$ - Stella went over to Clara Quinn and got her jacket. Thomas went with me. - Fred J. Dunn came out a little while this fore-noon.

Fri. Dec. 14

Pleasant, windy. - We cut bushes in the pasture this fore-noon; this after-noon I thrashed my beans, etc. This evening we went over to the Corner; I went over to Dr. Rodgers and got the school-house keys, Clara went to class-meeting and we both went to the S. A. S.

Sat, Dec. 15, 1894

Pleasant and moderate - I worked on my back-house - shingled the roof etc. - Clara went over to her mother's this after-noon and I went over to supper. - Will Morgan has been cutting hoop-poles round here for a few days past and Elias hauled a load over for him to-day. - Clara has not been very well to-day.

Sun. Dec. 16 -

Pleasant, moderate - Clara and I and Mrs. Smith and Edna went up to Hardscrabble to the Reformed Baptist Church. - Mr. Smith went up to Cross-Roads.

Mon. Dec. 17 -

Rainy and wet. - I commenced my term of school in the Western school to-day. - 15 scholars.

Tues, Dec. 18, 1894 -

Pleasant, cool - The minister,
Rev. Mr. Graham, called here towards
night. He stayed over to Mr. Smith's
to supper.

Wed., Dec. 19 -

Pleasant, cold. Cloudy to night.
My cold is not much better.
Mrs. Smith went out to Lassie's a bit
the while.

Thurs., Dec. 20.

Pleasant, moderate.

I went over to the Camp to night,
Mrs. Smith went over to Mrs.
Olive Dunnis to the Circle.

Fri. Dec. 21 -

Pleasant, moderate. - Mr. Smith
went over to the Corner this evening

Sat. Dec. 22, 1894

Pleasant, mild - Clear - Came off
cold to night. - I worked on the back
house this forenoon. This afternoon Car-
roll, Estella, Thomas and I went over
to the Head of the Tide. - Clara and
I went over to the other house this
evening. - Elias went over to the
Corner this afternoon and Sarah and
Bertha came in with him.

Sun. Dec. 23.

Pleasant - very cold - windy.
Father came out and he and I
went over to the Vestry to meet-
ing this forenoon. He went
up with Parker Cushing to dinner.
Sarah Morgan came over this
forenoon and stayed to dinner.
She walked home to night.

Mon, Dec. 24, 1894.

Pleasant, very cold. - 4°

Mr. Smith commenced cutting wood for J. P. Wilder. Cold going to school this morning.

Tues, Dec. 25-

Christmas - No School.

Rained hard this fore-noon and some this after-noon. - Mr. and Mrs. Smith expected to go over to Will Morgan's to dinner but the rain hindered so they (and Edna and Bertha) came over here. Elias was up to Wills.

I fixed up under the barn some this after-noon.

Wed, Dec. 26-

Pleasant, cold. - Mr. Smith got a Christmas box from Mr. and Mrs. Thompson. Clara got a handkerchief and hair fork, Estella got a handkerchief and Xmas card, Nina got a doll and Thomas and Carroll got each a Book.

Thurs, Dec. 27, 1894.

Cold - Snowed and blowed very hard all the fore-noon and turned to rain this after-noon - Very rough. Cleared up this evening. Only Carroll and I went to school. I only had five scholars.

Fri. Dec. 28-

Pleasant, quite cold.

Edw. Sprague's scholars came up to my school to-day.

Mr. Smith is not very well to-day.

Sat., Dec. 29.

Cold. - Snowed and blowed hard all day. Moon out to-night. James went from his school in Charlotte to the S.A.S. last night and stayed to C. H. Owen's all night. He came across this way this morning, got breakfast with us and then I went out with him. Clara moved the bed down stairs. I fixed under the barn.

Sun. Dec. 30, 1894 -

Pleasant - cold. - Mr. Smith went over to Will Morgan's this forenoon. He came over to the Vestry to meeting this afternoon. I went over to Church this afternoon. - Clara and I went over to the other house this evening.

Mon. Dec. 31, 1894 -

Dull. - Mr. Knowlton's & scholars and Mr. Frost's & came too.

Tues, Jan. 6 '95.

Corner this forenoon - Clara went over to her
mother's and we stayed there to dinner.
I churned and then Clara, Thomas and
I went out to Father's and stayed
to supper and part of the evening.
Edna stayed all night.
