Appointment of William J. MacLeod to position of Vice President for Academic Affairs, UMP-G, at an annual salary of \$26,000, effective July 1, 1971.

The Executive Committee authorized the acquisition of the Osmand and Botto properties in Portland, both situated within the area designated by the Board for expansion of the Portland Campus. Purchase price for the Osmand property located at 11 Granite Street is \$12,500, and for the Botto property at 37 Exeter Street, \$17,700. Both residences will be utilized to provide office space for Nursing School faculty this fall.
