Sunday, Nov. 5, 1895-

Snow storm last night. About 3 inches of snow fell. - Clara, Mrs. Smith, Stella and I went over to Church this fore-noon. - I called over to Mr. Smith's towards night and stayed to supper.

Monday, Nov. 4-

Pleasant. I worked in the factory, made 21 cases of oils, \$2.10
Carroll came after me tonight.

Tues., Nov. 5-

Pleasant - I worked in the factory most all day; made 16 cases of oils, \$1.60 - I pulled some parsnips tonight.

Wed., Nov. 6, 1895-

Pleasant. - I went to the Corner this morning and got 2 bags of meal and bought a new plow of N.B. Gardner & Co. for \$8.00 - Carroll helped me plow this fore-noon and went to school this after-noon. I pulled my parsnips this after-noon - Clara and I went round to father's this evening.

Thurs., Nov. 7-

Pleasant - He plowed this fore-noon - I went over to the factory this morning but there was no work. I finished pulling carrots this after-noon - I went over to the Camp this evening.

Fri., Nov. 8-

I worked in the factory; made 21 cases of oils, \$2.10
We hauled a barrel of water this evening.

Sat., Nov. 8, 1895-

Rainy and wet. - I worked in the factory, made 17 cases of oils, \$1.70

Sunday Nov. 9-

Wet - Cloudy - We did not go to church today. - Eliza came up from Eastport last night. I went over to Mr. Smith's a little while towards night.

Monday, Nov. 10

Quite pleasant. I worked in the factory; made 22 cases - \$2.20
Mr. Smith traded horses with Fred Sprague.

Tues., Nov. 12-

Pleasant - I worked in the factory made 25 cases of oils, 2.50
Carroll came after me to night.
Mr. Smith worked for Isiah Leighton.

Wed., Nov. 13-1895-

Pleasant, moderate -

I worked in the factory; made 20 cases of oils, 2.00

Mr. Bucknam plowed for Father in the Clover field. They got dinner here. - Mr. and Mrs. Smith went up to Adna's.

Thurs., Nov. 14-

Looked like a storm. I piled wood in the house, etc. We (Clara, Miss Lewis & I) went over to the "other house" to a beef-soup dinner. - Mr. Bucknam plowed for father this afternoon in the Clover field. - Clara and I and father went over to the Vestry to a Lecture - Science and the Bible - by Rev. Mr. Gahan.

Fri., Nov. 15-

Big Rain! The children did not get to school. Schools closed today. I worked in the new house getting out slippers, etc.

Saturday, Nov. 16-1895-

Pleasant. - I got out sleepers for the new house. - The boys put in wood, etc.

I went to the Corner this afternoon. I bought 5 jack-knives for my-self, Carroll and Thomas, etc. - Elias walked from Eastport to-day.

- Sunday, Nov. 17-

Cloudy. - Clara and I went up to the Iron Works to church this forenoon. - Will and Sarah came in to Mr. Smith's this forenoon; Called over here this afternoon.

Monday, Nov. 18

Pleasant, mild. - I worked in the factory to-day, made 14 cases of oils \$1.75
Carroll has a bad cold.

- Tues., Nov. 19, 1895-

Dull. - I worked in the factory; made 18 cases of oils, \$1.80 - Clara came over after me to night; we went over to the Corner before coming home. Elias came home from Eastport to night; done work.

- Wed., Nov. 20-

Dull, wet. - I worked in the factory; made 16 cases of oils, \$1.60

Thurs., Nov. 21 -

I worked in the factory; made 18 cases of oils, \$1.80 - Windy, very cold. Grasses freezing fast. - Carroll came over after me to night; was very cold coming home.

Friday, Nov. 22, 1895-

Very cold and windy last night and this fore-noon; moderated some this after-noon. Cloudy. - I worked in the factory; made 18 cases of oils, \$1.80

Mr. Smith banked my house $\frac{1}{2}$ day. I built a fire in the stove down cellar last night. - Carroll came over to the Corner last to-night with the horse and truck-wagon and I got a beef-barrel and pork-barrel and borrowed a hoghead tub of Geo. Owens.

Sat., Nov. 23-

Snowed; turned to rain; rains and blows hard to night. - I worked in the factory; made 16 cases, \$1.60 - Will Smith, Sabie Smith and I were discharged from ^{Wichita} factory because we refused to pay for "botter leaks". Allie Anthony butchered my hog and cow "Betsey". Mr. Smith helped him.

Sunday, Nov. 24, 1895-

Pleasant, cool - Clara, Stella, and

I went over to the Vestry to meeting this fore-noon. - We called over to Mr. Smith's this after-noon.

Adna Smith and wife came in to Mr. Smith's this after-noon. - Father came out here a little while this evening.

Mon., Nov. 25-

Cloudy, cool; hail this evening. I went to the Corner this fore-noon; Carroll went with me. - I got my gig from the factory. -

Clara cleaned tripe today. Clara Owen came over and helped her for a part of it. - I cut up and salted part of my beef. Carried over a quarter of beef (110 lbs) to Chas. Owen this evening. - Mrs. Smith is not very well. Mr. Smith went over after Mr. Rogers but he was not at home. Clara went over to see her mother to night.

Tues., Nov. 26, 1895-

Rainy and wet. - Wind blows heavy to mid

I cut up beef and pork about all day. - Mrs. Smith is no better. Clara has been trying grease, etc.

Wed., Nov. 27 -

Rained hard and wind blowed a gale all of last night. Cleared off pleasant to day.

I banked the house this forenoon. Plowed (behind the house) this afternoon.

Sarah Morgan came over "home" to day. Clara and I called over there this evening. Mrs. Smith is little or no better.

I carried a piece of beef out to Mother's this morning.

Thursday, Nov. 28, 1895-

Thanksgiving!

Pleasant, mild. - I hauled out manure on the garden and plowed it in, etc.

Elias went to Eastport en route for Lowell, Mass where he expects to work this winter. His father carried him down and Sarah went down with them. Sarah came over here a little while this evening. - Mrs. Belinda Owen came in to Mrs. Smith's to dinner.

Clara has been trying out lard, etc, cooking tripe, and getting Thanksgiving dinner.

Friday, Nov. 29-1895-
Pleasant, mild. - I finished bank-

ing the house, laid floor (part) in the new house, etc. - This evening Clara went over to the Vestry to a lecture by Rev. J. Tinsling of Eastport subject: The Battle of Life. Father went over with us. Good. Mrs. Smith is quite miserable.

Sat, Nov 30-
Pleasant. Cold to night.
I went to the Corner this forenoon put glass in the school house this afternoon, fixed pump, etc.

Sun., December 1.
Quite pleasant. Cloudy to night.
I went down to Arthur's this forenoon. Clara did not feel able to go to church this afternoon, and I have a very lame back so we did not go. Estella walked over.

Monday, Dec. 2, 1895-
Raining and windy all day.
I commenced my term of school to-day at Cross-Roads it being my 10th term there. I walked across the meadow both ways; got some wet. Carroll and Thomas went up here to school, Miss Lina Fisher, teacher.

Mrs. Smith is no better.

Tuesday, Dec. 3
Quite Pleasant, Cold. - Cross-Roads -
Mr. Smith walked over to the Corner this evening; got a postal from Elias.

- Wed., Dec. 4 -
Pleasant - cold. - Cross-Roads -
Mrs. Mary Etta Carter called here to-day. She went over to see Mrs. Smith this evening; she is little or no better.

Thursday, Dec. 5-1895-

Snowed lightly all day. Snows and blows hard this evening. — I intended to have gone over to the Camp to-night but it storms too hard. — Mr. Smith went to the Corner. — J. E. Jr came home to-day to go on a grinning trip. His wife came with him as far as Eastport where she will stop for a short time.

Friday, Dec. 6-

Heavy snow-storm and gale of wind all last night and part of this forenoon. Cleared off quite pleasant. Cold. — I did not go to school to-day. I plastered some by the kitchen door, etc. Went over to Chas. Owens this after-noon with the horse and sled and got a barrel of onions and a barrel of cabbage which Ulysses sent me from Groveland, Mass., and a barrel of cabbage for Mother. I carried Mother's out to her and bought some boards of father.

Saturday, Dec. 7, 1895-

Pleasant-Cool. — I finished laying the floor in the new house, boarded up the windows, banked under the barn, etc. — Mr. Smith went over to the Corner. — Clara rinsed her clothes and hung them in the new house.

Sunday, Dec. 8-

Rained some last night; snowed some to-day. — Clara and I went over to the "other house" a little while this after-noon. — Father called here this after-noon. — Henry Rice called to Mr. Smith's.

Monday, Dec. 9-

Pleasant-Cool. — I walked across the meadow, to and from school, but it is hard traveling. — Sarah Morgan came in to her Mother's this fore-noon; she called over here this evening.

Borrell caught a rabbit last night.

Tuesday, Dec. 10, 1895 -
Pleasant; cold. - Cross-Roads -

Dr. Rogers, supervisor, called into my school this after-noon.

Mr. Smith cut wood. - Mrs. Smith is about the same, Sarah has been there to-day. - Clara washed. Carroll stayed at home to help her.

Wed, Dec. 11 -
Cold and windy. Cross-Roads
The children did not go to school

Thursday, Dec. 12
Cold and windy.
Clara was taken sick today with a very bad cold. - I did not get over to the lecture; but there was none.
Matthias Ward came in to Mr. Smith's this after-noon.

Friday, Dec. 13, 1895 -
Pleasant and cold. - 14°

I went round the Head of the Tide this morning on my way to school.
Clara is not very well to-day.

- Sat., Dec. 14 -
Quite pleasant. Cold.
I went to the Corner this fore-noon
Got a barrel of flour ^{4.75} (Cream of Wheat)
Fixed the horse-stable some, etc.
Father and Elley called here a few minutes enroute for C. H. Owen's.
Nat. came out to Mr. Smith's this after-noon.

Sunday, Dec. 15, 1895 -
Pleasant - cold. Home all day.

Clara has not felt very well to-day; her cold is no better.

~~Mr.~~ Chas. Smith and wife came here about noon and went home towards night. They were here to dinner.

Elley and his wife and Chas. Owen and Clara came here about one o'clock; went out to father's before supper. They were here to dinner. Father came out towards night with his horse and sled.

Will and Sarah came in to Mr. Smith's this fore-noon; they came over here this evening.

Mon., Dec. 16 -

Pleasant -

Cross-Roads.

Clara has not felt very well to-day. Sarah came over this fore-noon and she and Will came over this evening.

Tuesday, Dec. 17, 1895 -
Clara's cold is no better.

Wed., Dec. 18 -

I went to school, via: Head of the Tide; rode round with J. C. Page.

Thurs., Dec. 19 -

Quite pleasant, moderate. Cross-Roads.
I went over to the Camp tonight.

The boys went over with me. Stella and Edna went over to-day.

Geo. Brown took the obligations in the degrees of Friendship and Charity tonight. Arthur was elected Capt. of the Camp.

Fri., Dec. 20 -

Pleasant, soft. - Clara is feeling some better. - Sarah and Will went up to Adna's with Mr. Smith's team.

Sat., December, 21, 1895
Pleasant.

I went to the Corner this fore-noon; went out to father's a little while this after-noon; banked the barn some towards night. — Estella and Thomas went out to mother's to dinner.

Clara's head has ached very badly

Sun., Dec. 22.

Rained very hard all the after-noon; cleared up to night.

My tooth ached very hard all last night; this fore-noon I went up to Dr. Lincoln's and he pulled it.

Mon., Dec. 23.

Pleasant. I took the horse and wagon to-day. Clara went over to Clara Owen's with me and staid till I came from school to night. We staid to supper

Tues., Dec. 24, 1895.
Pleasant. — Cross-Roads.

We all went over to Mr. Smith's this evening to a Christmas tree, gotten up principally by Sarah Morgan. The children were all remembered and all had a good time. Mr. Smith and Will went over to the Head of the Tide and got a box of Christmas presents from Venice, Grace, Elias and Mr. Thompson. They sent me a handkerchief, Clara a handkerchief, Thomas and Carroll each a nice card, Estella a card and handkerchief, Nina a book and Lewis a booklet.

Wed., Dec. 25, 1895.
-Christmas-

Very pleasant and moderate. We all went out to Father's to a Christmas dinner and tree.

Chas. Owen and family, Mr. and Mrs. James Owen, Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Brown and Emel, Arthur and family were there too. Mr. and Mrs. Smith were invited but were unable to attend. All had a good time.

Christmas presents: I got cake of shaving soap, shaving paper, candy, etc.; Clara got a new dress, hair pin, apron, candy, etc.; Carroll got a book, book-slate, candy, etc.; Thomas got two books, book-slate, game, candy, etc.; Estella got book, drawing-slate, candy, etc.; Nina got doll, book-let, broom, two tins, candy, etc.; Lewis got tie, mug, candy, etc.

Most of us stayed till evening. We got home about 8:40

Thurs., Dec. 26, 1895
Quite pleasant. - Cross-Roads-

Mrs. Allie Anthony came in here visiting. This evening Carroll and I went over to the Vestry to a lecture - Some of the Follies of Life - by Rev. Mr. Sodd of Calais. Father and Mabel Owen came out and went over with us. Looks like a storm.

-Fri., Dec. 27-

Rig rain-storm part of this forenoon. Wind blowed a gale. Cleared off pleasant about 10 o'clock.

I did not go to school. I thrashed some barns, etc.

Sat. Dec. 28-

Pleasant-moderate.

I finished thrashing and winnowing beans. This evening I went over to the Odd-Fellows. Clara went to the Corner with me.

Sunday, Dec. 29, 1895--
Pleasant and warm.

Carroll and I went down to Mr. Moses' meeting this afternoon.

Sem. Dudley came out this afternoon to let us know that Mother is sick. Carroll and I went out this evening and I went to Dennyville and got Dr. Lincoln to see her. Sem. Dudley carried him home. Mother has a very bad cold and is threatened with Pneumonia. Clara Owen will stay with her to night. Sarah and Will came over this evening.

Mon., Dec. 30-

Pleasant and warm. Cross Roads.

Father came out this morning. Mother was very sick in the night but is better now. Clara and I and Sarah went out to see her this evening.

Tues., Dec. 31, 1895-

Big rain-storm part of this last night and part of this forenoon. Wind blowed almost a gale. I did not get very wet going to school. Carroll and I went out to see how Mother was. She is some better.
